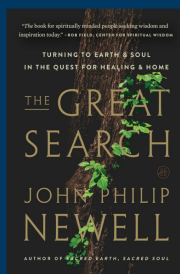

***The following are remarks that our Minister, the Rev. Dr. Marcus McFaul, made at a prayer service sponsored by Interfaith Voices for Reproductive Freedom at United Church of Chapel Hill (UCC) on Sunday, April 26, 2026.. These remarks are a fuller version of what he delivered due to time constraints.

It is good to be together this afternoon and in solidarity with others who support for religious, spiritual, and theological reasons, the rights for women of reproductive justice and freedom. I've been asked to speak as a representative of a group (and a perspective) broadly labeled "Protestant," a large and diverse pool of folks, don't you know; what with Methodists, Lutherans, Presbyterians, Disciples, Baptists, assorted others, and what my grandmother described as "off-brand" churches and traditions. So, as you see, it's a heavy lift.

The prompt given me for my three minutes with you as representative of "Protestant" was this: "In your tradition where and what are sources of hope right now?" Well, it's right there in the word itself, putting PROTEST back into PROTESTANT. Lots of protesting going on right now, have you noticed? Much to protest about, yes? Authoritarianism, fascism, stripping away rights, efforts to dismantle American democracy as we once knew it, but, and here's the hope part, Americans of all stripes, women and men, are protesting in parades and in the public squares of this nation, reclaiming one of the country's most sacred words: Freedom.

Free people know the value of dissent, saying/singing/showing up and standing up to so-called "moral majorities."

As a mentor of mine, James Dunn, once remarked: "'The trouble with a theocracy is that everyone wants to be Theo.'" Not us and not in America. As an American and as a Baptist minister, there is nothing more important right now than protesting, freely and fully, in support of women.

Despite the strenuous efforts of far-right wing forces America isn't a theocracy nor should it ever be. My own renegade band of Baptist sisters and brothers, the Alliance of Baptists, stand firmly on the side of freedom, and in particular for abortion access and reproductive justice as an essential human right--legal access to safe abortion as well as reproductive health-care is fundamental to the fabric of a sane society. The decision to overturn Roe vs. Wade has resulted in widespread chaos, misinformation, and the deliberate efforts to make safe and legal abortions beyond difficult.

Our Alliance of Baptist statement stresses that bodily autonomy originates from the very concept of individual conscience and the right of an individual woman to make decisions about her own body and reproductive health, not the state, not the government, and certainly not the Church. The individual woman. This aligns with our commitment to social justice and itself is a protest (that word again) to restrictive, dangerous, and harmful "Christian" theologies.

As all of us gathered here know too well, our advocacy needs strong voices raised in protest to promote reproductive freedom for all women, and in the case of our Interfaith Voices, prayerful protest.

Recently, the documentary entitled "Preconceived" was shown at our church, which depicts the deceptively devious practices in and around "Crisis Pregnancy Care Centers," a bait and switch scheme designed to discourage young women (often poor and desperate) from taking many factors into account regarding their choices for reproductive health. The film features two bold and brave women who find and raise their voice in powerful protest. I find hope in them as well as countless other courageous women who must make difficult choices under the threat of shame, scorn, and stigma. I hope your congregation will show it too...not just Protestant ones.

May we all speak a word of freedom for women everywhere. And protest where necessary.

History of the Bells by Tonya Hamm

Despite having played in the handbell choir for many years, I never knew the full story of how the Binkley handbell choir began. The handbells were recently refurbished and they look and sound brand new. This seemed like the perfect time to reflect back on the history of the handbell choir.

I sat down with Charles Carver and his daughter, Amy Quinlan, and asked them to tell me the full story of how the handbell choir came to be. Jenny and Charles Carver met at Mars Hill College and were married after college. They moved to Chapel Hill with their 4 children, Amy, Lynn, Ellen and John and started attending Binkley church. Jenny was a musician and enjoyed playing the piano for Sunday School and VBS. The Carver family were an integral part of the Binkley family. In 1987, at the age of 47, Jenny was diagnosed with breast cancer. Jenny underwent a bone marrow transplant which was somewhat experimental at the time. She was extremely sick for months afterward and Charles reports Binkley folks were always there for the family, providing nightly meals and assisting with other needs. Charles said “we didn’t have to cook a meal for 2 years” due to the loving care of Binkley friends. Jenny fought the cancer for 2 years but died in June 1989. The Carver family wanted to honor



and remember Jenny and thank Binkley church for all the love and support they received during Jenny’s illness so the family purchased a 3 octave set of handbells for Binkley. The bells were first played in church at Christmas 1989. A few years later another octave of bells were purchased and then chimes were added to the bell set in subsequent years. There is a “silent” bell in the narthex with Jenny’s name representing Jenny’s memory and the donation of the handbells in her memory. The sound of handbells brings such a sweet sound to Binkley services. Charles summed it up perfectly when he said “there’s a lot of love in those bells from our family and from Binkley”. What a beautiful representation of how our church is a family, standing side by side loving each other and ready to provide support for whatever need may arise from our fellow members. Thank you Carver family for your generous donation in memory of dear Jenny who will never be forgotten.

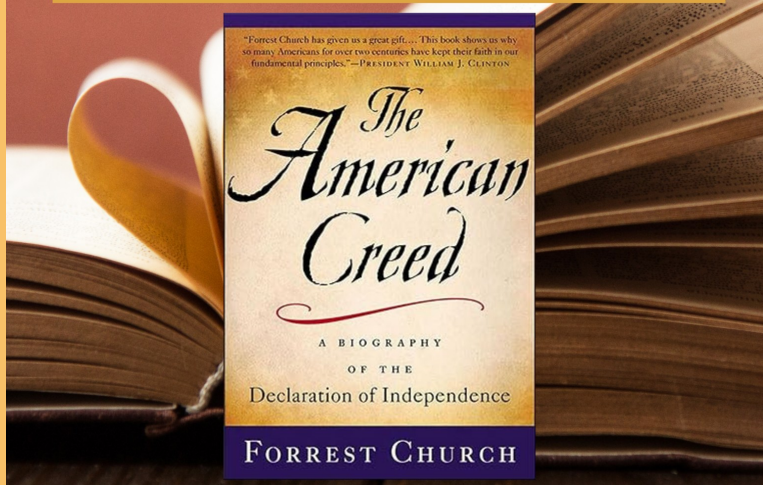
