The Proclamation of the Word

A reading from the book of Wisdom.

I learned both what is secret and what is manifest, for wisdom, the fashioner of all things, taught me. There is in her a spirit that is intelligent, holy, unique, manifold, subtle, mobile, clear, unpolluted, distinct, invulnerable, loving the good, keen, irresistible, beneficent, humane, steadfast, sure, free from anxiety, all-powerful, overseeing all, and penetrating through all spirits that are intelligent, pure, and altogether subtle. For wisdom is more mobile than any motion; because of her pureness she pervades and penetrates all things. For she is a breath of the power of God, and a pure emanation of the glory of the Almighty; therefore nothing defiled gains entrance into her. For she is a reflection of eternal light, a spotless mirror of the working of God, and an image of his goodness. The Ordination and Consecration of a Bishop

The Presentation

All remain seated while representatives of the diocese present the Bishop-Elect:

Anne, bishop in the Church of God, the clergy and people of the Diocese of Ottawa, trusting in the guidance of the Holy Spirit, have chosen Kathryn Anne Otley to be a bishop and chief pastor. We therefore ask you to lay your hands upon her and in the power of the Holy Spirit to consecrate her a bishop in the one, holy, catholic, and apostolic Church.

The Archbishop then directs that testimonials of the election be read by the Chancellor of the Diocese of Ottawa and the Provincial Chancellor. After the testimonials are read, the Archbishop requires the following promise from the Bishop-Elect:

In the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, I, Kathryn Anne Otley, chosen bishop of the Church and see of Ottawa, solemnly declare that I do believe the Holy Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments to be the word of God, and to contain all things necessary to salvation; I do solemnly promise to conform to the doctrine, discipline, and worship of the Anglican Church of Canada; and I do pledge myself to render due obedience to the Metropolitan of Ontario and to her successors. So help me God, through Jesus Christ.

The Bishop-Elect signs this declaration, and witnesses add their signatures.

All stand. The Archbishop then asks the response of the people:

Siblings in Christ Jesus, you have heard testimony given that Kathryn Anne Otley has been duly and lawfully elected to be a bishop of the Church of God to serve in the Diocese of Ottawa. You have been assured of her suitability and that the Church has approved her for this sacred responsibility. Nevertheless, if any of you know any reason why we should not proceed, let it now be made known.

If no objections are made, the Archbishop continues:

Is it your will that we ordain Kathryn a bishop?

It is.

Will you uphold Kathryn as bishop?

We will.

The Examination

All sit. The Bishop-Elect stands facing the Bishops, who gather around the Archbishop. The Archbishop addresses the Bishop-Elect:

Kathryn, the people have chosen you and have affirmed their trust in you by acclaiming your election. A bishop in God's holy Church is called to be one with the apostles in proclaiming Christ's resurrection and interpreting the Gospel, and to testify to Christ's sovereignty as Lord of lords and King of kings.

You are called to guard the faith, unity, and discipline of the Church; to celebrate and to provide for the administration of the sacraments of the New Covenant; to ordain priests and deacons and to join in ordaining bishops; and to be in all things a faithful pastor and wholesome example for the entire flock of Christ.

With your fellow bishops you will share in the leadership of the Church throughout the world. Your heritage is the faith of patriarchs, prophets, apostles, and martyrs, and those of every generation who have looked to God in hope. Your joy will be to follow him who came, not to be served, but to serve, and to give his life a ransom for many.

Are you persuaded that God has called you to the office of bishop?

I am so persuaded.

The following questions are then addressed to the Bishop-Elect by one or more of the other Bishops:

Will you accept this call and fulfill this trust in obedience to Christ?

I will obey Christ, and will serve in his name.

Will you be faithful in prayer, and in the study of Holy Scripture, that you may have the mind of Christ?

I will, for he is my help.

Will you boldly proclaim and interpret the Gospel of Christ, enlightening the minds and stirring up the conscience of your people?

I will, in the power of the Spirit.

As a chief priest and pastor, will you encourage and support all baptized people in their gifts and ministries, nourish them from the riches of God's grace, pray for them without ceasing, and celebrate with them the sacraments of our redemption?

I will, in the name of Christ, the Shepherd and Bishop of our souls.

Will you guard the faith, unity, and discipline of the Church of God?

I will, for the love of God.

Will you share with your fellow bishops in the government of the whole Church; will you sustain your fellow presbyters and take counsel with them; will you guide and strengthen the deacons and all others who minister in the Church?

I will, by the grace given me.

Will you be merciful to all, show compassion to the poor and strangers, and defend those who have no helper?

I will, for the sake of Christ Jesus.

All stand. The Archbishop then says:

Kathryn, through these promises you have committed yourself to God, to serve his Church in the office of bishop. We therefore call upon you, chosen to be a guardian of the Church's faith, to lead us in confessing that faith.

The Bishop-Elect leads the Nicene Creed.

We believe in one God,

the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy Spirit he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father. With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified. He has spoken through the Prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

The Consecration

The Scriptures tell us that our Saviour Christ spent the whole night in prayer before he chose and sent forth his twelve apostles. Likewise, the apostles prayed before they appointed Matthias to be one of their number. Let us, therefore, follow their examples, and offer our prayers to Almighty God before we ordain Kathryn for the work to which we trust the Holy Spirit has called her. Let us pray.

The people kneel. All the Bishops join the Archbishop around the Bishop-Elect as the litany is sung.

A period of silent prayer follows. The Archbishop stands with the assisting Bishops, stretching out her hands toward the Bishop-Elect who kneels before her, and prays:

We praise and glorify you, almighty God, because you have formed throughout the world a holy people for your own possession a royal priesthood, a universal Church.

We praise and glorify you, because you have given us your only Son Jesus Christ to be the Apostle and High Priest of our faith, and the Shepherd of our souls.

We thank you that by his death he has overcome death; and that, having ascended into heaven he has given his gifts abundantly to your people, making some, apostles; some, prophets; some, evangelists; some, pastors and teachers; to equip them for the work of ministry and to build up his Body.

And now we give you thanks that you have called Kathryn to share in the ministry entrusted to your Church.

The Archbishop and other Bishops lay their hands on the head of the Bishop-Elect, and the Archbishop prays:

Send down your Holy Spirit upon your servant Kathryn for the office and work of a bishop in your Church.

The Archbishop continues to pray:

Almighty Father, fill this your servant with the grace and power which you gave to your apostles, that she may lead those committed to her charge in proclaiming the gospel of salvation. Through her, increase your Church, renew its ministry, and unite its members in a holy fellowship of truth and love. Enable her as a true shepherd to feed and govern your flock; make her wise as a teacher, and steadfast as a guardian of its faith and sacraments. Guide and direct her in presiding at the worship of your people. Give her humility, that she may use her authority to heal, not to hurt; to build up, not to destroy. Defend her from all evil, that, as a ruler over your household and an ambassador for Christ, she may stand before you blameless, and finally, with all your servants, enter your eternal joy.

Accept our prayers, most merciful God, through your Son Jesus Christ our Lord, to whom, with you and your Holy Spirit, belong glory and honour, worship and praise, now and for ever. **Amen.**

The Archbishop anoints the hands and forehead of Bishop Kathryn with Chrism saying:

God has brought you to lead the priesthood of all believers as High Priest. May he pour out on you the mystical oil of anointing and the power of the Holy Spirit, to enrich you with spiritual blessings. May Jesus preserve you to lead and sanctify the Christian people and to offer spiritual sacrifices to God.

The new bishop is vested according to the order of bishops.

The new bishop is presented with a Bible by the Archbishop, with the following words:

Here are words of eternal life. Take them for your guide and, with all the baptized, proclaim them to the world.

The new bishop is presented with a pastoral staff by the Primate, with the following words:

Kathryn, I welcome you as a Bishop of the Anglican Church of Canada and as a Bishop in the worldwide Anglican Communion. Shepherd the flock of Christ with wisdom and compassion, and do not forget the trust committed to you as a bishop in the Church of God.

The Installation

All stand. The Metropolitan, accompanied by the Dean and the Chancellor, conducts the newly consecrated bishop to the Cathedra. As she is seated, the Dean says the following:

In the name of this Cathedral Church and on behalf of the people of this Diocese, I install you, Bishop Kathryn in the chair appointed to your office. May the Lord stir up in you the flame of holy charity and the power of faith that is trustworthy and true.

Amen.

The Peace

The Archbishop then presents the new bishop, saying:

I present Kathryn, bishop in the Church of God.

All greet the new bishop.

Bishop Kathryn makes some personal comments before saying:

The peace of the Lord be always with you.

And also with you.

We give thanks to you, Lord our God, for the goodness and love you have made known to us in creation; in calling Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in the Word made flesh, Jesus your Son. For in these last days you sent him to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Saviour and Redeemer of the world. In him, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you. In him, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness, out of death into life.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, a death he freely accepted, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: this is my body which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore, Father, according to his command,
we remember his death, we proclaim his resurrection, we await his coming in glory;

and we offer our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving to you, Lord of all; presenting to you, from your creation, this bread and this wine.

We pray you, gracious God, to send your Holy Spirit upon these gifts, that they may be the sacrament of the body of Christ and his blood of the new covenant. Unite us to your Son in his sacrifice, that we, made acceptable in him, may be sanctified by the Holy Spirit.

In the fullness of time, reconcile all things in Christ, and make them new, and bring us to that city of light where you dwell with all your sons and daughters; through Jesus Christ our Lord, the firstborn of all creation, the head of the Church, and the author of our salvation; by whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory are yours, almighty God, now and for ever. **Amen.**
