First Lesson: *Acts 17:22-31*

²² Paul stood in front of the Areopagus and said, “Athenians, I see how extremely spiritual you are in every way. ²³ For as I went through the city and looked carefully at the objects of your worship, I found among them an altar with the inscription, ‘To an unknown god.’ What therefore you worship as unknown, this I proclaim to you. ²⁴ The God who made the world and everything in it, he who is Lord of heaven and earth, does not live in shrines made by human hands, ²⁵ nor is he served by human hands,

Second Lesson: *1 Peter 3:13-22*

¹³ Now who will harm you if you are eager to do what is good? ¹⁴ But even if you do suffer for doing what is right, you are blessed. Do not fear what they fear, and do not be intimidated, ¹⁵ but in your hearts sanctify Christ as Lord. Always be ready to make your defense to anyone who demands from you an accounting for the hope that is in you, ¹⁶ yet do it with gentleness and respect. Maintain a good conscience so that, when you are maligned, those who abuse you for your good conduct in Christ may be put to shame. ¹⁷ For it is better to suffer for doing good, if suffering should be God's will, than to suffer for doing evil. ¹⁸ For Christ also suffered for sins once for all, the righteous for the unrighteous, in order to bring you to God. THE HOLY LAND CHRISTIANS WILL BE OUR GUESTS: HEAR THEIR STORY AND SEE THEIR BEAUTIFUL OLIVEWOOD CRAFTS

During the service on Sunday, May 10, 2026, Christians from the Holy Land will be with us, telling us about their lives. After the service, they will share displays of handmade olive wood articles from Bethlehem available for donations. These carvings include nativity sets, crosses, Christmas ornaments, candle holders, angels and many other religious crafts for your home or gifts to give others. The carvings are handmade by Christian families from Bethlehem who rely on these crafts for their daily bread.

More than 70% of the Christian Community in the Holy Land depend upon tourism as their only source of income. For decades those Christians have been enduring many hardships as tourism in Bethlehem has plummeted and access to other sources of income has been sharply restricted due to the ongoing conflict, the wars, the 12-yard wall built around Bethlehem, the COVID-19 pandemic, and most recently, the catastrophic war in Gaza for more than two years. Due to these factors, tourists are afraid and unable to visit the Holy Land. This has made it very difficult for the Christian families who, having lost their source of income, have been forced to immigrate and flee their homeland. The Christian population of the Holy Land was 30% in the last century. Today it is less than 1%. If it continues like this, in a few years we will find no Christians in the land of Christ. This would result in tragic consequences for faith and holy sites.

Hearing their stories, keeping them in prayer, and supporting their artwork are some of the ways that we can accompany them in dangerous times.
