Song of Songs 5:1-6

Some scholars believe that this is a story about Solomon and his wife, but he had an excessive number of wives and concubines. Whoever it was they were truly in love and only had eyes for each other. They had pursued each other and eventually married.

This defines the relationship we should have for God. He loves us and is looking for our heart. The man is passionately in love with this woman, and God desires us to be solely in love with him.

The woman awaits his arrival, but he has taken too long and she has retired to bed. When he did arrive she refused to get up because she had washed and prepared for bed and had no desire to dirty her feet and have to rewash again. He persistently knocked, and when she finally opened the door he was no longer there.

The lesson for us is not to get so comfortable that we miss God knocking on our door. We don't know the day nor the hour when God is coming. Sometimes we miss the moment and find ourselves at the eleventh hour seeking what we could have had. We must be careful when we chase after something or someone because we can easily be led astray.

Don't be like the woman who looked for the man and could not find him. Anybody and everybody cannot meet your needs. If you are the one doing the knocking make sure you are knocking on the right door. The wrong door may open and you are snatched into a darkness you cannot escape.

Jesus is knocking at the door of your heart. Will you let him in before it is too late? Seek the Lord while he may be found. Tomorrow may be too late.
