PRINCIPLES OF *Biblical Interpretation*

Interpretation: Has to do with deciphering, determining, and discovering what the writer of a given passage of scripture meant at the time and in context, when it was written. Clearly, dependence upon the enlightening of the Holy Spirit and prayer are most essential in properly interpreting the Bible (2 Tim. 3:16).

Doing a thorough Bible Study (Interpretation) includes paying attention to and consideration of such technical factors as:

1. **The Context** – the setting, nature, related concerns of a given passage are considered.
2. **The Content** – is the present text related to and consistent with other scriptures?
3. **Grammar** – recognize the relationship of words to one another (e.g., tense, number).
4. **Word Study** – the meaning of words in context as used or understood when written.
5. **Cross Reference** – other biblical passages (near and far) may shed light on a given or passage.
6. **Culture Background** – understanding how people in society related to and lived together, when and where the Bible was written.
7. **History** – consider the way a passage has been interpreted over time since its inception.
8. **Authorship** – the integrity and authority of the writer; (as inspired by the Holy Spirit, e.g., prophet, apostle, or under the supervision of an apostle, as Luke under Paul).

Guidelines for Interpreting the Bible

1. *Understand the writer's meaning.*
 2. *Observe the context.*
3. *Accept the limits of revelation (not every subject is address in scriptures).*
 4. *Identify the type of writing.*
 5. *Use the Bible to interpret itself.*
