- V. Justice of God in the final judgment
 - A. 1 Peter 1:17 - judges impartially
 - B. Romans 2:11 - God shows no partiality
 - C. Romans 3:19 - held accountable to God
 - D. Revelation 19:1-2 - His judgments are true and just

- VI. Moral application of the final judgment
 - A. Satisfies our inward sense of a need for justice in the world
 - B. Enables us to forgive others freely
 - C. Provides a motive for righteous living
 - D. Provides a great motive for evangelism

- VII. Hell
 - A. Luke 16:22-24 - rich man and Lazarus
 - B. Revelation 14:9-11 - tormented goes on forever and ever
 - C. Revelation 20:10 - tormented day and night
 - D. Annihilationism
 - E. God hates hell
