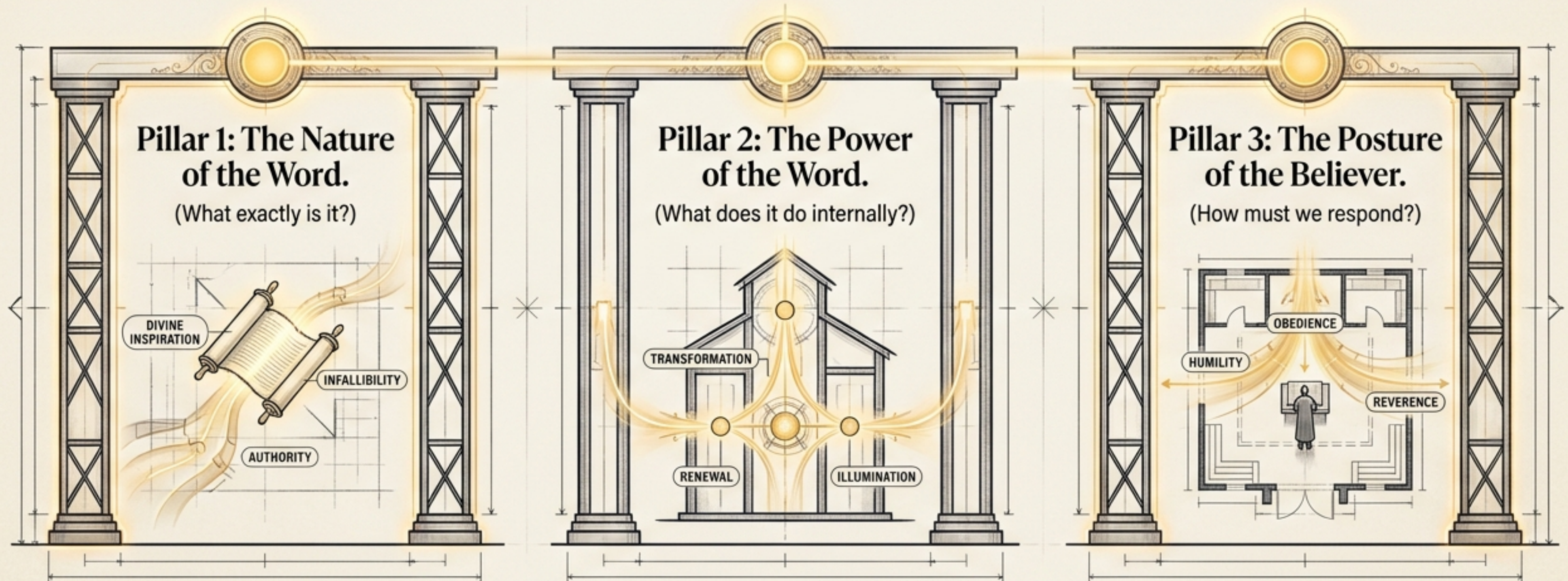

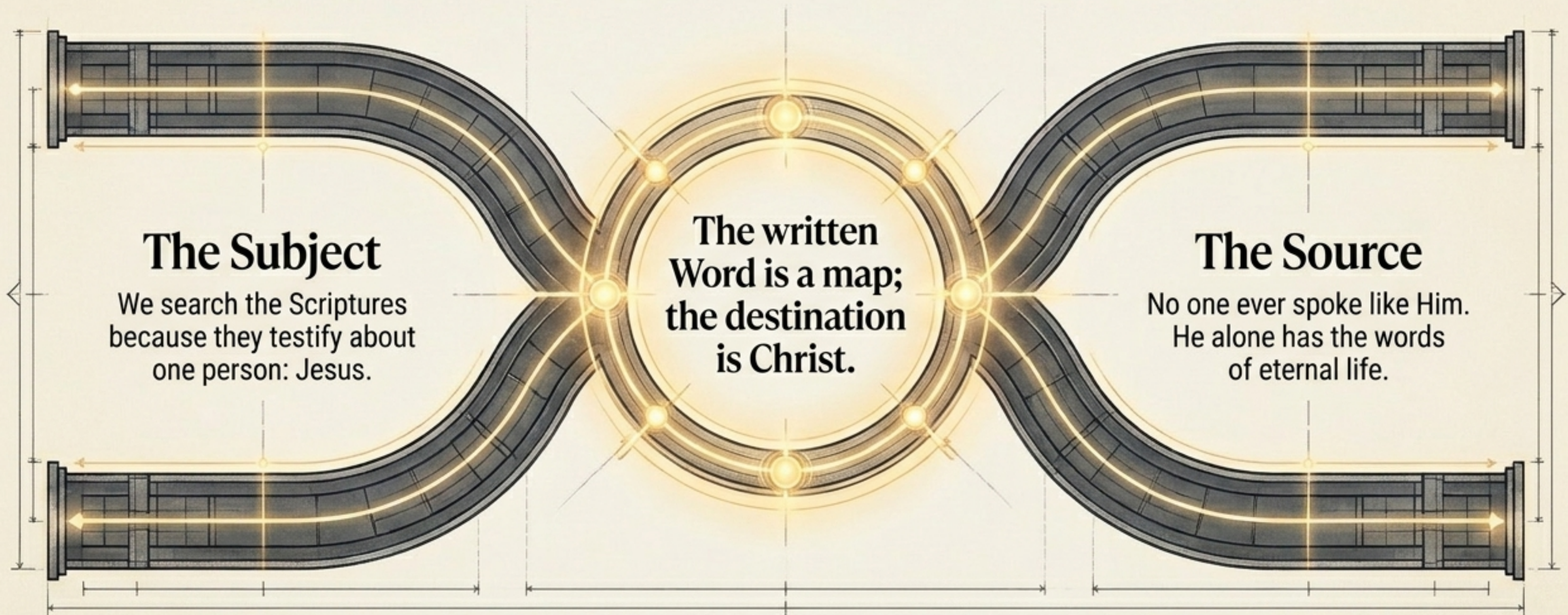

The Perishable

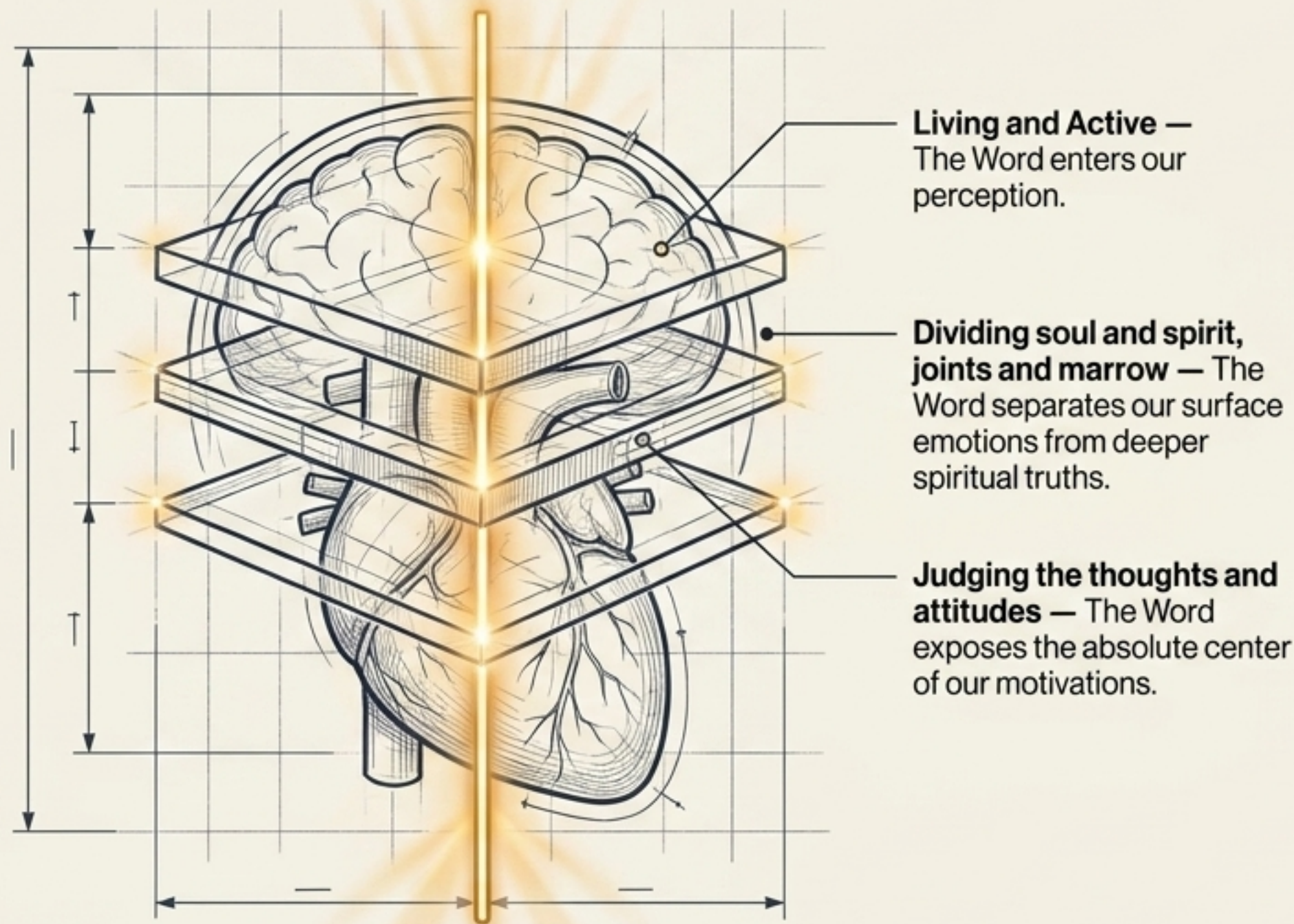
The natural world, which fades

Daily necessity.	Daily necessity.

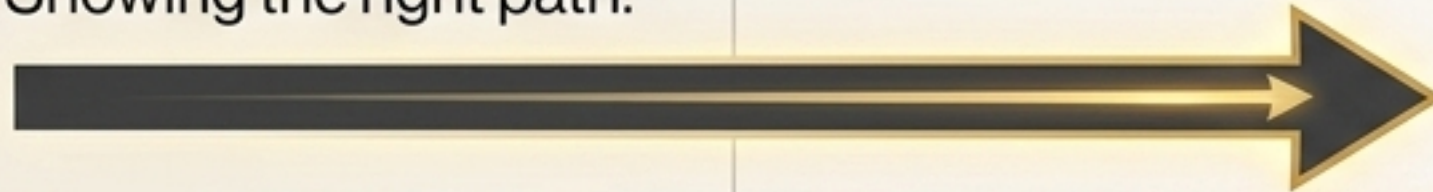
We recognize the immediate crisis of physical starvation, but often ignore the **silent crisis of spiritual malnutrition.**

The Path of God's Will

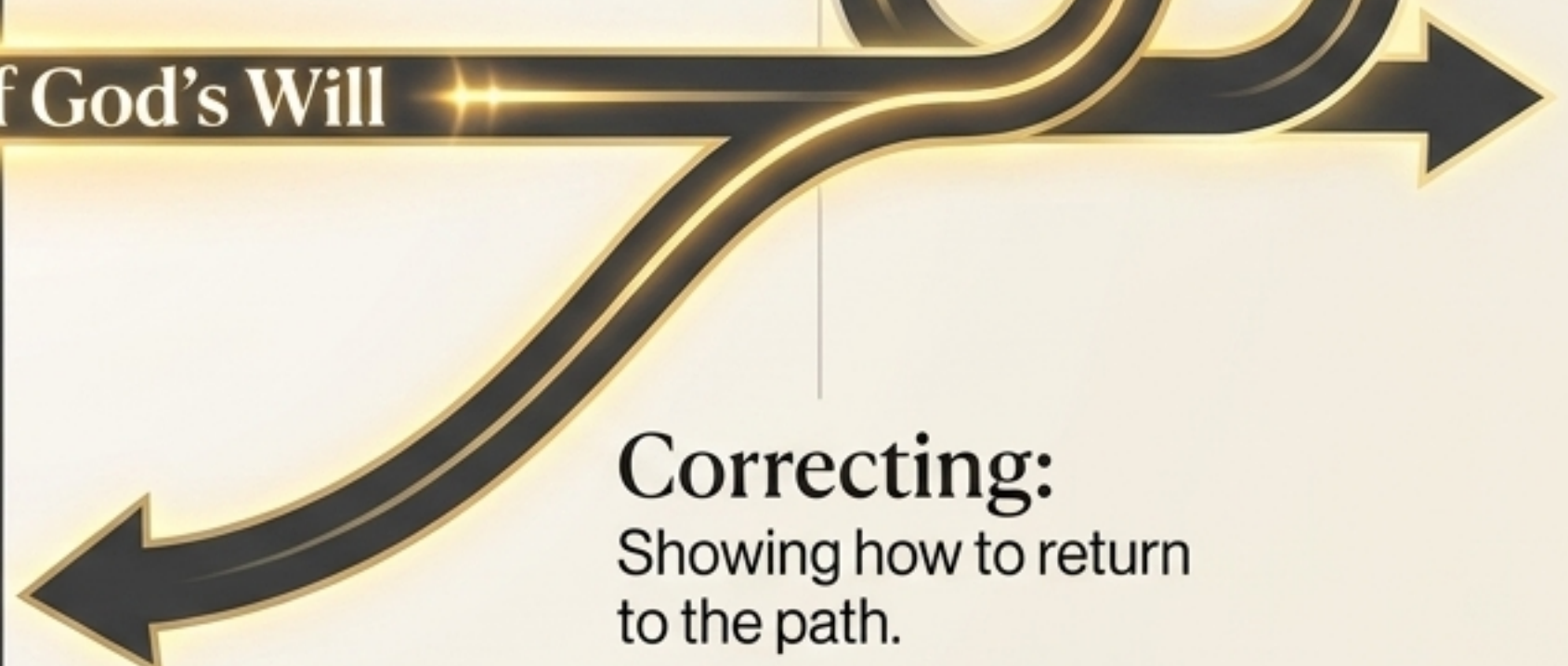
Rebuking:

Showing where we wandered off the path.

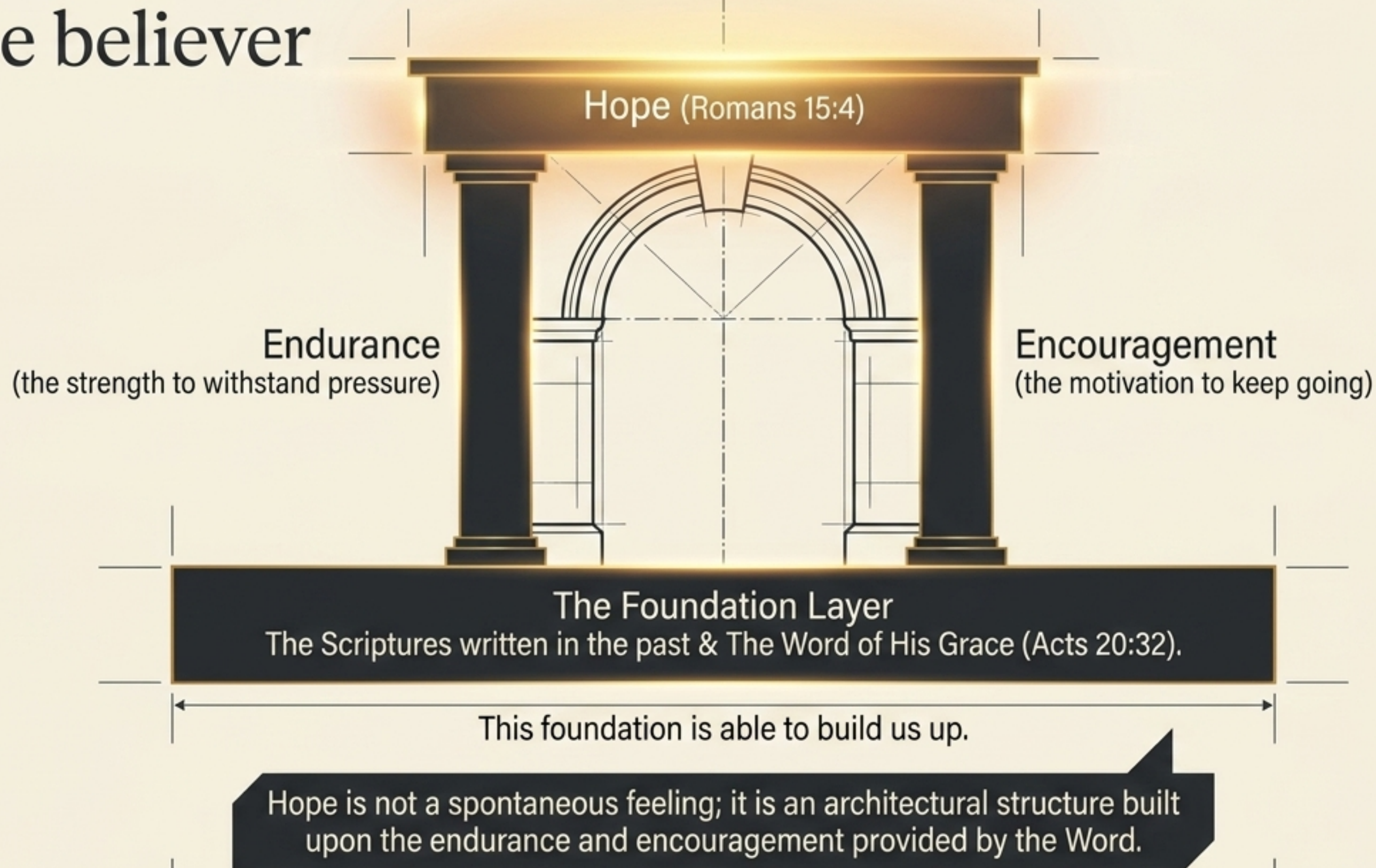


Correcting:

Showing how to return to the path.

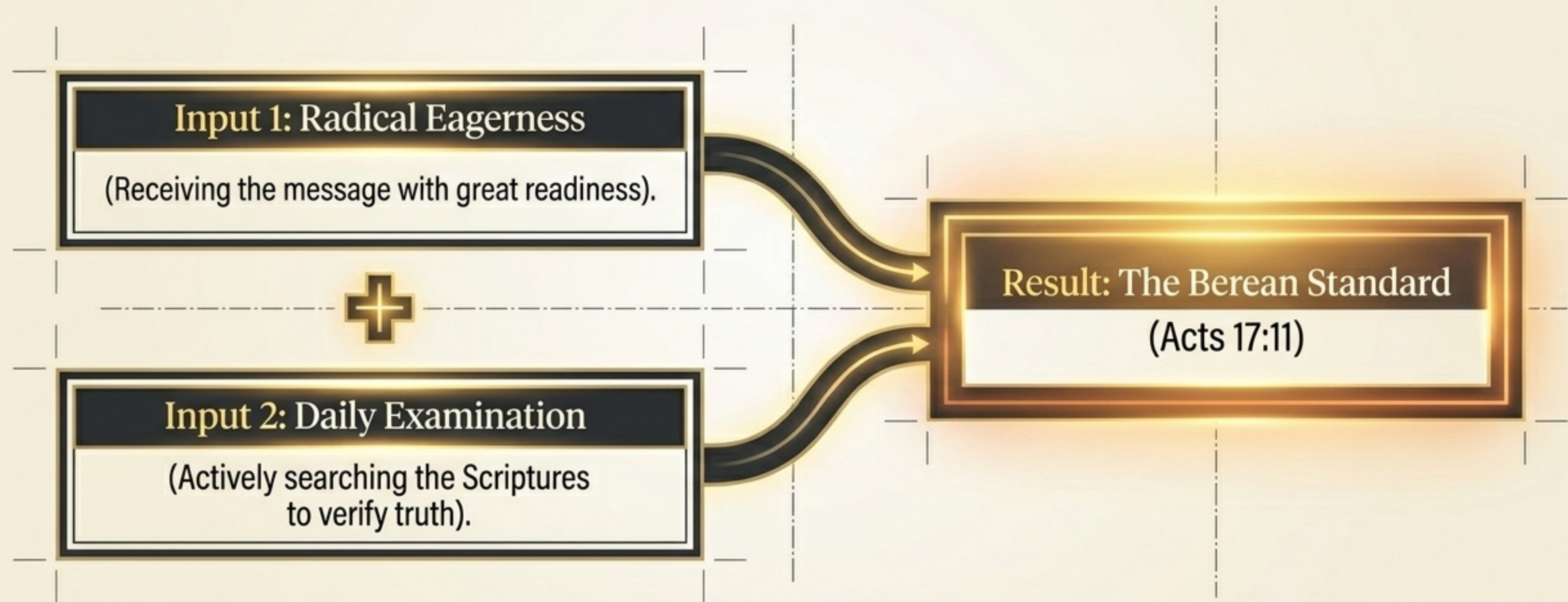


The structural anchors of the believer

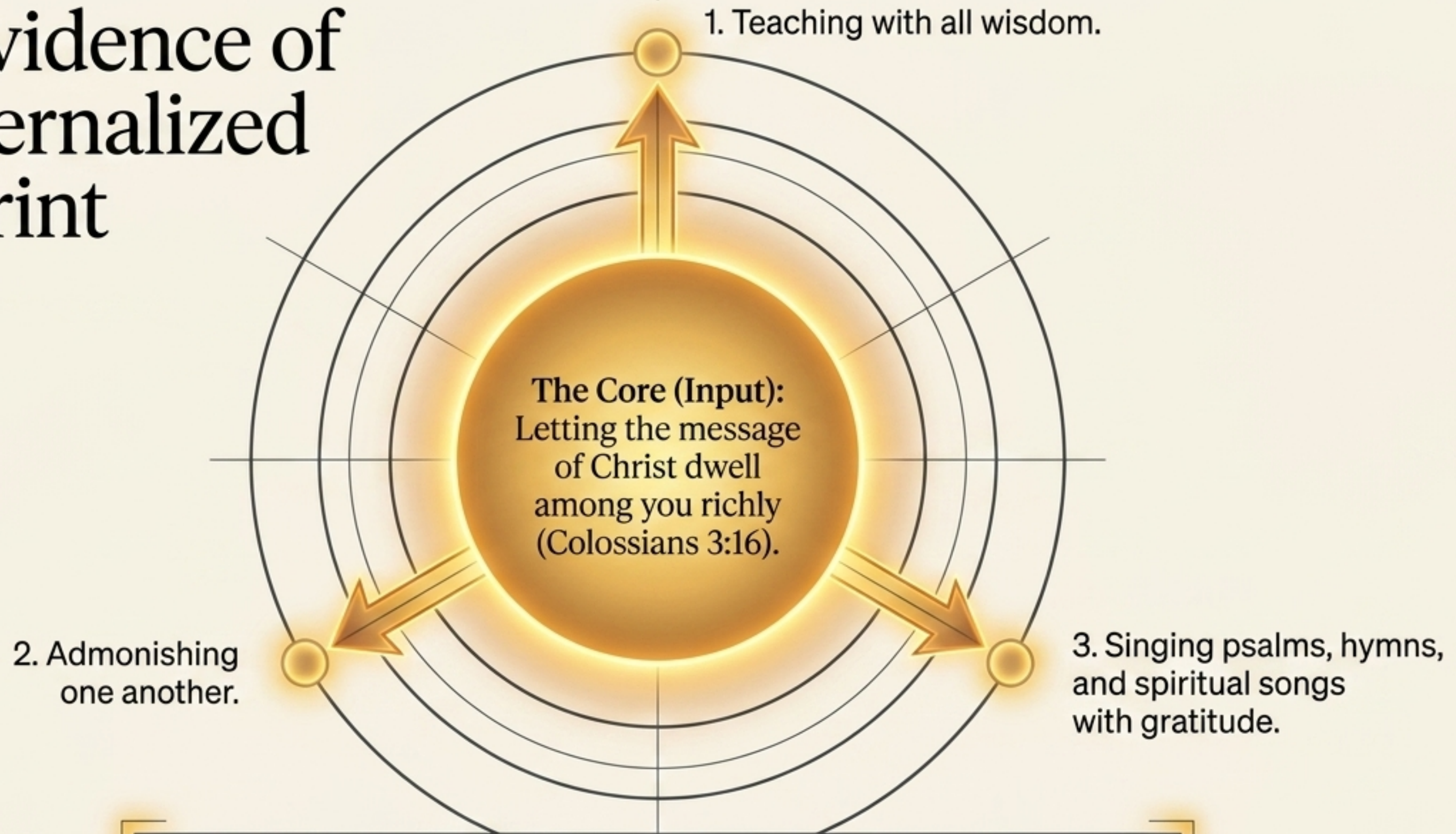


Adopting the Berean Standard

The evidence of an internalized blueprint



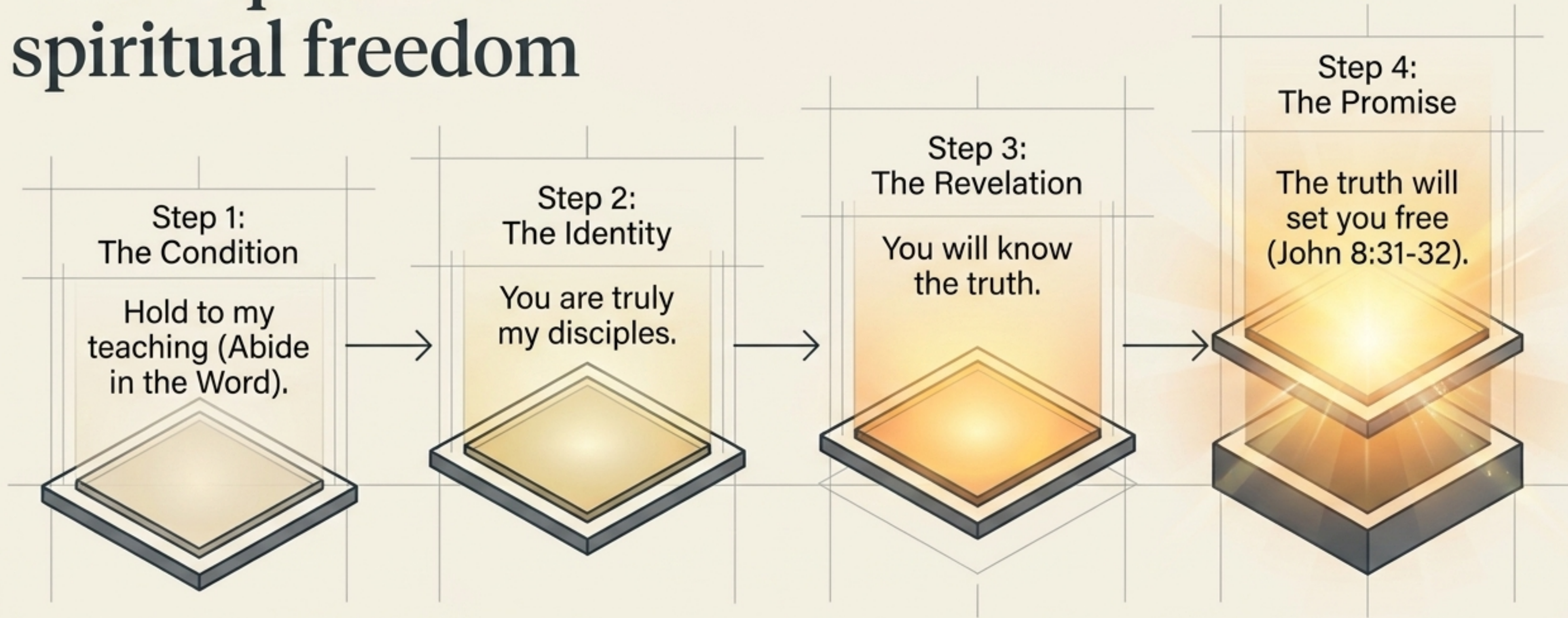
Our outward expressions of wisdom and worship are direct measurements of our internal saturation in the Word.

The diagnostic mirror of self-deception

James 1 warns against the danger of exposure to the Word without submission to it.

The Hearer	The Doer
Listens to the word but does nothing. (Like looking in a mirror and forgetting what you look like).	Looks intently into the perfect law and continues in it.
Self-deceived.	Truth-aligned.
Unchanged.	Blessed in what they do (James 1:25).

The sequence of spiritual freedom



Freedom in Christ is the final destination, but it is exclusively located at the end of a pathway that begins with steadfastly holding to His Word.

The Disciple's Ecosystem

These commands are not isolated tasks; they form a continuous, self-reinforcing engine of spiritual growth.

Phase 1: Search

Examining the scriptures daily with eagerness (The Bereans - Acts 17).

Phase 2: Internalize

Letting the Word dwell richly in the heart (Colossians 3).

Phase 3: Act

Doing what it says, not merely listening (James 1).

Phase 4: Abide

Holding to the teaching to experience true freedom (John 8).

The Word of God is not just a text to be referenced; it is the living blueprint we inhabit.
