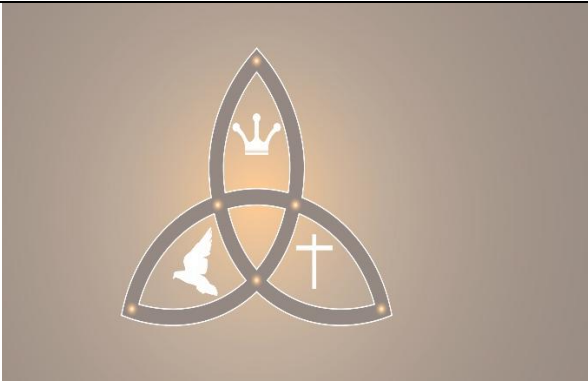

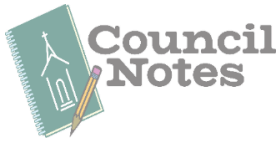

Peace Lutheran Church of Menomonie is going to the mountains of Montana to experience some Christian adventures through the Christikon experience!!

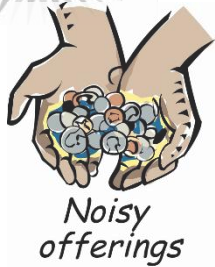
