The Divine Portion Within Us

The Power of Listening and Obeying

The Spirit of Truth

Three Ways the Holy Spirit Speaks Today

1. **Unction of the Spirit** — a deep inner knowing or impression that rises within your spirit, confirming what is right or warning against what is wrong.
2. **Still Small Voice** — a gentle whisper in your heart, quiet yet unmistakable, often heard when your mind is calm and your spirit is attentive.
3. **Audible Voice of God** — rare but powerful moments when God's voice is heard clearly, leaving no doubt of His presence and direction.

Living in Sensitivity

To hear the Holy Spirit clearly, we must cultivate sensitivity—through prayer, Scripture, and quiet reflection. His voice is not forced; it is invited. As we practice listening and obeying,

we begin to recognize His tone, His timing, and His truth. The more we respond, the more we grow in intimacy with God, walking daily in His protection and purpose.
