Children are welcome at all services! It is important for families to worship together. Don't feel your child must be absolutely quiet or still, for we are glad to have children—and all their wiggles, giggles, and squiggles—as part of our community and worship life! After all... as an old saying goes, “faith is caught, not taught!” Children are encouraged to stand and sing with the songs, partake in communion, read and pray along when they can, and join in for the “Early Word”—a time at the front with conversation just for them near the beginning of the service. Most Sundays September through June, we have “**Children's Church**” activities during the latter two-thirds of the service in the Lounge on the lower level, to which any pre-school through grade 5 aged child is welcome! For those accompanying infants or toddlers who need a spot to ‘escape’ during the worship service, feel free to make use of the “**Quiet Room**” off the side of the sanctuary, near the piano, where there you will find comfortable seating, toys, and a changing table all while being able to hear and see the worship service.



Recording and streaming in use: Please note that video cameras and microphones are capturing our worship services, and that the resulting content may be transmitted over Zoom, YouTube, or other platforms.

Likewise, from time to time still photography of our worship services may be taken and used for church communications, websites, and other uses. By your presence within the sanctuary, you are indicating your consent to the possibility that your likeness may be captured and used in any of these ways. While video capture of congregants in the pews is relatively minimal, if you wish to guarantee you will not ever be depicted on video, the area at the rear centre of the pew seating area is unable to be picked up on camera.



Washrooms can be found just outside the sanctuary through the door at the front right of the space (the northeast corner of the room).

Have a minute? Thoughts from Rev. Matt

When my neighbour feels like my enemy

“Love is not pretending harm is not harm. But I don’t think Jesus gives me permission to respond with hatred either. I don’t get to “other” them. This is deeply inconvenient.”

So writes the Rev. Bri-anne Swan, who serves as Lead Minister of the East End United congregation in Toronto and also as the regular writer for *Wilderness Times*, a partnership between Ms. Swan and the independent United Church affiliated magazine, *Broadview*.



Reflecting on the same passage from John 14 that I preached on a couple of weeks ago, Rev. Bri-anne wrestles with Jesus' statement "If you love me, you will keep my commandments," together with his commandment to "Love your neighbour as yourself," in light of a specific situation of ideological hardliners protesting against the progressive faith witness of her congregation.

I suspect that just about all of us who try to be faithful disciples of Jesus Christ run into situations where that commandment toward love of neighbour feels more than a little difficult when we actually consider who is included among our "neighbours" (and that's without even getting into the commandment to love our "enemies"). Even more, how do we be faithful in the face of a neighbour (or an enemy) who is actively abusing, harassing, or otherwise hurting us or others whom we are also called to love?

"Sometimes that means loving one neighbour enough to protect them, and another enough to refuse to meet their hatred with my own."
