## Caring for a Safe and Open Church

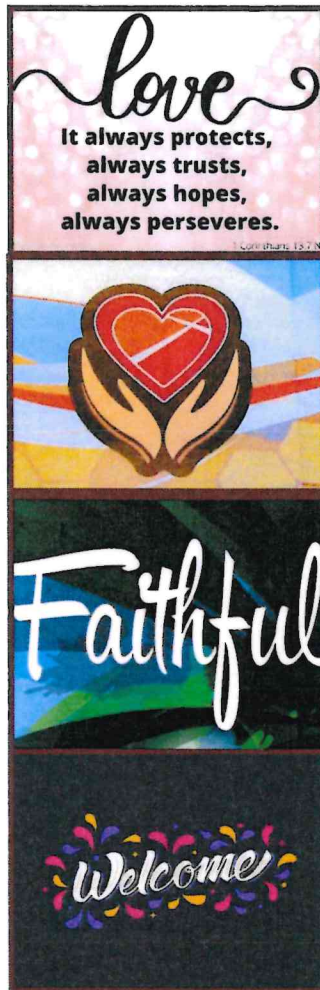
Over the past three years, Calvary's Board of Trustees has been thoughtfully evaluating how we steward both the safety and accessibility of our church building. As part of that ongoing work, Calvary is now implementing a few measured security updates, particularly in areas used by our childcare ministries and staff.

These updates include limited access in certain areas, an intercom at key entrances, and a small number of strategically placed cameras. These updates are designed to be minimally disruptive. Most ministries and guests will notice little to no difference in their normal routines.

These changes are, at their heart, about care. Scripture reminds us that "love always protects" (1 Corinthians 13:7). One of the ways we can embody this is by caring well for the people and spaces entrusted to us.

Just as importantly, what is not changing: Calvary will remain a welcoming, open, and accessible church facility. These updates simply give us the ability to be more intentional in how we care for our shared spaces, especially where children and staff are present.

I give thanks for the faithful, careful, and multi-year leadership of our Trustees in guiding this important work.

### Frequently Asked Questions

**Q: Is the church becoming less accessible?**

A: No. The church will remain open and accessible during normal business hours. These updates simply help us care well for certain areas without changing who we are.

**Q: How will this affect Sunday morning worship?**

A: Sunday morning worship will not be affected in any way.

**Q: Why make these changes now?**

A: This has been a thoughtful, multi-year process focused on stewardship and care, not a reaction to any one event.

**Q: What areas will be affected?**

A: Primarily childcare spaces and staff areas. Most of the building will function as it always has.

## PASTOR CONTINUED

**Q: Will I need a key or code to enter?**

A: In most cases, no. Any changes to access will be limited and clearly communicated where needed.

**Q: Are cameras being added everywhere?**

A: No. Only a limited number of cameras will be placed in key areas to support safety and awareness. The majority will be exterior cameras.

**Q: Can the building be locked down?**

A: The system allows for that if ever needed, but day-to-day operations will remain open and normal.

**Q: How are these updates being funded?**

A: These updates are being funded through a Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) grant, which supports safety and security improvements for houses of worship.

## CREATIVE EXPLORATION

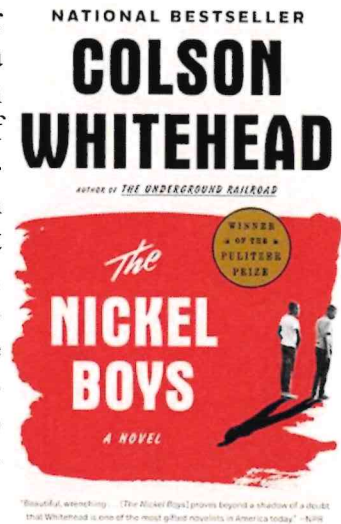

## RECYCLING AT CALVARY

If you ever place recyclable items in our Recycling Dumpster, please be sure to read this notice:

**Reminder! NO plastic bags may be placed in Calvary's Recycling Dumpster.** There are fines from the recycling site where our trash haulers deliver our recyclables which our hauler will pass on to the church if plastic bags are in the container. There are cameras on the trucks to monitor what is in our container and we will be fined \$165 if there are plastic bags, even just one.

**If you are taking recyclables out to the dumpster you must place the items so that they are loose in the dumpster and not within a plastic bag.** Allowable recyclables are: newspaper, cardboard (boxes must be broken down), glass jars or bottles, aluminum & tin cans, hard plastic bottles, jugs & jars (#'s 1, 2 or 5 only). ## GOD'S HELPING HANDS

### Home Repair Volunteers Needed

God's Helping Hands (GHH) is a faith-based home repair ministry, serving the greater Harrisburg area since 2011 that was founded by Aldersgate United Methodist Church (Mechanicsburg, PA). Their mission is to practice the teachings of Jesus by providing home and property maintenance and repairs for people in need.

In 2025, GHH served 8 homeowners with 154 volunteer work days on a variety of projects, including three ramps.

Projects are typically done over 3-day work weekends, scheduled several times throughout the year. Volunteers of any skill level are always needed and welcome, experience is not required.

**Summer Office Hours:** During the months of June, July, and August, our Church Office will be open Monday through Thursday from 8 AM until 4:30 PM.

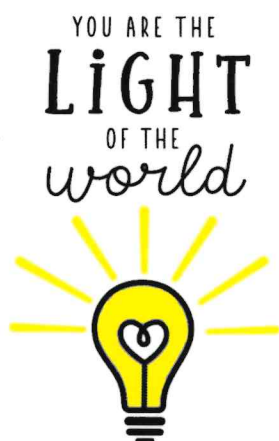

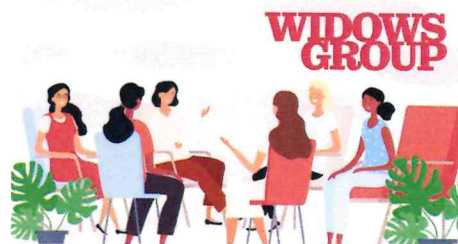
