As we move into the season of graduations, our household has been living in the strange and holy space between celebration and uncertainty. This year, two of my children are graduating, one from college and one from high school. Our home has been filled with caps and gowns, ceremony plans, proud moments, and the quiet questions that naturally follow such milestones: "What comes next?" "Will things work out?" "Who am I becoming now?"

Graduation is one of those moments that reminds us how much of life is lived without guarantees. No diploma comes with a roadmap. No commencement speech can fully prepare someone for the twists and turns ahead. And for parents, there is both joy and ache in watching children step into a future we cannot fully protect them from. In the middle of these moments, I find myself returning to the words of the prophet Isaiah:

*"Do not remember the former things or consider the things of old. I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it?" — Isaiah 43:18-19*

Those words speak deeply to seasons of transition. God's promise is not that the future will be easy or predictable. Rather, God promises to keep creating new possibilities, new paths, and new life even when we cannot yet see the whole picture.

Christian hope is not wishful thinking or pretending uncertainty does not exist. Hope is the deep trust that God walks with us into the unknown. Scripture is filled with stories of people stepping into uncertain futures, Abraham leaving home, Ruth beginning again, the disciples following Jesus without knowing where the road would lead. Again and again, God meets people not after certainty arrives, but right in the middle of the unknown. As my children prepare for new chapters, I am reminded that faith is less about having all the answers and more about trusting the One who journeys beside us.

At Agnus Dei Lutheran, we are people learning to live with that kind of hope together. In uncertain times, we hold onto the promise that God is still doing new things among us, still calling us forward, and still surrounding us with grace for each next step. And for that, thanks be to God.

## President's Message

June is the month for many members in the congregation to end their time serving on the council or committees. I want to thank everyone for their commitment to ADLC. Your dedication, time, and service help our ministries thrive and the congregation to function properly to serve each other and our neighbors in the community and throughout the world.

On the council we will say goodbye to Guy Johnson and Joy McCraw who both served for 3 years. Guy has been the liaison to the Property and Stewardship Committees during his time on the council. Joy has been the liaison for the Little Lambs Preschool. I appreciate them keeping the council apprised of what was happening in these committees and their support in addressing the many council decisions over the past 3 years.

Ronnie Kulman's and Debbie Snowden's 3-year terms on council also will end in June. I am very thankful that they agreed to run for another 3-year term and were elected to serve again at the May 17, 2026, congregation meeting. New members elected to the council during the congregation meeting are Jody Viscardi and Rhonda Sobie. I look forward to working with them as we continue to do the business of the church and support the many ministries at ADLC.

The congregation is responsible for filling positions on the Endowment Committee and the Little Lambs Preschool Board. In the congregation meeting on May 17<sup>th</sup>, Jenn Painsi was elected to a 2-year term and Katie Dobszinsky to her second 2-year term on the Little Lambs Preschool Board. Randy Spitzer and Lance Colyar were elected to serve again on the Endowment Committee along with Paul Borg who will serve a 2-year term. I want to thank Sally Middleton for serving two 2-year terms on the Little Lambs Board and her leadership as chair. Additionally, I want to thank Lynette Brentin for serving on the Endowment Committee the past several years and her support for updating the bylaws for the committee.

People continue to give generously to the **Freedom To Serve Campaign**. At the time of writing this message we have received pledges of \$157,000 before August 1, 2026, when our mortgage will be refinanced. Total pledged amount for the whole campaign is \$175,380. Pledges continue to come in from the cottage meetings so there will be further updates. When we refinance our 7-year variable interest loan in July this year it is projected that the interest rate could be around 7.0%. If we can raise \$175,000 by August 1<sup>st</sup> to pay down our mortgage at refinance, it will save us around \$17,000 in annual expenses. If we could meet a stretch goal of \$200,000 by August 1<sup>st</sup> we could save around \$21,000, which will help reduce the deficit projected in this fiscal year's budget.

Highlights from the May Council Meeting:

- ◇ Reviewed the Little Lambs financials (July 1<sup>st</sup> – April 30<sup>th</sup>). Income in excess of expenses for the fiscal year is \$33,623. Enrollment for the 2026–27 school year is progressing well with 34 students already enrolled.
- ◇ Accepted reports from the Council Committee Liaisons and acted as necessary on requests.
- ◇ Reviewed the ADLC fiscal year finances (February 1<sup>st</sup> – April 30<sup>th</sup>) that shows income less than expense by \$9,961. **Please review the complete financial report on the next page.**
- ◇ Approve a motion for Paula Davis and Kathy Gemar to fill terms on the Audit Committee.
- ◇ Decline a request for our neighbor, Brad Miller, who lives in the former rental house, to park his RV in our overflow parking lot.
- ◇ Heard a report from Pastor JT on the Pride in the Park event that will be held on June 27<sup>th</sup>.
- ◇ Received a letter from Rev. Daniel Rift, ELCA Director of Congregational Generosity, thanking us for our support of ELCA World Hunger and Lutheran Disaster Response.

### WHERE ADLC STANDS FINANCIALLY AS OF 4/30/2026

We have spent \$9,961 more than we have received in income for February-April. **This is not good**, and we need to change this pattern by increasing our income or reducing our expenses. **The largest area in our budget where we can reduce expenses and not affect Staff or church operations is our mortgage. That is why the Freedom to Serve Campaign is so important.** The interest rate on our mortgage will be going up in September. **By paying down our mortgage in July we will be able to lower our payments.** How far we lower our payments will be based on the success of the Freedom to Serve Campaign.

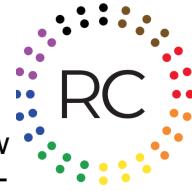


Mike, I see that we have spent \$9,961 more than our income so far. Where were we at the same time last year?

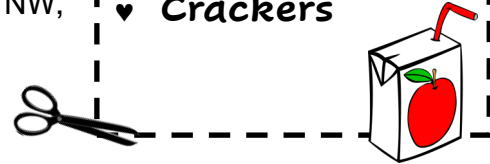


### June Outreach Project: Summer Lunch Program for Area School Children
