PASTOR'S PONDERINGS

This month, instead of writing about another Christian festival, I thought I would write about a common problem in church and society.

We don't control our speech well. Political leaders routinely bash their opponents, speaking of them in demonic terms. We routinely attribute bad motives and character to people we disagree with. Having spent so much time in echo chambers created by preferred media sources, we have little appetite for dialogue. We often listen in order to attack; we engage in order to subdue.

And in this situation, Dietrich Bonhoeffer's little classic *Life Together* has a lot of wisdom to share. Bonhoeffer, a Lutheran pastor and theologian, ran an illegal seminary at Finkenwalde in modern-day Poland from 1935 to 1937. After the Gestapo shut it down, Bonhoeffer wrote his thoughts on how Christian community could be structured and sustained in this book.

Life Together is honest. It is well aware of the forces that tear at Christian community: the judgments of others, the formation of cliques, the gossip, and the desire for control at the expense of relationship. Paragraphs like these continue to be convicting, showing how we often fail to control our words:

Often we combat our evil thoughts most effectively if we absolutely refuse to allow them to be verbalized....Those who keep their tongue in check control both spirit and body (James 3:3ff.). Thus it must be a decisive rule of all Christian community life that each individual is prohibited from talking about another Christian in secret....talking about others in secret is not allowed even under the pretense of help and goodwill. For it is precisely in this guise that the spirit of hatred between believers always creeps in, seeking to cause trouble.

This sounds difficult if not impossible. Nevertheless, it's a necessity for a healthy community. Most of the time with most of us, it's better to approach the person directly with one's concerns to prevent that "spirit of hatred" from creeping in. That's what Jesus teaches us in Matthew 18. To be sure, there may be other times (e.g. high-stress encounters, abuse, uneven power dynamics) that we need a third party to help us figure out how to proceed. *But proceeding is imperative.* We can't let bad situations linger and fester. When they do, they poison a community.

Bonhoeffer goes on to offer a vision of what happens when we practice this discipline of the tongue:

Where this discipline of the tongue is practiced right from the start, individuals will make an amazing discovery. They will be able to stop constantly keeping an eye on others, judging them, condemning them, and putting them in their places and thus doing violence to them. They can now allow other Christians to live freely, just as God has brought them face to face with each other. The view of such persons expands and, to their amazement, they recognize for the first time the richness of God's creative glory shining over their brothers and sisters. God did not make others as I would have made them. God did not give them to me so that I could dominate and control them, but so that I might find the Creator by means of them.

With all this advice, it's also important to remember that healthy community is always a gift of God. Left to ourselves, we form communities after the way of the world, with core values of fear, resentment, and control. However, with the Spirit of God, communities of still-sinful people understand they are made for more. We fail each other. We disappoint each other. We make each other angry or discouraged. But the Spirit of God keeps us in the truth: our community at Shalom is grounded in the forgiveness we each receive in Jesus Christ when we hear God's Word and receive the Sacraments.

April 20th, 2026**

PRESENT: Carol, Grant, Ken, Kersten, and Pastor David

Meeting was called to order at 5:33 pm.

Motion made by Ken to approve agenda, seconded by Pastor David, and carried unanimously. Motion made by Ken to approve the March 16, 2026 Council minutes, seconded by Kersten, and carried unanimously.

Devotion and Prayer by Pastor David, using the Moravian Church's approach of reflecting on a daily text, this one from John 16:7.

Reviewed reports by Pastor and Committees:

****Pastor's Report:** Report included in packet along with updates on the Jeremiah 29 project, confirmation, and the need for new synod meeting voting members due to eligibility issues with those named by the congregation. A youth-children's chorus as well as radio ministry focused on the arts are being discussed as potential options for Jeremiah 29 projects. Confirmation will be May 17. After discussion, the Council will have Pastor David reach out to a few potential members for interest in serving as synod delegates on May 30.

**** Staff:** Report in packet from the music and youth director.

**** Worship:** Report in packet. Committee noted the need for other committees to review shared ministry task list for accuracy, inclusion, and deletions before they are distributed to the congregation.

**** Finance:** Report in packet. Building fund is ahead of budget, general fund getting closer to budget. Reformatting of future budget reports for newsletters were discussed and will be tried in coming months.

**** Stewardship:** No report. Pastor David noted exploring future stewardship outreach with Thrivent help.

**** Y/ED:** Report in packet. Noted discussion on potential adjustment of family palooza into a more manageably-sized event, possibly a weeknight, summer jam with music type event to be explored.

****Outreach and Caring:** Report in packet. Noted that beautification will acquire chair for women's restroom.

****God's Work Our Hands:** Report in packet.

****Personnel:** No report. Did not meet.

**** Property:** Reported meeting, but no written report submitted.

**** Technology:** Requested sale of used floor sound monitors, motion by Carol, seconded by Ken to approve the sale by Technology, with proceeds to the Technology restricted fund, carried unanimously. Technology and Property committees are continuing to work on event forms, which will be routed to council when done.

**** Radio Ministry:** Report in packet. Noted new ministry content to be shared, and fundraising goal remains.

**** Mission Endowment Fund:** Report in packet from January meeting.

Summary:

This Shalom reporting is through April with a combined General and Building Funds deficit of \$18,522; primarily due to below-budget General fund offerings. March Bldg Fund receipts reflect a large 1-time offering. The General/Bldg Funds balance is \$109,306; about \$1,500 above Dec/25; mostly due low April offerings offset by a recent \$20k estate gift that was transferred into the Building fund from Memorial Funds.

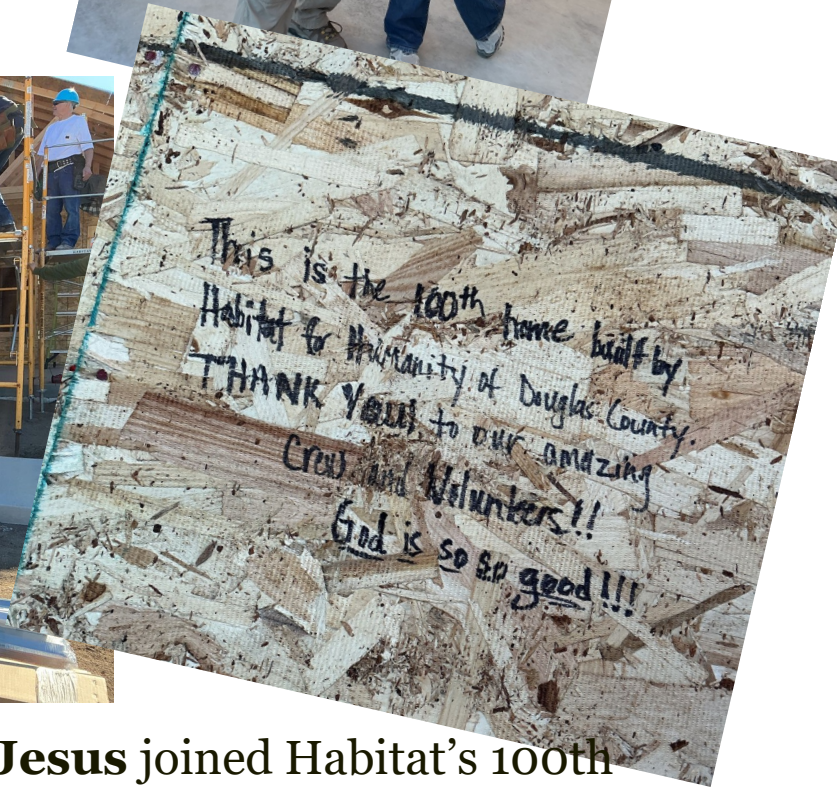

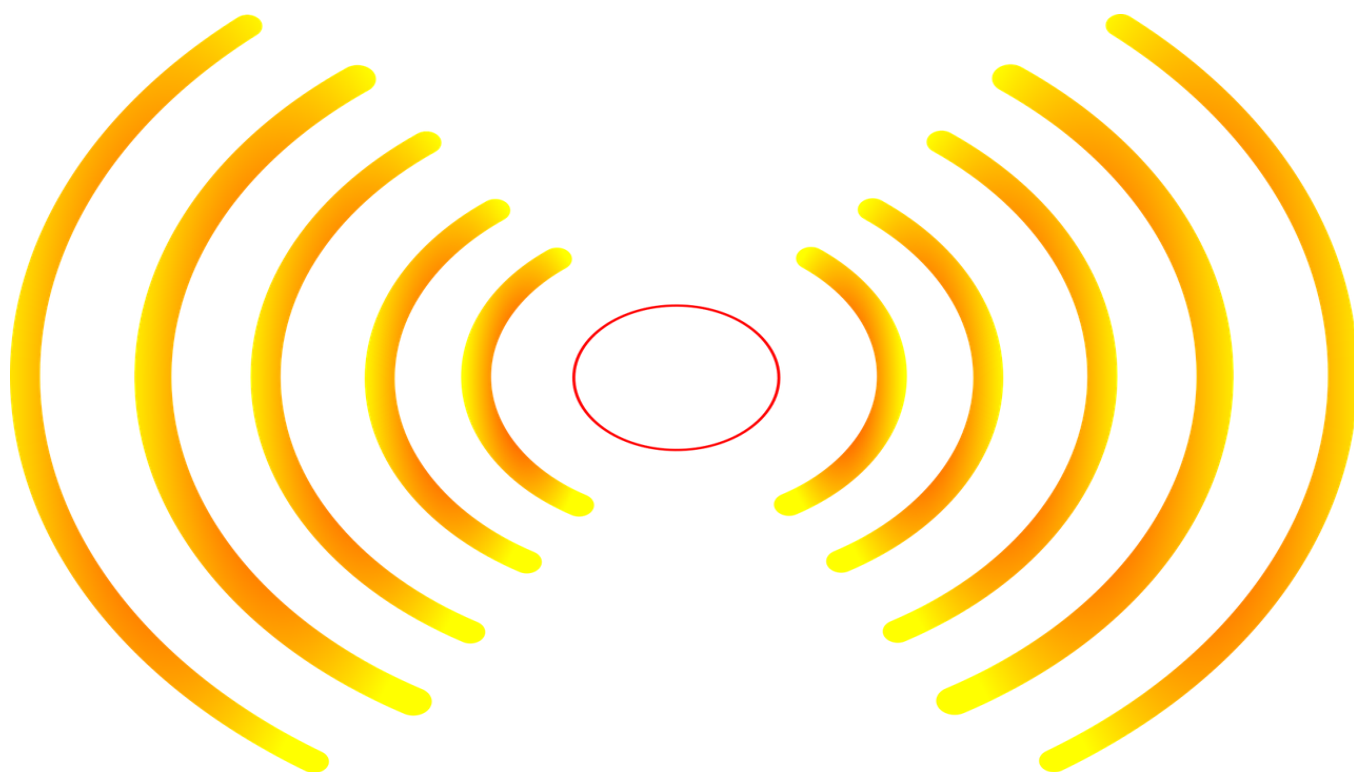
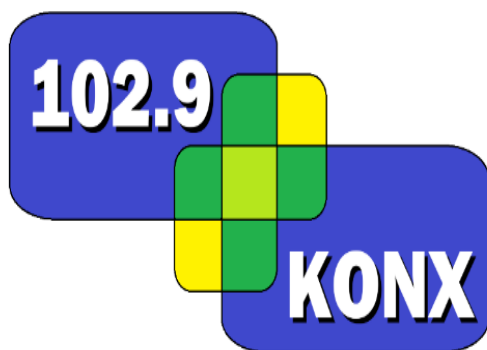


Adult Bible Study

Looking to help your community connect? Shalom’s Radio Ministry Committee is thankful for those who have pledged their support and offered encouragement toward making “**102.9 Connects**” (**KON-X**) a reality! Our proposed radio ministry’s goals are to connect the community, express our love and support of our neighbors, meet God’s calling to serve others, share the good news of Jesus Christ, and help others discover true peace. Two updates this month! **First, a programming update.** We are pleased to feature two short form programs by Pastor Kathryn Rothman as an example of the features a radio ministry like KON-X could bring to the community. **You can listen to these programs by clicking on the following links: [Pastor Kathryn’s conversation with Father Tom Sinning](#) and [Pastor Kathryn’s conversation with Kersten Kappmeyer](#).** Click on the links and they should play on any internet device. **Second, a financial update.** We have received over **\$9,100 in monetary donations**, as well as equipment donations, leaving approximately **\$6,000 left to raise**. This startup funding is necessary to launch the ministry, and our goal is to meet this by **a July 1 deadline**. If you feel moved to support this ministry, please consider lending support, either financially or by getting involved with the Committee. Donations are accepted to Shalom Lutheran’s attention; just clearly designate them for “Radio Ministry.” And all are welcome to attend committee monthly meetings, generally on second Sundays after Worship. A note from Pastor David on the Radio Ministry:

Dear friends, as many of you are aware, Shalom's Council gave approval in 2024 for the formation of a radio ministry committee. This came out of a rare (once-in-a-decade) opportunity to acquire a low-power FM license from the FCC. Here are a few reasons I support this project with my prayers and my checkbook:

1. Versatility and ease of use. You don't need to download a podcast app to listen to the radio. You don't need a computer. You don't need any kind of technical savvy beyond pushing a knob and turning a dial. Most cars have a radio. This doesn't discount the need for other means of communication. It enhances them and could potentially expand the reach of our ministry without relying on the internet.
2. Collaboration: Radio is a good medium not only for broadcasting Shalom programming, but for collaborating with community partners, too. First Congregational Church has recently given a grant to this project. Other ecumenical partners have also shown interest. This could be a community ministry that isn't "branded" to one congregation. On top of this, a radio station could play an important role if we were to face another disruption, like the tornadoes several years ago. Together, we could make a significant positive impact on our community.
3. Theology: Many Christian radio stations have a theology that is unaligned with our understanding of the gospel. For instance, you may turn on a preacher saying that a particular political party, leader, or ideology is either heaven-sent or demonic. They may imply that one cannot be a Christian without supporting the cause they champion. This is a distortion of the gospel of Jesus Christ. This project provides another opportunity to proclaim the gospel in a life-giving way.
4. Affordability: While the startup cost is substantial, ongoing yearly maintenance should be 10-20% of that cost. Considering the potential outreach, the cost is affordable, especially if it is shared by community partners. There are possibilities for underwriting programs as well.

I invite you to explore the potential of this by reading the note below about KONX (Connects), the station's proposed callsign. Reach out to Kersten for more information. I am also happy to have a conversation too. Your thoughts and questions are always welcome. Let's discover the possibilities together!

Bake Sale There will of course be a Bake Sale. We encourage and appreciate all items you make and bring.
