Questions

JOHN 4:27-42

- Where in my life am I trying to “do all the work” in ministry or witnessing, instead of trusting that Jesus has already gone before me and prepared hearts?
- Can I identify a situation or relationship right now where I can see evidence that Jesus has already been at work?
- How does knowing Jesus is the One who prepares the harvest change the way I approach sharing my faith?
- What excuses or “someday” thinking have I been using to delay sharing the gospel or serving others?
- If Jesus said, “Lift up your eyes and look at the fields, for they are white already for harvest,” what would my eyes see in my own neighborhood, workplace, or family today?
- How does the urgency of the harvest challenge my daily priorities and schedule?
- Who are the “Samaritans” in my life – people I tend to overlook, avoid, or think are unlikely to come to Christ?
- How has my view of who is “reachable” by the gospel been too small or too narrow?
- In what ways is God calling our church to look beyond our comfort zone to the wider harvest?
- Looking back on this week, where did I miss a harvest opportunity that Jesus had already prepared?
- What is one practical step I can take this week to participate in the “now” of God’s harvest?
- How can I pray more intentionally for the global harvest – especially for people and places that feel very different from me?
- What would it look like for me (or our church) to live with a constant awareness that “the fields are white”?
- Share a time when you saw God clearly prepare someone’s heart before you even spoke to them.
- Why do you think we often lose the sense of urgency in evangelism?
- Who is one person God might be putting on your heart right now as part of His harvest?
