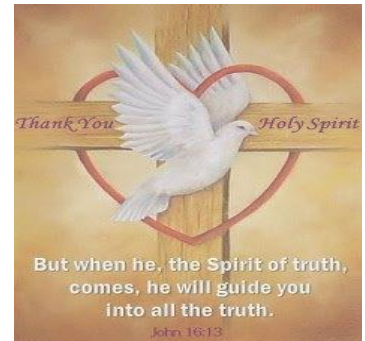

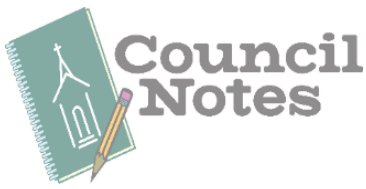

Meeting called to order by Council President, Anastasia at 5:51 PM.

Devotions by Anastasia.

Shawn made a motion to approve the agenda. Seconded by Patty. All approved.

April minutes were approved by e-mail on April 22, 2026. All approved.

Shawn made a motion to accept the Lutheran Church Funeral Fees. Seconded by Pat.

Shawn made a motion to approve the new members Cindy & David Reimann. Seconded by Pat.

Patty made a motion to approve \$3,500.00 to Tim Frank for the communion room equipment to be paid from the Eva Wahl Estate Funds. Seconded by Pat.

Pat made a motion to approve \$725.00 to Northwest Synod of Wisconsin for Allen Horbach to attend the Lay School of Ministry and \$250.00 to the Northwest Synod of Wisconsin for Lay School of Ministry for mentor materials for Augie to be paid from the Kelling Education Funds. Seconded by Shawn.

Pat made a motion to approve \$350.00 to Luther Park for Ethan Mrdutt to be paid from the Kelling Education Funds. Seconded by Keith.

Keith made a motion to approve scholarships to Henry Erickson, Wren Swaenepoel and Charlie Mikesell in the amount of \$1000.00 each to be paid from the Kelling Education Funds. Seconded by Patty.

Keith made a motion to approve \$3,380.00 to Pop Wagner to perform at Sunday Service and the Mable Tainter on January 17, 2027 and \$2,300.00 to Blue Hills Chorale to perform at Sunday service and the Mable Tainter on March 14, 2027 to be paid from the Kelling Music Funds. Seconded by Pat.

Shawn made a motion to approve \$5,000.00 to the Dunn County Veterans for the purchase of small tents, sleeping bags and rain ponchos to be paid from the Kelling Council Gains Funds. Seconded by Keith.

A discussion was held regarding the piano and the need to replace it based on the tuner's notes. Kittrick is exploring various options and will form a small group to determine what is needed and what will best serve Peace Lutheran. Council agreed to begin looking at options up to \$35,000.00 at this time. More information will be shared as it becomes available—stay tuned.

Discussion:

- ..Tim Frank provided a bid of \$3,500 for the Communion Room equipment. This would include a custom made oak cabinet, countertop, sink, faucet, and installation. It would also include removal of the old cabinet and all labor. Tom made the motion to approve the bid. It was seconded by Jeff. All approved. The proposal will be forwarded to Council for final approval.
- ..Representatives from the Eva Wahl estate presented another check to PLC. The amount was \$27,871.55. The funds are to be used to "benefit" PLC. The funds will be invested with the earlier generous gift to PLC by Eva Wahl.
- ..We will get a quote this month on the tree removal at the cemetery. Shackleton Tree Service has done our work in the past.
- ..A bid to install an improved emergency phone in the elevator was discussed. Randy Marlett and Dave Rollay are leading the project.
- ..Flags were picked up for placing on Veteran's graves before Memorial Day.
- ..Replacement wheelchairs can be obtained from the Veteran's Office. We will ask for two wheelchairs to replace our worn ones.
- ..Randy began the process of installing a handicap door opener on the door near the elevator. When finished the entry will have an awning also.

Completed:

- ..The Communion Room was painted.
 - ..The winter sand was removed from the parking lot.
 - ..Flowers were place on graves of Berndt, Shaffer, Diller, and Kelling.
 - ..Trimming of the brush/trees in the cemetery fence has begun
 - ..A glass company was contacted about replacing the outside protectors/plexiglass on the stained glass windows. The bid was between \$76,000 and \$105,000. This project will be tabled at this time.

Sara Olson Smith This summer, Women of the ELCA participants will gather in Des Moines, Iowa, under the theme “I am worthy.” When Nobel Peace Prize winner Leymah Gbowee spoke in 2017, she invited WELCA participants to reclaim space for women and girls to lead and love in bold ways. This three-part Bible study will help us to define who we are, what we can be, and what we do in the world, in light of our God-given giftedness, identities and relationships.</p> <p>(June 2026) “I am created in God’s image. No matter what anyone else says.” We’ll begin with the story of God’s creation and the “very goodness” that is spoken over every human being. The study will then turn to various scripture texts that have been used to undermine, silence and degrade women for centuries. Unpacking the ways these verses have been read against women shines a light on the realities of sexism and the ways that, for too long, the Bible has been used to prop up the oppression of women. But we will also hear how those same scriptures can be read as invitations to new freedom, community and vocation for people, regardless of gender, for all people were made in God’s image.</p> <p>(July 2026) “I am more than one thing: Honoring our many identities.” In her TED talk, “The Danger of a Single Story,” Chimamanda Ngozi Adichie names this truth: We are much more than one thing. All of us have intersecting identities, roles and responsibilities. Beyond our ethnicity, the color of our skin or our birthplace, we may also be a sister, a mother, a daughter, a friend. We have various vocations, hobbies and joys. In this session, we’ll explore how the multiple identities of several women in Scripture shape their faithful living. Esther is not just a queen, but a niece, as well as part of an oppressed community of faith. Ruth is so much more than just a widow. Mary Magdalene has more identities than can fit within the allowed word count of this paragraph.
