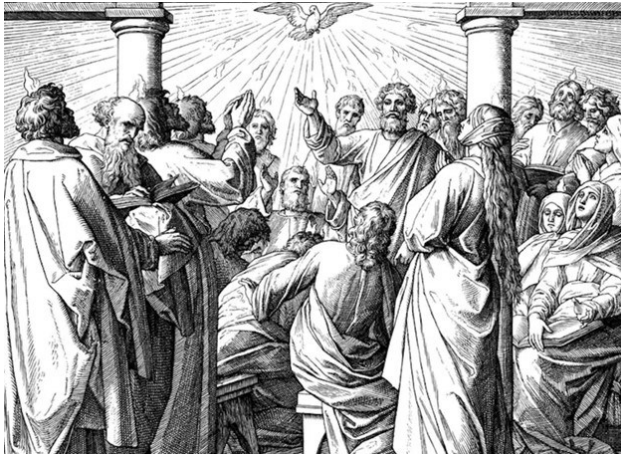


ALL SAINTS BY-THE-SEA

Beaver Point Hall's Bean Supper was started after the Hall was rebuilt in 1937 as a way to help raise funds to pay for insurance. Since then, it has become something more. It has become a community event that brings us together. Over the years, it has remained both, helping to fund things like the Lions' Pioneer Village Project (1965) and currently helping to keep this unique historic, almost 100-year-old community building up running affordably for the community. The doors to the Bean Supper will open at 4:00 pm and will be serving until 7:30 pm.

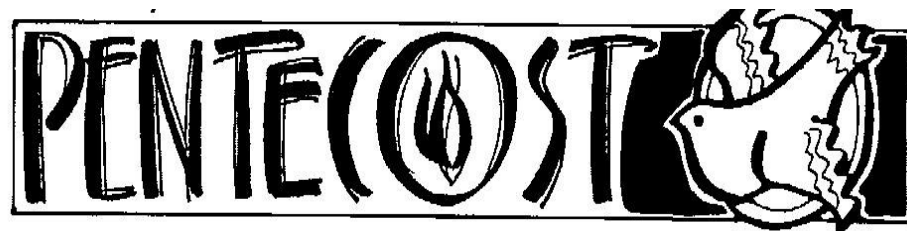
- Please join us for **Evening Prayer every Wednesday** in the Sanctuary from **5:00—5:45pm**

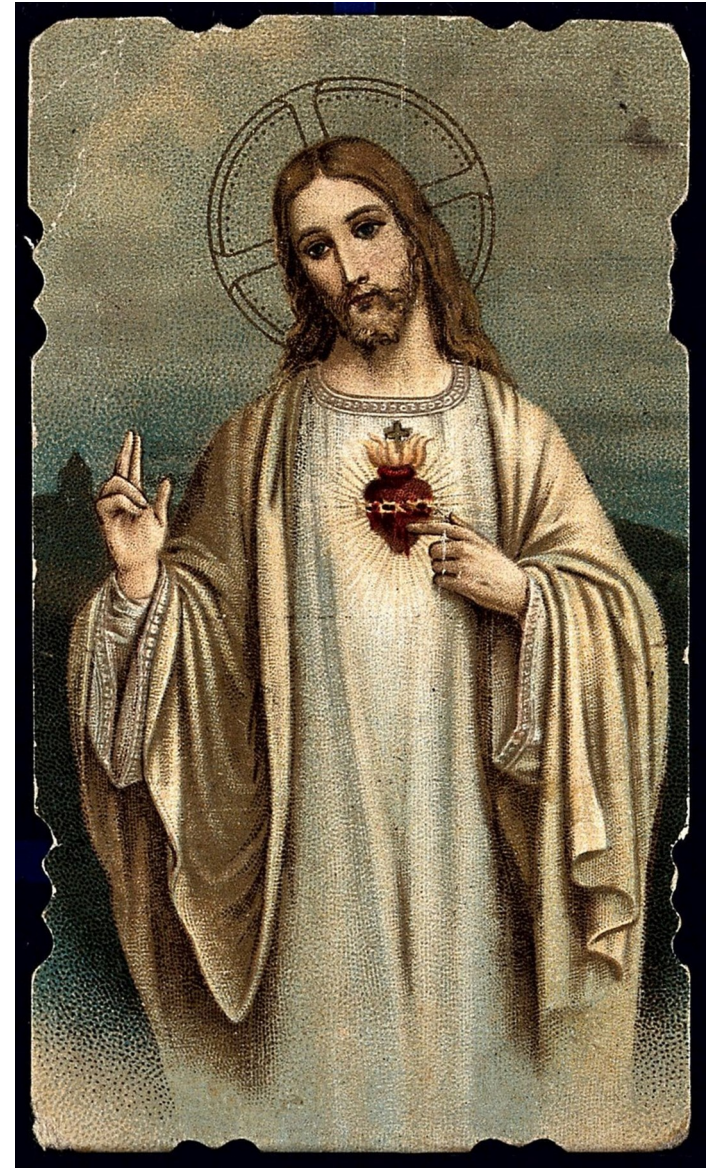
