## SECOND READING

ROMANS 4:13-25

<sup>13</sup> The promise that he would inherit the world did not come to Abraham or to his descendants through the law but through the righteousness of faith. <sup>14</sup> For if it is the adherents of the law who are to be the heirs, faith is null and the promise is void. <sup>15</sup> For the law brings wrath, but where there is no law, neither is there transgression.

<sup>16</sup> For this reason the promise depends on faith, in order that it may rest on grace, so that it may be guaranteed to all his descendants, not only to the adherents of the law but also to those who share the faith of Abraham (who is the father of all of us, <sup>17</sup> as it is written, “I have made you the father of many nations”), in the presence of the God in whom he believed, who gives life to the dead and calls into existence the things that do not

exist. <sup>18</sup> Hoping against hope, he believed that he would become “the father of many nations,” according to what was said, “So shall your descendants be.” <sup>19</sup> He did not weaken in faith when he considered his own body, which was already as good as dead (for he was about a hundred years old), and the barrenness of Sarah’s womb. <sup>20</sup> No distrust made him waver concerning the promise of God, but he grew strong in his faith as he gave glory to God, <sup>21</sup> being fully convinced that God was able to do what he had promised. <sup>22</sup> Therefore “it was reckoned to him as righteousness.” <sup>23</sup> Now the words, “it was reckoned to him,” were written not for his sake alone <sup>24</sup> but for ours also. It will be reckoned to us who believe in him who raised Jesus our Lord from the dead, <sup>25</sup> who was handed over for our trespasses and was raised for our justification.

# FLC - COMMUNITY DAY CAMP Volunteers Needed

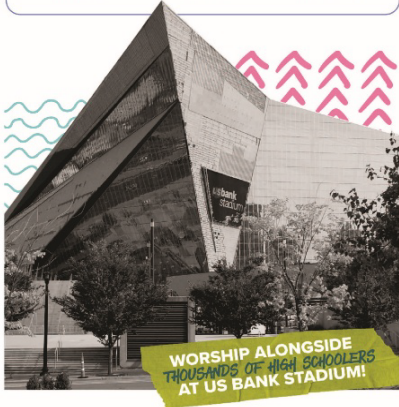
- Host Family for Bible camp staff
  - Housing for three (3) staff with onsite access to a shower and an individual sleeping space for each gender; staff of the same gender may share a room.
- Provide supper meal for staff (3) July Sunday 26 Wednesday July 29<sup>th</sup>
  - FLC will provide Three (3) meals provided each day for SBC staff team, beginning Sunday supper through Thursday lunch, while accounting for dietary needs. (A list of staff members and dietary needs will be provided to the host congregation 2 weeks in advance.) Light breakfast and lunch provided at the church.
- Assist counselors with camp Monday July 27 Thursday July 30<sup>th</sup> 9am to 3 pm; Training meeting at 4pm on Sunday July 26<sup>th</sup>
  - Host congregation First Lutheran is responsible for recruiting a volunteer team. This team is essential to making Community Day Camp happen! Volunteers will form a ratio of one (1) adult to every eight (8) campers, following SBC Policies and American Camping Association ratio recommendations.
  - High School volunteers 16+ are encouraged to serve as volunteers, with a parent signature, and can be part of overall ratios but cannot be left alone in direct supervision of campers.
  - Volunteers 18+ must undergo a background check completed through Ministry Safe no less than 2 weeks before VBS.
  - Training event led by SBC Staff for Leaders/ Volunteers on Sunday July 26<sup>th</sup> at 4 pm
- Prepare and serve lunch for campers and volunteers Monday July 27 Thursday July 30<sup>th</sup>
- Community engagement event
  - Coffee hour pancake breakfast on Sunday July 26<sup>th</sup>

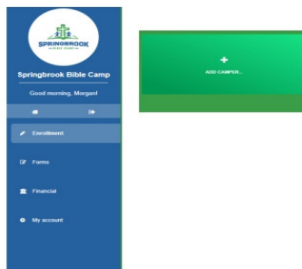
1. Go to <https://www.springbrookbiblecamp.org/> to find the online registration page and click "Register" in the top right corner.

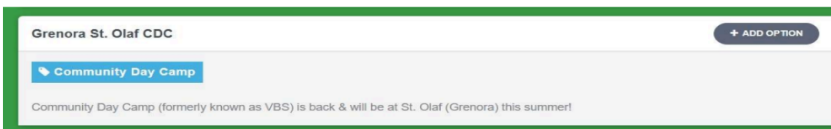
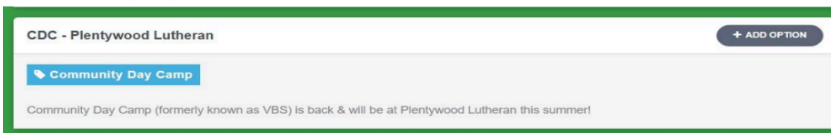
2. Select the "Enrollment Tab" to add a camper!
