- Can of Soda (ex: Sprite or lemon lime soda, to replace eggs and oil)
- Birthday Candles
- Paper Plates
- Napkins
- Plastic Utensils
- Balloons
- Birthday Banner
- Blank Birthday Card
- Anything else you would like to add

Include these directions: Replace eggs and oil with one can of soda. Follow the instructions on the cake box.
