



## “Rallying The People” Week 5

**Big Idea:** God calls His people to move beyond inspiration into action, uniting in intentional community to rebuild what is broken and raise the next generation of faithful followers.

### **Main Scripture**

**Nehemiah 2:17-18** “17But now I said to them, “You know very well what trouble we are in. Jerusalem lies in ruins, and its gates have been destroyed by fire. Let us rebuild the wall of Jerusalem and end this disgrace!” 18Then I told them about how the gracious hand of God had been on me, and about my conversation with the king. They replied at once, “Yes, let’s rebuild the wall!” So they began the good work. Let us rebuild the wall... and they replied, Let us start rebuilding.

The Next Generation will not **accidentally** become passionate followers of Jesus. They must intentionally be **disciplined**.

It takes, parents, family, and the church working together to raise and make these **heros**.

**Ecclesiastes 4:9-10** “Two are better than one... If either of them falls down, one can help the other up.”

We were never meant to do life **alone**.

**Acts 2:42** “They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to fellowship...”

But that's only **half** of what the early church devoted themselves to.

But you cannot live out **biblical** community alone.

Because fellowship is where the **teaching** gets **tested**.

But spiritual maturity isn't measured by how much **Bible** you know. It's measured by how much **Bible** you **live**.

Teaching **informs** us, but fellowship **transforms** us.

Church was never meant to be an **event** you **attend**. It was meant to be a **family** you **belong** to.
