

## **Nine Baptisms in Acts** **June 7, 2026**

**2 Peter 1:20-21**, *“But know this first of all, that no prophecy of Scripture is a matter of one’s own interpretation, <sup>21</sup> for no prophecy was ever made by an act of human will, but men moved (and carried along) by the Holy Spirit spoke from God.”*

**Acts 2:37-41**, *“Peter’s words pierced their hearts, and they said to him and to the other apostles, “Brothers, what should we do?” <sup>38</sup> Peter replied, “Each of you must repent of your sins and turn to God, and be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins. Then you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. <sup>39</sup> This promise is to you, to your children, and to those far away—all who have been called by the Lord our God.” <sup>40</sup> Then Peter continued preaching for a long time, strongly urging all his listeners, “Save yourselves from this crooked generation!” <sup>41</sup> Those who believed what Peter said were baptized and added to the church that day—about 3,000 in all.”*

**Acts 8:12**, *“The people believed Philip’s message of Good News concerning the Kingdom of God and the name of Jesus Christ. As a result, many men and women were baptized.”*

**Acts 8:35-38**, *“Then Philip opened his mouth, and beginning from this Scripture he preached Jesus to the Ethiopian eunuch. <sup>36</sup> As they went along the road they came to some water; and the eunuch said, “Look! Water! What prevents me from being baptized?” <sup>37</sup> [And Philip said, “If you believe with all your heart, you may.” And he answered and said, “I believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God.”] <sup>38</sup> And he ordered the chariot to stop; and they both went down into the water, Philip as well as the eunuch, and he baptized him.”*

**Acts 9:9; 17-19**, *“Saul was three days without sight, and neither ate nor drank. <sup>17</sup> So Ananias departed and entered the house, and after laying his hands on him said, “Brother Saul, the Lord Jesus, who appeared to you on the road by which you were coming, has sent me so that you may regain your sight and be filled with the Holy Spirit.” <sup>18</sup> And immediately there fell from his eyes something like scales, and he regained his sight, and he got up and was baptized; <sup>19</sup> and he took food and was strengthened.”*

**Acts 10:44-48**, *“While Peter was still speaking these words, the Holy Spirit fell upon all those who were listening to the message. <sup>45</sup> All the circumcised believers who came with Peter were amazed, because the gift of the Holy Spirit had been poured out on the Gentiles also. <sup>46</sup> For they were hearing them speaking with tongues and exalting God. Then Peter answered, <sup>47</sup> “Surely no one can refuse the water for these to be baptized who have received the Holy Spirit just as we did, can he?” <sup>48</sup> And he ordered (commanded) them to be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ.”*

**Acts 10:34-36**, “God does not show partiality, but every man who fears Him and does what is right is welcome to Him. Jesus Christ is Lord of all.”

**Acts 16:14-15**, “As Lydia listened to us, the Lord opened her heart, and she accepted what Paul was saying. <sup>15</sup> She and her household were baptized.”

**Acts 16:30-33**, “The jailer asked, “Sirs, what must I do to be saved?” <sup>31</sup> They replied, “Believe in the Lord Jesus and you will be saved, along with everyone in your household.” <sup>32</sup> And they shared the word of the Lord with him and with all who lived in his household. <sup>33</sup> Even at that hour of the night, the jailer cared for them and washed their wounds. Then he and everyone in his household were immediately baptized.”

**Acts 19:4-6**, “Paul said, “John’s baptism called for repentance from sin. But John himself told the people to believe in the one who would come later, meaning Jesus.” <sup>5</sup> As soon as they heard this, they were baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus. <sup>6</sup> Then when Paul laid his hands on them, the Holy Spirit came on them, and they spoke in other tongues and prophesied.”

**Acts 22:12-16**, “Ananias was a godly man, deeply devoted to the law, and well regarded by all the Jews of Damascus. <sup>13</sup> He came and stood beside me and said, ‘Brother Saul, regain your sight.’ And that very moment I could see him! <sup>14</sup> “Then he told me, ‘The God of our ancestors has chosen you to know his will and to see the Righteous One and hear him speak. <sup>15</sup> For you are to be his witness, telling everyone what you have seen and heard. <sup>16</sup> What are you waiting for? Get up and be baptized. Have your sins washed away by calling on the name of the Lord.’”

**Titus 3:5-7**, “When God our Savior revealed his kindness and love, <sup>5</sup> he saved us, not because of the righteous things we had done, but because of his mercy. He washed away our sins, giving us a new birth and new life through the Holy Spirit.”

**1 Peter 3:20-21**, “God waited patiently while Noah was building his boat. Only eight people were saved from drowning in that terrible flood. <sup>21</sup> And that water is a picture of baptism, which now saves you, not by removing dirt from your body, but as a response to God from a clean conscience. It is effective because of the resurrection of Jesus Christ.”
