and their encounter with the Creator in this place goes before our own.

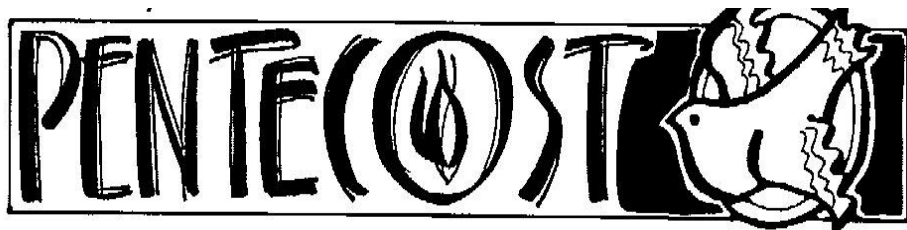

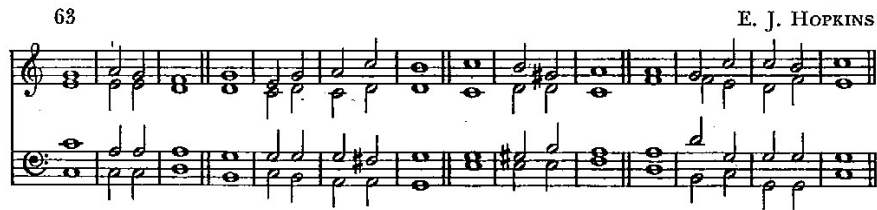

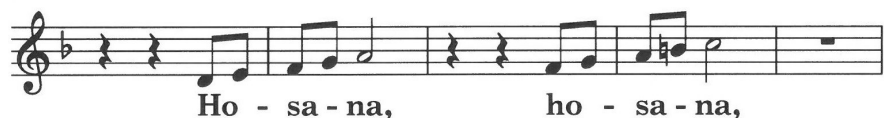
