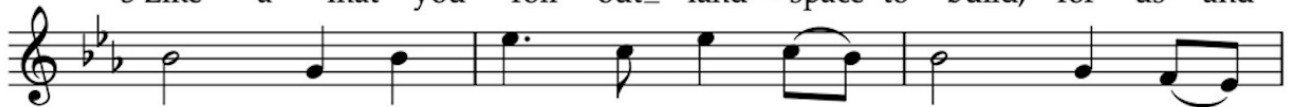

The Confession and Absolution

Deacon We were created from God's loving heart, and that same love embraces us with forgiveness. We have sinned against each other: we have put up walls between ourselves and our neighbours, giving in to the fear, ignorance and arrogance that make up racism. We have failed to respect the gifts of all your peoples. We have failed to respect the gifts of the four directions. We have used our power to dominate and our weakness to manipulate; we have evaded responsibility and failed to confront evil; we have trusted false gods and listened to their promises; we have denied dignity to ourselves and to each other; we have fallen into deep despair. In our despair we have forgotten you, and have gone away from your path. Forgive us for what we have done when we have hurt others; and forgive those who have hurt us. The ways we have hurt Mother Earth. Give us your blessing and help. Let us walk in your great love; through the great peace maker, your Son, Jesus. Amen.

Presider Almighty God have mercy upon you, pardon and deliver you from all your sins, confirm and strengthen you in all goodness, and keep you in eternal life; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

The Communion

For public health, please do not dip the Bread into the Wine. If you do not wish to partake of the common cup, know that you receive the full efficacy of communion with only the Bread. If you do not wish to receive communion, you are invited to receive a blessing by approaching the altar and crossing your arms over your chest. You may also remain in your seat as you feel comfortable. If you are interested in learning about baptism, please contact a member of our clergy. During communion, Healing Prayer is offered for all people in the west alcove. **Please respect the confidentiality of the people praying by not entering the alcove during prayer time.**
