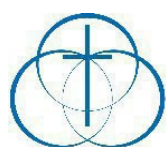

Summer is an exciting season in the life of the church, especially for our children and youth. Two of the greatest opportunities we have to help young people grow in their faith are Vacation Bible School (VBS) and church camp. These ministries are much more than just summer activities—they are opportunities for lives to be changed by the love of Jesus Christ. For many children, VBS and church camp become moments they remember for the rest of their lives. They are places where seeds of faith are planted, friendships are formed, and young hearts begin to understand who God is and how deeply He loves them.

VBS creates a fun and welcoming environment where children can learn about Jesus through Bible stories, music, crafts, games, and fellowship. While children may come for the excitement and activities, they leave having heard the truth of the Gospel. VBS also gives churches a unique opportunity to reach families in the community who may not regularly attend church. A simple invitation to VBS can open the door for a child—and sometimes an entire family—to begin a relationship with Christ and become connected to the church family.

Church camp often allows young people to step away from distractions and spend time focused on God. Away from phones, schedules, and daily routines, students have the opportunity to worship, study Scripture, and build meaningful Christian friendships. Many pastors, church leaders, and faithful Christians can point back to a church camp experience as a turning point in their spiritual journey. It is often at camp where young people feel called into ministry, surrender their lives to Christ, or deepen their faith in powerful ways.

As we get into our summer activities, I ask that you pray for our VBS and Church Camp this year that the people, adults and children, will be moved by God and strengthened in their relationship with him. If you have young children who you think would enjoy VBS, please get them signed up! Lastly, consider joining the fun next year for camp and make lifelong memories.

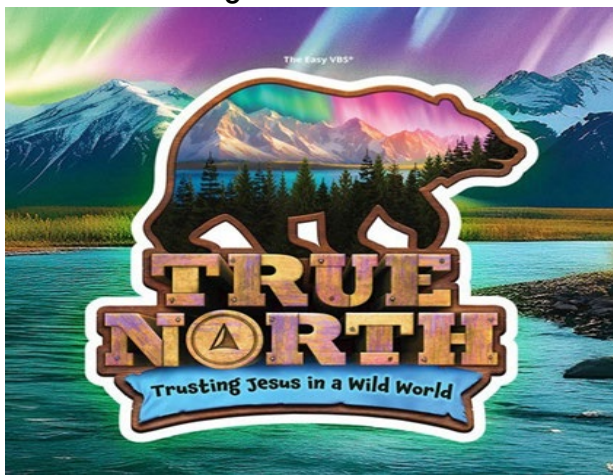
