CONCLUSION

As David lay on his deathbed, he left Solomon with a
powerful legacy.

His message can be summarized in three simple truths:

Be strong - Obey God - Trust Him with the results.

A real man stands for truth even when it is unpopular.	A real man fears God more than he fears people.

II. KEEP THE CHARGE OF THE LORD

David knew something important. Strength without direction can become destructive.

The Word must first be in our hearts before it can effectively reach the hearts of our children.
