Introduction

2. **Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego - Hope in the Fire** - Scripture: **Daniel 3:23-25**. These three young men refused to compromise their faith, even when threatened with death in a fiery furnace. Because they trusted God completely, they stood firm, and God was with them in the fire. Their example reminds us that being rooted in Christ does not mean we avoid trials—it means God walks with us through them.

5. **Spiritual Growth and Maturity:** As we remain connected to Christ, our faith grows stronger.
6. **Purpose and Direction:** Christ guides our steps and reveals His purpose for our lives.
