Ask, Seek, Knock

Jesus offers one of my favorite promises in the Sermon on the Mount:

“Ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you.”
– Matthew 7:7

I've discovered over the years that many of the most meaningful conversations in ministry begin with a question. Sometimes the question is about God or the Bible. Sometimes it's about prayer, suffering, forgiveness, heaven, doubt, purpose, grief, relationships, or how to make meaning in our lives.

I've also learned that the question underneath the question is often more important.

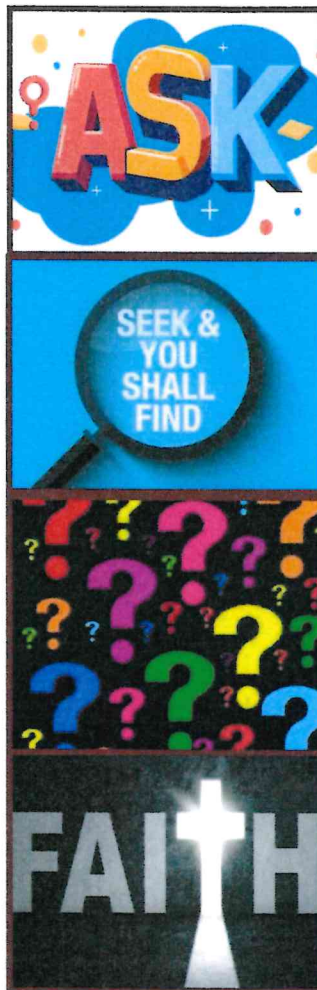
For example, someone recently asked me:

"What will we do in heaven? Will we have purpose there? Will we be able to watch over loved ones who are still on earth?"

Y'all...I love this question!

Not only because it asks about heaven, but because it reveals something deeper: a longing to understand purpose, hope, and our connection to those we love.

This fall, I would like to build a



sermon series around the questions you are carrying.

I'm not looking for questions designed to debate other people or win arguments. There are plenty of places we encounter that in our daily lives. Instead, I'm interested in the questions that arise from your own faith journey:

- *What do you struggle to understand?*
- *What have you always wondered about?*
- *What Scripture passage confuses you?*
- *What question have you been hesitant to ask?*
- *What keeps you awake at night?*
- *Where are you seeking God's wisdom?*

No question is too simple. No sincere question is unwelcome. The question you ask doesn't need to be written perfectly. Sometimes a sentence, a struggle, or a simple, "I've always wondered..." is enough.

Between now and August 31st, I invite you to send me your questions by email.

While I won't be able to answer every question in a sermon this fall, your questions will help shape our worship, our conversations, and our learning together in the coming year.

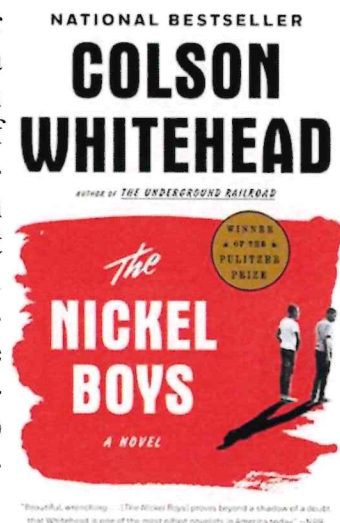


LAMS VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

QUALIFIED CHARITABLE DISTRIBUTION

Many seniors must take a Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) from their IRA or other retirement savings accounts. Income from your RMD is usually taxable, and may even push you into a higher tax bracket. However, you may be able reduce your tax liability by making a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) from all or part of your RMD. Calvary United Methodist Church is a qualified charity under these regulations. Many of our retired members take advantage of these tax rules by giving their tithes, offerings and/or pledges via a QCD from their retirement accounts.

A QCD can be a very tax-effective way to support Calvary. However, as with any financial and tax strategy, it's important to first understand the details and limitations. Qualified charitable distributions do *not* provide a charitable deduction for taxpayers, regardless of whether or not you itemize deductions.

Instead, with a QCD, a check is sent directly from your retirement account to the charity. This allows the donor to exclude the amount from taxable income. Depending on the circumstances, your QCD can be a win-win for both you and Calvary.

Each person's situation is different, so please consult your tax or financial professional to see if donating to Calvary via a QCD from your retirement savings makes sense for you, and how to go about setting up a QCD.

Summer Office Hours: During the months of June, July, and August, our Church Office will be open Monday through Thursday from 8 AM until 4:30 PM.

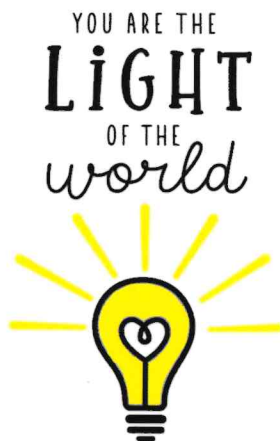

WOMEN'S RETREAT

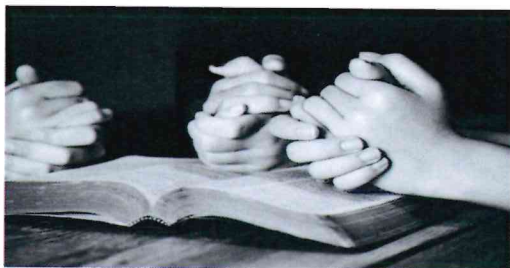
October 9th-11th at Kenbrook Bible Camp & Retreat Center in Lebanon

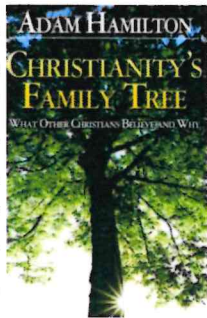
WIDOWS HEALING HEART GROUP

RECYCLING AT CALVARY

If you ever place recyclable items in our Recycling Dumpster, please be sure to read this notice:

Reminder! NO plastic bags may be placed in Calvary's Recycling Dumpster. There are fines from the recycling site where our trash haulers deliver our recyclables which our hauler will pass on to the church if plastic bags are in the container. There are cameras on the trucks to monitor what is in our container and we will be fined \$165 if there are plastic bags, even just one.

If you are taking recyclables out to the dumpster you must place the items so that they are loose in the dumpster and not within a plastic bag. Allowable recyclables are: newspaper, cardboard (boxes must be broken down), glass jars or bottles, aluminum & tin cans, hard plastic bottles, jugs & jars (#'s 1, 2 or 5 only). 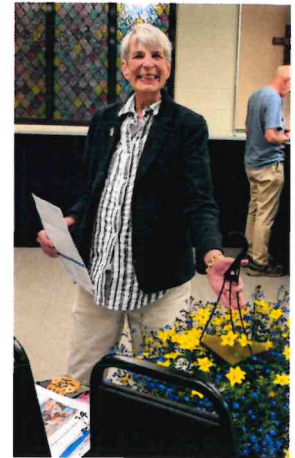
