Camp Huron Update

Dear Holy Trinity Family, Camp Huron's 2026 season begins this Sunday, the 4th of July. Giving thanks to you the parishioners of Holy Trinity for your generosity of spirit and donations that are allowing Holy Trinity to sponsor ten young people for a week each at Camp Huron, five from Anne Hathaway PS here in Stratford and another five from Hillside PS at Kettle and Stony Point. All campers are given a sleeping bag and a backpack filled with camp essentials. You also have made it possible for Holy Trinity to sponsor two young people for the LIT, Leadership-in-Training, a two-week program.

One of the LIT's is a lad known to you, Nolan Bressette from Kettle and Stony Point. We first sponsored Nolan as a camper. The Reverend Gerry Adam identified Nolan as being a leader and a candidate for the LIT program. I asked his mother if Nolan would be interested and the answer was a resounding, "yes". Some of you may remember 'meeting' Nolan. With the help of his mother he produced a video of his experiences and what camp meant to him that was shown at an Outreach lunch for Camp Huron. Nolan's journey at Camp Huron is rather like the Circle of Life.

Every Saturday for the next six weeks I attend the 10am Eucharist at Camp Huron, it is a wonderful, joyful, interactive, youth-centered Eucharist unlike anything you have ever experienced. I invite you to join me. Camp Huron is on the Huron shore immediately south of Bayfield, accessed off of Highway 21.

After camp you might want to shop at Zehrs Mennonite Country Market, the red 'barn' on Highway 21 immediately north of the camp. It is famous for their baked goods, but their meat, pasture raised, and produce are also worthy of a stop. You also might want to venture into Bayfield, lunch and a browse through galleries and shops could make for a full day on the Huron shore.
