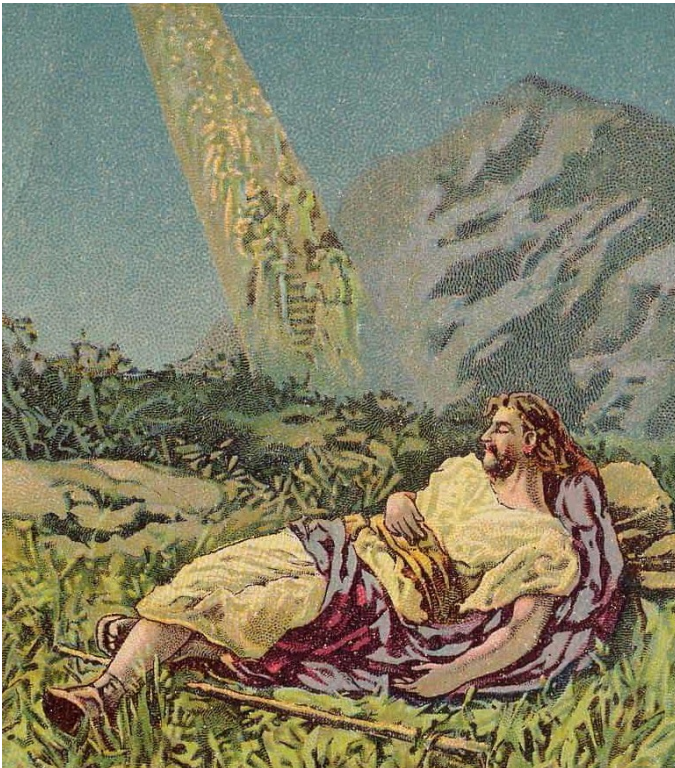

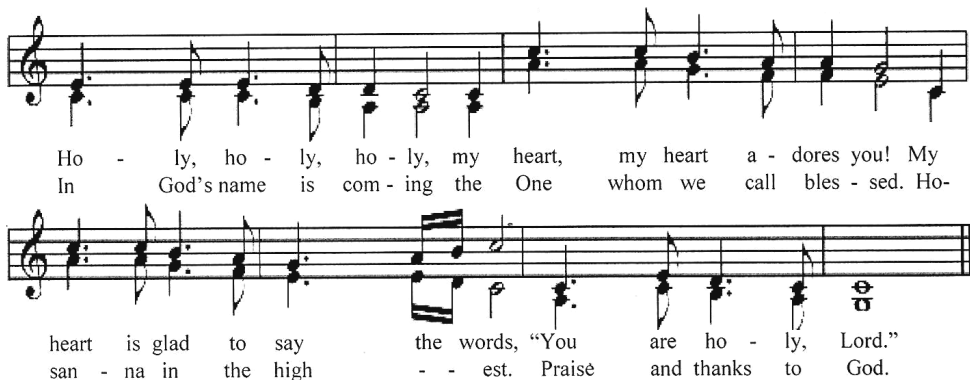

For the Beauty of the Earth - John Rutters music, coupled with the words of this hymn are so uplifting! They affirm our gratitude for where we live.

What Does the Lord Require of Thee (Micah 6:8) - This song, taken from Micah 6, has been instrumental in conversations in our home for years. Its simplicity/complexity has always intrigued us.

Oh, Love that Will Not Let Me Go - Both of us find this hymn in tune and words to be an affirmation of our hearts.

Spirit of Gentleness - A seemingly chaotic world needs moments of gentleness.

Create in Me a Clean Heart - This a song that we often shared with our students in a college where we taught when we lived in Indonesia.

Refiner's Fire - Two powerful words: one that celebrates simplicity over time and, the other, a force that demands action.

You Who Dwell in the Shelter of the Lord (aka On Eagle's Wings) - In 1980, David became mysteriously quite ill. This song was a mainstay for our family and became a celebratory declaration when he recovered.

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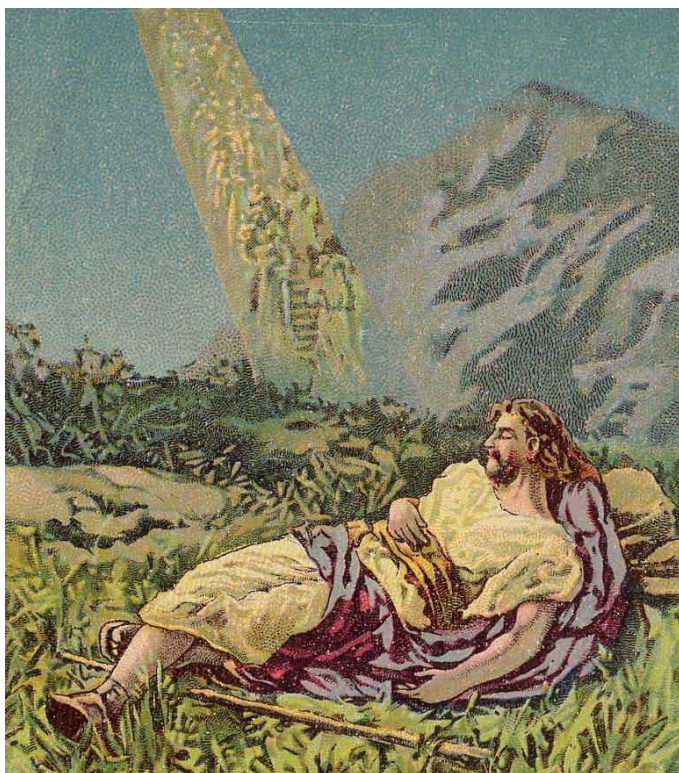
