Dear Pastors and Praying Friends,

We are thankful for your continued prayer and support for the ministry here in Thailand. God has been blessing, as we have seen Thai, Akha and Burmese people saved and baptized. Even though we have been very busy and the ministry can be over whelming with the harvest so great and the labourers so few... Luke 10:2. I'm reminded of the prayer request that Jesus gave at the end of that verse where He says, "Pray ye therefore the lord of the harvest, that he would send forth labourers into his harvest." This has been my prayer, that God would send help. Until then we will continue to do what God has called us to do.

The war in the middle east has had an effect in Thailand. Fuel supplies have been affected, leading to long gas lines, and several plane flights have been cancelled or delayed. While these challenges have created some inconvenience, we are thankful that the Lord continues to provide and allows the ministry to move forward.

It's exciting to share the progress regarding the new training center on the border of Thailand and Myanmar. The wall around the property has been completed and truck loads of dirt have been delivered to bring the property to an elevation to eliminate flooding. At this time, we are waiting the final approval of the village authorities to begin construction on the building. We are looking forward to continuing to train Thai and Burmese men to preach and plant churches. We believe this is the biblical way, as even Jesus trained others, knowing that He would not be with them forever.

Across the border in Myanmar, Pastor Moses at Living Stones Baptist Church is doing well. They have seen people saved, baptized, and church growth. He is getting married in October. We are praying with him about the possibility of turning the ministry over to another leader and, after his marriage, coming over to Thailand and taking over as pastor of Blessing House Baptist Church where Pastor Worachai is the pastor now. The church is a combination of Thai and Akha people of which he knows both languages. Another option would be to start another church at the training center property and use the building there to plant Amazing Grace Baptist Church.

On a personal note, Susan and I recently celebrated our 40th wedding anniversary with a short trip to Krabi Island in southern Thailand. I thank the Lord for the wife that He has given me. Susan has been a wonderful blessing both in my life and in the ministry. I'm grateful for the many years that we have been able to serve the Lord together.
