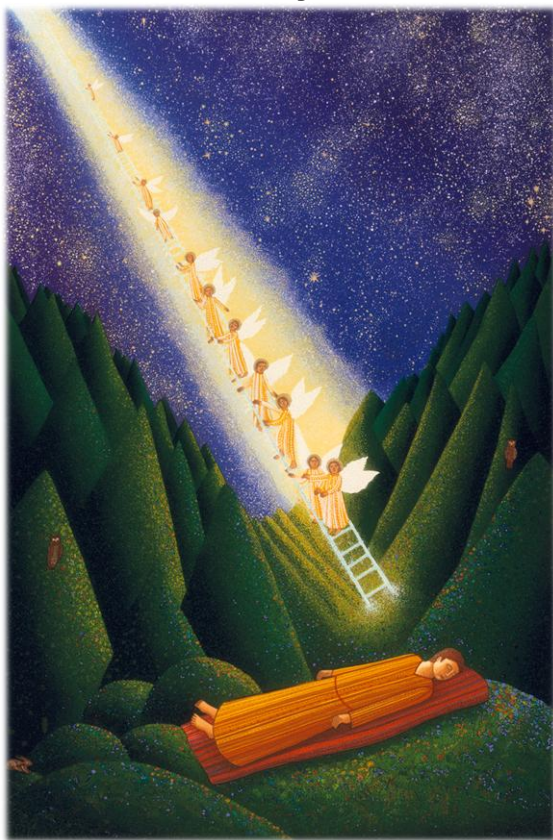

Music Ministry Discernment Task Force

In each weekly bulletin during the months of July and August, we will include a short article about the Music Ministry Discernment process. Hopefully this will keep you up-to-date on the progress of the Task Force and the plans that are being made to find a new Music Director.

What are the Task Force's first assignments? Over the next 4 weeks, members of the Task Force will be trying to accumulate as much pertinent information as possible so we can create a meaningful Music Ministry Discernment Survey. This will mean that individual members will be contacting various groups and people.

Those groups who are outside our Parish are:

- Diocese – To find out all the legal requirements for the hiring of a new Music Director. This will include finding out more about hours worked, benefits packages which become mandatory with various weekly hours of employment, etc.
- Other local churches – To gain comparative information about their job descriptions, wages, etc.
- RCCO and National Church – To find out what an honest annual wage scale should be, depending upon qualifications and weekly hours worked. These scales will be used as a guideline only.
- Local schools and organisations – To ascertain if there is a need in our community, which is not being met at present. This could include choirs, instrumental groups, or other possible “latchkey” activities pertaining to music and the arts.

Next week I will give a summary of the contacts the Task Force will make within our Parish.
