1 Kings 8:57-61 TLB

[57] May **the** Lord our God be with us as he was with our fathers; may he never forsake us. [58] May he give us **the** desire to do his will in everything, and to obey all **the** commandments and instructions he has given our ancestors. [59] And may **these words** of my **prayer** be constantly before him day and night, so that he helps me and all of Israel in accordance with our daily needs. [60] May people all over **the** earth know that **the** Lord is God and that **there** is no other god at all. [61] O my people, may you live good and perfect lives before **the** Lord our God; may you always obey his laws and commandments, just as you are doing today."

2 Kings 19:3-6 AMP

[3] **They** said to him, "Thus says Hezekiah, 'This is a day of distress and anxiety, of punishment and humiliation; for children have come to [**the** time of **their**] birth and **there** is no strength to rescue **them**. [4] It may be that **the** LORD your God will hear all **the words** of **the** Rabshakeh, whom his master **the** king of Assyria has sent to taunt and defy **the** living God, and will rebuke **the words** which **the** LORD your God has heard. So offer a **prayer** for **the** remnant [of His people] that is left [in Judah].'" [5] So **the** servants of King Hezekiah came to Isaiah. [6] Isaiah said to **them**, "Say this to your master: 'Thus says **the** LORD, "Do not be afraid because of **the words** that you have heard, with which **the** servants of **the** king of Assyria have reviled (blasphemed) Me."

2 Kings 19:18-22 AMP

[18] and have thrown **their** gods into **the** fire, for **they** were not [real] gods but [only] **the** work of men's hands, wood and stone. So **they** [could destroy **them** and] have destroyed **them**. [19] Now, O LORD our God, please, save us from his hand so that all **the** kingdoms of **the** earth may know [without any doubt] that You alone, O LORD, are God." [20] **Then** Isaiah **the** son of Amoz sent **word** to Hezekiah, saying, "Thus says **the** LORD, **the** God of Israel: 'I have heard your **prayer** to Me regarding Sennacherib king of Assyria.' [21] This is **the word** that **the** LORD has spoken against him: '**The** virgin daughter of Zion Has despised you and mocked you; **The** daughter of Jerusalem Has shaken her head behind you! [22] Whom have you taunted and blasphemed? Against whom have you raised your voice, And haughtily lifted up your eyes? Against **the** Holy One of Israel!

2 Chronicles 33:16-19 AMP

[16] **Then** he set up **the** altar of **the** LORD and sacrificed peace offerings and thank offerings on it; and he ordered Judah to serve **the** LORD God of Israel. [17] Yet **the**

people still sacrificed on **the** high places, but only to **the** LORD **their** God. [18] Now **the** rest of **the** acts of Manasseh, and his **prayer** to his God, and **the words** of **the** seers who spoke to him in **the** name of **the** LORD God of Israel, behold, **they** are among **the** records of **the** kings of Israel. [19] His **prayer** also and how God heard him, and all his sin, his unfaithfulness, and **the** sites on which he built high places and set up **the** Asherim and **the** carved images, before he humbled himself, behold, **they** are written in **the** records of **the** Hozai.

Psalms 27:6-10 AMP

[6] And now my head will be lifted up above my enemies around me, In His tent I will offer sacrifices with shouts of joy; I will sing, yes, I will sing praises to **the** LORD. [7] Hear, O LORD, when I cry aloud; Be gracious and compassionate to me and answer me. [8] When You said, "Seek My face [in **prayer**, require My presence as your greatest need]," my heart said to You, "Your face, O LORD, I will seek [on **the** authority of Your **word**]." [9] Do not hide Your face from me, Do not turn Your servant away in anger; You have been my help; Do not abandon me nor leave me, O God of my salvation! [10] Although my father and my mother have abandoned me, Yet **the** LORD will take me up [adopt me as His child].

Psalms 54:1-4 AMP

[1] Save me, O God, by Your name; And vindicate me by Your [wondrous] power. [2] Hear my **prayer**, O God; Listen to **the words** of my mouth. [3] For strangers have risen against me And violent men have sought my life; **They** have not set God before **them**. Selah. [4] Behold, God is my helper and ally; **The** Lord is **the** sustainer of my soul [my upholder].

Isaiah 37:2-6 AMP

[2] **Then** he sent Eliakim, who was in charge of **the** [royal] household, and Shebna **the** scribe, and **the** elders of **the** priests, covered with sackcloth, to Isaiah **the** prophet, **the** son of Amoz. [3] **They** said to him, "This is what Hezekiah says, 'This day is a day of distress, rebuke and disgrace; for children have come to birth, and **there** is no strength to deliver **them**. [4] It may be that **the** LORD your God will hear **the words** of **the** Rabshakeh [**the** commander], whom his master **the** king of Assyria has sent to taunt and defy **the** living God, and will avenge **the words** which **the** LORD your God has heard. **Therefore**, offer a **prayer** for **the** remnant [of His people] that is left.'" [5] So **the** servants of King Hezekiah came to Isaiah. [6] Isaiah said to **them**, "You shall say **the** following to your master: 'This is what **the** LORD says, "Do not be afraid because of **the words** that you have heard, with which **the** servants of **the** king of Assyria have blasphemed Me.

Jeremiah 42:6-9 AMP

[6] Whether it is pleasant or unpleasant, we will listen to and honor **the** voice of **the** LORD our God to whom we are sending you, so that it may go well with us when we listen to **the** voice of **the** LORD our God.” [7] Now after ten days [of **prayer**] had passed **the word** of **the** LORD came to Jeremiah. [8] **Then** he called for Johanan **the** son of Kareah and all **the** commanders of **the** forces that were with him and all **the** people from **the** least to **the** greatest, [9] and said to **them**, “Thus says **the** LORD, **the** God of Israel, to whom you sent me to present your petition before Him:

Acts 6:2-5 AMP

[2] So **the** Twelve called **the** disciples together and said, “It is not appropriate for us to neglect [teaching] **the word** of God in order to serve tables and manage **the** distribution of food. [3] **Therefore**, brothers, choose from among you seven men with good reputations [men of godly character and moral integrity], full of **the** Spirit and of wisdom, whom we may put in charge of this task. [4] But we will [continue to] devote ourselves [steadfastly] to **prayer** and to **the** ministry of **the word**.” [5] **The** suggestion pleased **the** whole congregation; and **they** selected Stephen, a man full of faith [in Christ Jesus], and [filled with and led by] **the** Holy Spirit, and Philip, Prochorus, Nicanor, Timon, Parmenas, and Nicolas (Nikolaos), a proselyte (Gentile convert) from Antioch.

Romans 8:24-28 AMP

[24] For in this hope we were saved [by faith]. But hope [**the** object of] which is seen is not hope. For who hopes for what he already sees? [25] But if we hope for what we do not see, we wait eagerly for it with patience and composure. [26] In **the** same way **the** Spirit [comes to us and] helps us in our weakness. We do not know what **prayer** to offer or how to offer it as we should, but **the** Spirit Himself [knows our need and at **the** right time] intercedes on our behalf with sighs and groanings too deep for **words**. [27] And He who searches **the** hearts knows what **the** mind of **the** Spirit is, because **the** Spirit intercedes [before God] on behalf of God’s people in accordance with God’s will. [28] And we know [with great confidence] that God [who is deeply concerned about us] causes all things to work together [as a plan] for good for those who love God, to those who are called according to His plan and purpose.

1 Timothy 4:3-6 AMP

[3] who forbid marriage and advocate abstaining from [certain kinds of] foods which God has created to be gratefully shared by those who believe and have [a clear] knowledge of **the** truth. [4] For everything God has created is good, and nothing is to be rejected if it is received with gratitude; [5] for it is sanctified [set apart, dedicated to God] by means of **the word** of God and **prayer**. [6] If you point out **these** instructions

to **the** brothers and sisters, you will be a good servant of Christ Jesus, constantly nourished [through study] on **the words** of **the** faith and of **the** good [Christian] doctrine which you have closely followed.
