Building Project Update

The main entry project is moving along, although somewhat slower than we anticipated. That is the result of several issues that came to light during the demolition of the steps. These issues have been resolved and we are moving forward. The current heat wave has become an issue. They cannot pour concrete during high temperatures because it affects the curing process of the concrete. It seems likely that completion of the project will go beyond our projected target of the end of July. However, we want the project to be done right so the delays are acceptable. Two items we continue to work on are the replacement steps to the kitchen door when we remove the ramp and the replacement of the cap stones on the walls of the steps and the ramp. The cap stones have deteriorated over the years and need to be replaced and the stairs that were removed for the temporary ramp were in very bad shape so we may have to build new ones.

Matthew 5:13-7:29

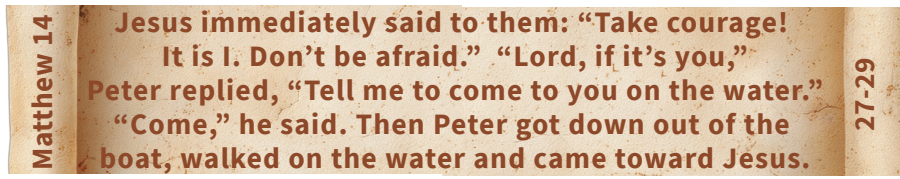


This month I am doing something different with this section. Throughout the summer we have been exploring the beatitudes found in Matthew 5. As we have explored those, we have uncovered who has the heart of our God. As this is the beginning to the sermon on the mount, one of Jesus' biggest times of teaching recorded in scripture, it sets the tone for the entire rest of the sermon. So, what I want you to do is read the sermon on the mount in parts. And before you read each section, I want you to re-read the beatitudes, to view the teachings through those lenses. You can find a book on the sermon of the mount to help guide you if you would like, but the important piece is to dive into the sermon on the mount. The sections (all in the gospel of Matthew) are Matthew 5: 1-12 (beatitudes so read this before each section): **section 1:** 5:13-16, **section 2:** 5:17-20, **section 3:** 5:21-26, **section 4:** 5:27-37, **section 5:** 5:38-48, **section 6:** 6:1-18, **section 7:** 6:19-34, **section 8:** 7:1-6, **section 9:** 7:7-14, **section 10:** 7:15-23, **section 11:** 7:24-29. I hope you get the chance to further explore the sermon on the mount this month.

When The Storms Come

Devotional By Rose Dessinger

Read: Matthew 14:22-36



So often we wonder where God is in the midst of our life's storms. When life become increasingly more difficult with each passing day, we cry out, "God, where are you?"

Most sermons preached on today's story concentrate on Peter. "Try harder. Have more faith. Be braver. Step out of the boat." But when you look deeper, something more important springs forth. This story isn't primarily about Peter. While Peter is a depiction of all of us, this is more about how we should trust Jesus in the midst of our storm. Let's look closer to see why.

You see, Jesus had just finished caring for needs by performing the miracle of feeding 5000 people 5 loaves of bread and two fish one evening. Afterwards, he immediately told the disciples to get into a boat and go to the other side. He then delayed joining them by going up on the mountainside by himself to pray. While it's entirely possible that he sent them away so he could be alone with his Father for a while (which we should all emulate), we also should notice that Jesus was waiting for the perfect timing. He knew that a storm was coming, yet he told them to go ahead of him. It wasn't until just before dawn before he decided to join them by walking to them on water. Jesus waits for the best moments to demonstrate exactly who he is. Just like when Jesus waited FOUR days before resurrecting Lazarus from the tomb.

This time, he waited until the storm came. When the waves were crashing against the boat and the disciples were terrified. That's when they saw him walking on the lake towards them. They cried out in fear. They thought he was a ghost.

But Jesus immediately said to them: "Take courage! It is I. Don't be afraid." This wasn't a rebuke. This was encouragement that it was him. They were safe. In the original language, His words echo the divine name of God Himself. "I AM."

Think about that. They were in the storm because Jesus put them there. They were exactly where he *wanted* them. And the very thing threatening the disciples was *beneath His feet*.

The storm that felt overwhelming to them was under complete authority to Him.

While they were terrified and wondering where God was, Jesus said, "I'm right here".

Jesus did not remove the waves before approaching them. He walked on top of them.

And maybe that is one of the greatest revelations in the entire story. Jesus is not intimidated by what terrifies you. The One standing above the storm was not merely a teacher or prophet. The great "I AM" was there with them. It was God in the flesh, standing on chaos as though it were solid ground. How did Peter respond? He asked Jesus to command him to join him out on the water.

"Come," he said.

At first, it all went well. As long as Peter focused his attention on Jesus instead of the wind, he walk on water. But when he became afraid, his doubt caused him to start sinking. Peter cried out in fear. "*Immediately* Jesus reached out his hand and caught him."

Then they climbed into the boat and the wind died down. Did you see that? *Immediately*. That's how it is for us too. Not when we steady ourselves. Not when we learn our lesson. Not when we "do it ourselves."

He doesn't wait for us to become fearless. He reaches out when we cry out to him. When we seek him and focus our attention back on him. When we trust him to save us. That is grace.

Even when our faith trembles, His grip remains steady.

And then Scripture says something beautiful. Jesus stepped into the boat and the storm stopped. Peace is found in the presence of Christ.

Jesus sent his disciples out into the boat without him... knowing the storm was about to hit. He waited all night before joining them. When he got into the boat, the wind died down. This tells us something very important about God. He knows our storms are coming. He has a plan. But he's waiting for the perfect time to act. If he moved too early, we'd miss seeing God at work. You won't see how much you need him or even why. We tend to think we have it all handled on our own and then miss seeing what he was planning to do for us all along. Too late and disaster strikes.

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This story was meant to give believers courage in our own storms by revealing the One who can stand above anything threatening them. We can trust the Savior who came to rescue us.

In the end, it was never really about Peter's bravery. Yes...we are called to trust in our Savior. Yet the finished work of Jesus means believers do not live held together by perfect faith. They live held together by a perfect Savior. Storms still come. Fear still rises. Weakness still happens. But Jesus still walks toward His people in the middle of all of it. All we have to do is trust the One who has everything in His perfect control. Because storms and hardships continue in our lives. Yes... even a Christian's life. It is guaranteed. And they won't always end the way we desire or hope for. Scripture tells us we can trust that God has a perfect plan for that too. And maybe someone reading this needs to remember today:

The storm around you does not mean Jesus is absent. The waves may feel strong. The wind may feel relentless. But the One who stands above the storm is already coming near. Those storms still obey him.

You are not saved by the strength of your grip on Him. You are saved by the strength of His grip on you. Now **THAT** is good news! Amen.
