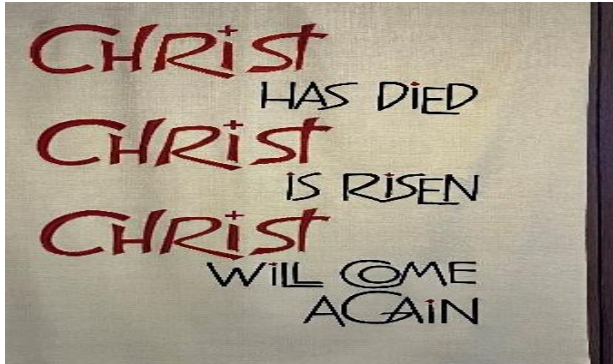

To date, our church has given so much food for other families this summer! Thank you to everyone who has donated food, \$\$\$\$\$, time, and prayers.

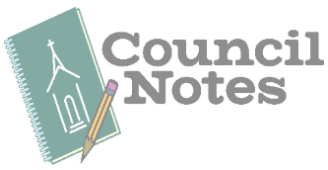

July 2026 Property Committee Meeting-7/14/26

Discussion:

- ..A sinkhole developed in the church parking lot. After consulting with the City of Menomonie Water Department and Halverson Plumbing it was determined the hole was natural and not caused by a water pipe leak. A Contractor dug in the area and discovered an old cistern..bricks and drain pipes from an old house. The area will need to settle before paving or cementing can take place.
- ..The carpet on a few of the main entry steps has loosened. The discussion centered around replacing all of the carpet in the narthex, offices, and communion room. All of the carpets are between 25 and 50 years old. Bids will be requested from three local businesses. Funding would come from the Building and Cemetery Fund.
- ..The new "bat control" company visited the church. They purchased the company PLC was using. They are to submit a report on any further work that would need to be done to eliminate the bat problem.
- ..All Star mobility was contacted about installing a stair lift into the choir rehearsal room. They have not set up an appointment after 3 weeks and mentioned they are busy. We may need to contact another firm.

Completed:

- The estimate to replace the emergency phone in the elevator is \$4,417. The Council approved the project and a contract was signed. Funding would come from the Building and Cemetery Fund.
- ..An article will be written for the "Messenger" regarding the PLC Cemetery Policies and Guidelines.

..A custom made oak cabinet, countertop, sink, faucet, were installed in the communion room. The bid was for \$3,500 but the final invoice was \$2,600. The workmanship was excellent by Tim Frank.



We get lots of questions about Peace Lutheran Church Cemetery. Many of these questions concern decorating graves and headstones. The "posted rules" displayed at the cemetery are below.

Rules for Peace Lutheran Cemetery

- -All arrangements must be maintained above ground in a planter. All must be removed by October 15.
- -No in ground or on the ground decorations.
- -Planting is prohibited. Absolutely no planting flowers, shrubs, trees, or bushes.
- -No lawn ornaments, solar lights, or similar decorations are allowed.
- -Anything unsightly or disrespectful will be removed.
- -Non-conforming items will be placed near the maintenance building.
- -Permission must be obtained before remains or cremains can be buried.
- -Permission must be obtained before placing a monument or marker of any kind.
- -Questions should be directed to the church office at 715-235-2500

Owned lots at the cemetery are the owner's personal property. Headstones are also the personal property of the owner. Large headstones may shift from their sheer size and weight. It is the owner's responsibility to maintain the headstone. The same companies that install headstones can also be hired to upright or fix headstones. Homeowner's insurance may cover the cost of fixing headstones. Peace Lutheran Church via the Cemetery Committee fixes headstones when no family can be found and the headstones are dangerous to visitors or volunteers working at the cemetery. Contractors are hired and the money comes from the Cemetery Improvement Fund.

The church office has a booklet regarding the cemetery. It is given to people when they buy a plot at the cemetery. It is available upon request if there are further questions.

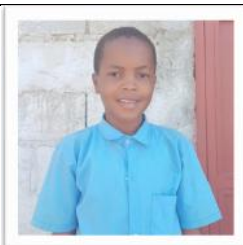
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Peace Lutheran Church is sponsoring 12 students in Haiti giving them the gift of an education and opportunity to choose to do good in this world!.

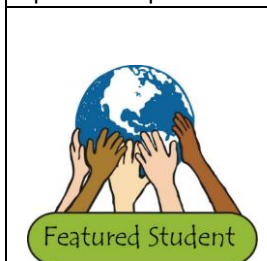
Willy Edmond
