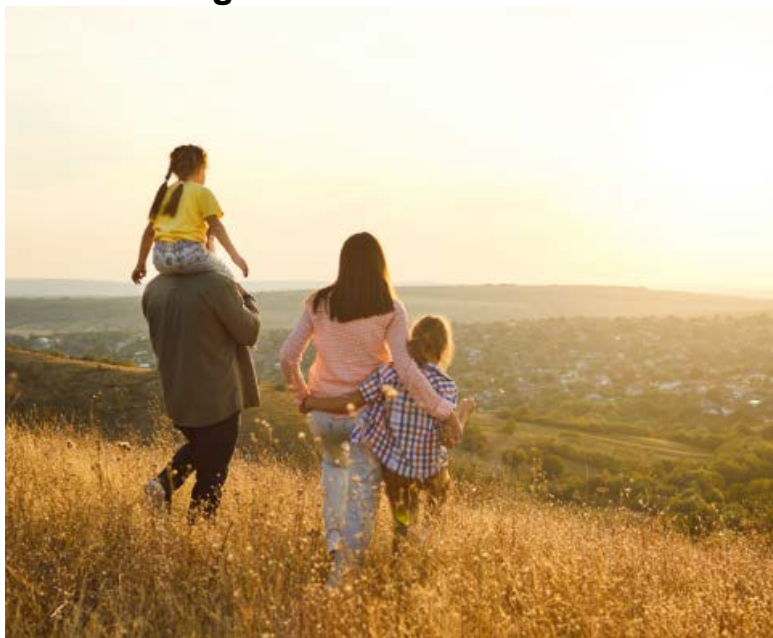

Breathtaking Moments



Have you ever visited someplace that just took your breath away? Perhaps you were standing at the rim of the Grand Canyon or overlooking Crater Lake. Maybe you were watching the sun set over the Pacific Ocean or enjoying the moon rise over the Mojave Desert. Our world is filled with amazing examples of God's majesty. Every time we see one of these natural wonders, we are reminded of His glory. Sometimes, the things that cause us to experience wonder and awe were created by man.

Painters fill canvases with colorful images. Sculptors carve stone to look almost lifelike. Architects play with light and shapes to produce buildings that seem to defy engineering principles.

Wonder-filled Opportunities

But what does it take to experience the wonder of worship? The various elements of worship provide opportunities for wonder.

- **Setting:** Whether a simple wood-frame country church or a soaring Gothic cathedral, the place where we gather for worship can inspire awe and wonder. The architectural style and other elements work together to enhance the worship experience.

- **Music:** Congregations join in singing hymns for every worship service. Help your children listen for familiar melodies or words. Guide children to listen carefully to special arrangements played by musicians or sung by choirs. Celebrate the gift of music in your congregation.
- **Visual Arts:** Study the various visual images in your church sanctuary: banners, stained glass, and other elements designed to enhance the worship experience. Help your children understand the symbolism and celebrate the visual wonders of worship.
- **Preaching:** Children sometimes have difficulty understanding the spoken message in worship. Help them focus by assigning phrases or words they should listen for in the pastor's sermon. Provide a notepad and pencil for them to mark each time they hear the phrase. God's Word works in our hearts—certainly a truth that gives us wonder and awe!
- **Community:** Celebrate the community in your congregation; help your children find favorite adults and friends who make worship special. Consider how these relationships enhance the worship experience for your whole family.

Enrich Understanding

Helping your child experience the wonder of worship will enrich their understanding of the service and how they can participate. The *Words of Worship* program will continue to provide resources for your family as you explore the wonder of worship.
