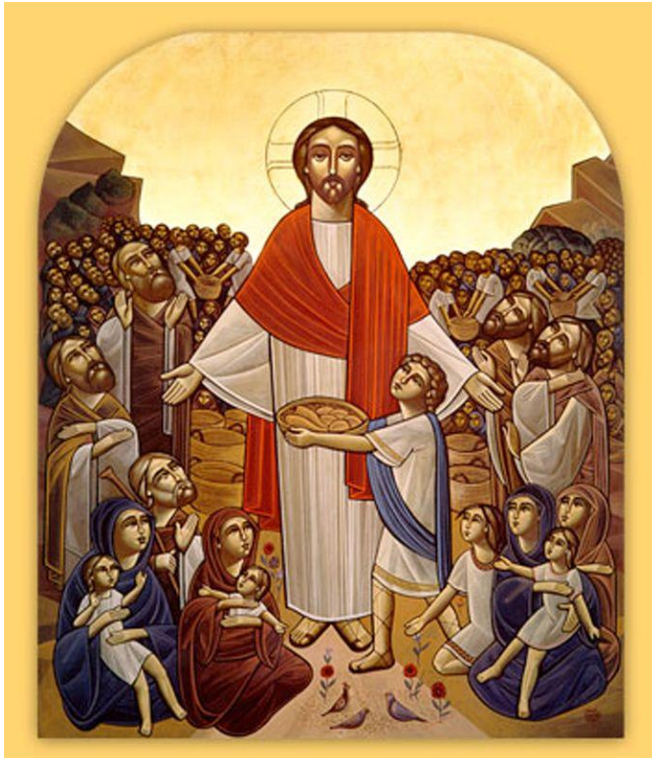

Priest: May God be with you.

Priest: Lift up your hearts.

All: We lift them to the Lord.

Priest: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

All: It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Priest: It is indeed right,
it is our duty and our joy,
at all times and in all places
to give you thanks and praise,
holy Father, heavenly King,
almighty and eternal God,
through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord.

And now we give you thanks because,
after his most glorious resurrection,
he appeared to his disciples,
and in their sight
ascended into heaven to prepare a place for us;
that where he is, thither we might also ascend,
and reign with him in glory.
Therefore with angels and archangels,
and with all the company of heaven,
we proclaim your great and glorious name,
for ever praising you and *singing*:

Priest: Accept our praises, heavenly Father,
through your Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ,
and as we follow his example and obey his command,
grant that by the power of your Holy Spirit
these gifts of bread and wine
may be to us his body and his blood;
who, in the same night that he was betrayed,
took bread and gave you thanks;

he broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying:
Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you;
do this in remembrance of me.

In the same way, after supper
he took the cup and gave you thanks;
he gave it to them, saying:
Drink this, all of you;
this is my blood of the new covenant,
which is shed for you and for many
for the forgiveness of sins.
Do this, as often as you drink it,
in remembrance of me.

Therefore, heavenly Father,
we remember his offering of himself
made once for all upon the cross;
we proclaim his mighty resurrection
and glorious ascension;
we look for the coming of your kingdom,
and with this bread and this cup
we make the memorial of Christ your Son our Lord.

Music Ministry Discernment Task Force

The Task Force** has been very busy creating, refining, and finalizing a survey which will be available to the Parish. They have spent many hours researching and then writing this document. Besides the time each member spent individually, we have held 3 – 75 Minute Zoom calls where we have edited, discussed, and reedited, and finally have come to a consensus on the document which will be presented to you.

The Music Ministry Discernment Survey will be available in both hard copies and online. The hard copies will be available following the 10.00 am services on 9 and 16 August; and will be online beginning 9 August. The deadline for completed surveys will be 31 August. Hard copies may be dropped off in the church in a box at the rear of the sanctuary or at the church office.

The survey is 4 pages long and should take approximately 15 – 20 minutes to complete, however you may need to add some discernment time to this. We believe that the survey will help the Task Force create a realistic, meaningful Job Description which will hopefully attract several interested and qualified candidates.

Next week's bulletin insert will briefly outline some of the material which is in the survey to help you in preparing to complete yours. At the 10.00 am service on the 9 August, our former Interim Music Director, Alan Whitmore, will be speaking to us instead of a homily by our Rector. Alan's theme will be "Music Ministry – what is it and why is it so important." Blessings and thank you for being part of this exciting and very necessary work to prepare to search for a new Music Director.
