AJUSCO MISSION

We continue to work wholeheartedly at the Ajusco mission. We have already begun evangelism efforts in the community on Saturdays. One group conducts evangelistic activities for children, while others go out to share the Gospel in homes and on the streets. God is giving us many opportunities to share the Gospel and make initial contact with many people. Please pray that the Spirit performs a regenerating work in their hearts.

We are also taking the opportunity to offer music lessons; one of our teenagers, 14-year-old Gael, is our first student. Together with his parents (Javier and Natalia) and his sister (Sofia)—who is learning to play the keyboard—they are the first family that God has brought to the mission for His glory. We are working with them on the fundamentals of the Christian faith.

We are happy to serve in this community. God is granting us the grace and provision to travel and stay at the church building on weekends (Friday through Sunday). Please pray for future plans to expand the church facilities—including classrooms, rooms, and a kitchen—which are so necessary for the full development of the ministry. We have started a "small project"—though one that is very necessary and important—to provide a place for the children to attend their classes. Until now, we had been using a collapsible tent. The project involves creating an "open classroom"—essentially just a roof and a floor where we can minister to the children. Nearly half the work is already done, including the reinforced concrete columns and part of the wall, at a cost of \$700.00. All that remains is the metal structure and roofing sheets, which will cost \$885.00. We thank God that the believers are enthusiastic and are supporting these new initiatives for the growth and advancement of the Gospel.

We ask for your prayers that God will provide not only the funds for material needs but also the wisdom to lead the Lord's church with intelligence and Christian maturity. We will soon be starting Sunday school for adults, as well as other ministries aimed at grounding the believers in the knowledge of and devotion to the Lord.

Mission Trip to Panama

In June, we traveled to Panama to support an evangelistic medical outreach and a children's Bible school. For the first time, the GPA Missions team served 1,085 people, filled 1,808 prescriptions, and treated 189 dental patients. Most importantly, all of them heard the Gospel, and 17 adults made a profession of faith.

Additionally, Bible schools were held in Barranco Adentro, Boin Boto, and Puente Blanco—communities of the indigenous Ngöbe people. We also had the opportunity to give presentations at public schools in Puente Blanco and Sansan Puente; in total, we reached over 1,000 children with the glorious Gospel of Jesus Christ, and approximately 45 of them were saved. We are grateful to every brother and ministry that participated and made this type of mission trip possible in vulnerable areas for the advancement of the Gospel. Please pray for the immense task ahead for Brother César and the team in Barranco Adentro and Boin Boto, as well as for God's work throughout this indigenous region.
