I. The Altar and the Anger (10-20)

When confrontation is received with humility, and responded to honestly, there is opportunity to restore unity.

Helping others walk with Jesus is handling conflict with grace!

Application Questions - These questions are provided for your further study and application of the subject of today's message. 1. Read Joshua 22:10-20. Why were the 9 ½ Israelite tribes on the westside of the Jordan upset?

Give examples of things that should upset us as believers today, and why.

2. List what the western 9 ½ tribes did, and the references showing it, that was the right thing to do.

Give an example or two of situations you are or have faced, in which the example of the western tribes is helpful and explain why it's helpful.

3. Read Joshua 22:21-34. Why was the response of the western tribes good?

Give an example of a situation in which you confronted someone and it went well, or not so well. What were the results and why were they the outcome?

4. List what was good, and the verse references, about the way the eastern tribes received the confrontation.

Give an example of someone confronting you and your response. What was the result, and why?

5. Confronting others and being confronted are hard situations. How is it helpful to reflect on Christ Jesus?
