God's time is not our time...(that is a good thing)

Hello again,

As we age, it seems that time speeds up! How precious is time. Further. As we mature in the faith and grow closer to God, we become more aware that God's time is not our time. He seems to work on a different clock than we do. Slow and steady seems to be God's way. When we look at the Scriptures, we find a ton of evidence to support this.

In the Old Testament, Jeremiah's contemporary name Habakkuk wondered openly how long it would take for God take action and draw His people back. Then there is Elijah, who feared for his life and ran away into the desert...only to be revived by God after 3-4 months.

Examples abound in the New Testament as well. Nicodemus, one of the Pharisees, visits Jesus one night and discusses the things of God. Nicodemus did not change quickly; it was another three years. The disciples themselves did not quickly catch on. After three years of intense training in close quarters with Jesus, still some doubted.

There are also instances where people had been suffering for decades with diseases and struggles. There is a woman who suffered for 12 years under the care of many doctors. Then, there is a man who had been crippled for 38 years and had been waiting by the side of a healing pool. In both cases, Jesus touched them and they were healed.

The common thread throughout all the examples is time...God takes His time. There seems to be a purpose in God's time. If we allow Him to, God works hard during that time, and He does a lot of work. The fruit that is produced from God's work in us is plentiful. He develops in us patience and endurance. He strengthens our wills and character. He ultimately draws close to us and reminds us of His tender care and love.

Are you in a place where you are wondering where God is...or what He is doing? Are you waiting for something? Have you asked God for something and are still waiting for an answer. Perhaps these circumstances can be an opportunity to allow God to develop in you His character...in His perfect time.
