Dear friends at Sand Lake Chapel,

Summer comes with the Memorial Day weekend. Yay! I like the warm weather and freedom from my teaching schedule. I hope that you have plans to make the weekend memorable. I was planning to picnic with my sister Renee, and Ethan and his young family, but I came down with a head cold and don't want to pass it on to others. So I have to stay home.

Actually, I'm thankful for life and for every day that God's grace is extended to me. I'm mindful of that since a friend and colleague from Chad died on Saturday from cancer. Tillie was the same age that I am. She was an intrepid pioneer church planter among the nomads of central Chad. No challenge was too great. No distance too far. No location too isolated. She was willing to brave it all with the hope that Jesus would be lifted up as Savior of the world and that some would be saved from sin. Now she is safely home in Glory where she rests from her labors.

I have no plans to travel this summer although I have to make a quick trip to Arkansas in early June to attend a board meeting. I'll fly. I serve on the board of a mission doing pastoral training in Southern Africa (ZEMA). ZEMA's ministry model is actually quite interesting. They do mobile Bible schools for training pastors and church leaders. Rather than maintain a campus with high overhead, the teachers travel to locations where pastors can come together for training once a month. The mission team and national colleagues are currently training nearly 3000 church leaders across Southern Africa in a four year program.

By the way, Chad remains closed to missionaries from the USA as a reciprocal response to America's visa restrictions for Chadians. This is proving to be stressful for teammates that consider their ministry as a career. Pray that the doors will open again in God's good time.

Thank you again for your gifts for my support. Each gift is greatly appreciated and highly valued in these challenging days. As I write to you this is Pentecost Sunday. In my Quiet Time I've been thinking about our Lord's prayer in John 17 where he concludes saying, "Righteous Father, though the world does not know you, I know you, and they know that you have sent me. I have made you known to them, and will continue to make you known in order that the love you have for me may be in them and that I myself may be in them." There's our mandate, to know Christ and to make him known. We have the Spirit of God in us to help us make that happen, clear up to the end of our days.

The Andersons developed a music program in church planting and evangelism teams, evangelism concerts, Bible school teaching, hymnal revision, workshops, and choral arranging. Dale spent many years at the Evangelical Church, the largest TEAM-related church in France. Dale and Sherry also served at the inner-city church in Vitrolles where he directed the group PRO-VERBE. In addition, they were involved in a church planting project in Annecy while Dale lived in Geneva.

After the Andersons retired in 2009, God led them to retire in France. Dale directed the inter-choir program for many years and was a global worker in prayer and social events. They also started a Senior group at the ABBA church and have continued to lead.

God used Dale's love and leadership in music to lead many a church choir, worship team, and music evangelism team that ministered with those who don't know Him. God used Dale to proclaim His praise in the sanctuaries of many a church and encourage.
