Together, we welcomed 147 campers between the two camps to Camp Moriah this summer, and we truly saw God move in powerful ways.

Junior Camp (76 campers)

- 22 made first-time decisions to accept Jesus Christ as their Savior
- 28 rededicated their lives to Christ
- 45 received the baptism of the Holy Ghost
- 31 felt they have been called in the ministry
- 36 experienced healing through the power of God

Senior Camp (71 campers)

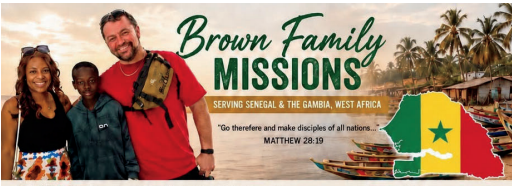
- 1 first time salvation
- 36 rededicated their lives to Christ
- 31 received the baptism of the Holy Spirit
- 13 received the initial evidence of speaking in tongues
- 14 felt they have been called into the ministry
- 26 experienced healing through the power of God

These numbers are more than statistics. They represent real student's sons and daughters of God who encountered Jesus, heard His voice, and left camp forever changed. Our prayer all week was that every camper would leave knowing that Christ isn't just part of their life He is their everything. We believe God answered that prayer in a beautiful way. The altars were full, worship was sincere, and His presence was unmistakable. We are confident the seeds planted this week will continue to grow as students return home and step back into their churches and youth groups.

• Annual: \$720-\$1,320 USD
RELIGION
• Muslims: 90%
• Christians: 9-10%
• Other beliefs: 1-2%
Most Christians are in Banjul, Serrekunda, and the surrounding Korofo region.

Through music, preaching, and leadership, Bishop Brown continues to encourage the Church and impact believers around the world.
