and their encounter with the Creator in this place goes before our own.

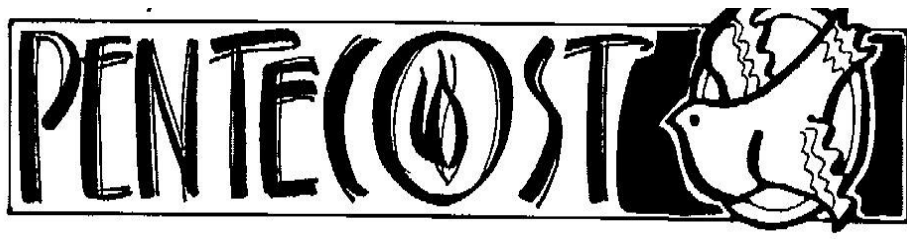

- **Ensemble Il Postiglione** — Weds, Aug 19th | Fulford Hall | 7:30 pm

Ensemble Il Postiglione takes its name from the postiglione – the stagecoach rider who signalled each arrival with a bright octave leap on the post horn, a gesture that Baroque composers loved to echo in their music.

That same spirited interval appears in Telemann's Il Postiglione Sonata, a nod to the lively, travelling-world energy that inspires the ensemble's identity.

Founded in Europe by harpsichordist Simone Pierini and recorder/traverso virtuoso Romeo Ciuffa, the ensemble has since performed across the globe. They are joined in concert by violinists Enrique Gómez Cabrero Fernández and Paul Luchkow, and soprano Anne Grimm. These world-class musicians have come together on Salt Spring to participate in Salt Spring Baroque's opera *Acis and Galatea*, and we are thrilled to have them perform this concert.

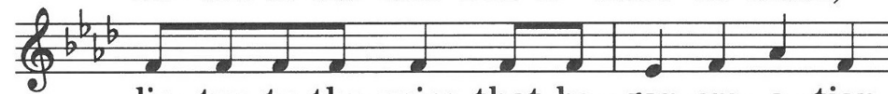
