

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ:

When you hear the word “transactional” what come to mind for you? How about when you hear the word “transformational?” Those two words have very different meanings. Now apply your understanding of those two terms to ministry.



Often in the church, we have a transactional view of ministry without even realizing it. If we institute a new program, what will the benefit of that program or activity be to our congregation? Will we draw in new people? Will our membership increase?

People outside the church also often view the church in transactional ways. If I give (my time, money, resources, etc.) to the church, they will expect something from me. Some people often look at their relationship with God as transactional as well. If I do this for God, then He will bless me. If I fail to do something for God, then He will punish me.

Our mindset needs to shift from transactional to TRANSFORMATIONAL in terms of the mission and ministry of the church. Transformational ministry fosters spiritual growth, builds deeper relationships, and leads to community engagement. Transformational ministry will have a longer lasting impact that will do more than just increase numbers within the church.

More people in the pews do not necessarily translate to more disciples in the church. A few months ago, the church intentionally created a discipleship plan. Let me remind you that a **disciple is a follower of Christ that grows in their love of God and love of neighbor**. In other words, we become more Christlike. By intentionally shifting to a transformational approach to ministry, we will be providing the tools and opportunities for all of us to grow in our discipleship.

When people around us (family, friends, neighbors) see the transformation that is occurring within us, they will be intrigued. Some may even want to know “the secret” of what has changed in our lives. And there may even be a few that want to experience that same kind of life-changing transformation.

Jesus’ life is the example of transformational ministry. Think of all the folks he encountered and how he transformed their lives by healing, teaching, feeding, forgiving, welcoming, and serving them.



Let us journey together in transforming our own path of discipleship and others as well.

Finance Committee

In keeping with our practice of providing financial information from the most recent Treasurer's Report at newsletter "press time", following is a condensed version of the report for month ending July 31, 2026.

Deposits to the General Fund totaled \$7,121.84 with the remaining \$2,066.63 donated for specific causes and ministries. Of the \$10,163.08 in expenditures, \$8,867.52 went to operating costs, utilities, payroll, etc., \$625.00 to WPAUMC for Connectional Apportionment, \$670.56 for VBS, Nurture, Witness and Red Bird Mission expenses. \$74.52 in Vanco donations intended for Trustees accounts were transferred. The Designated Funds total shown above includes monies raised for the upcoming Rise Against Hunger packaging event, the Mission Journey to Red Bird Mission, along with donations to Outreach, Nurture, and Witness Committees.

As you have probably noticed, operating costs for the month (\$8,867.54) were more than deposits to the General Fund (\$7,121.84). In spite of a positive working balance at the month end of June we still fell short of the sufficient funds to meet expenses and ended July with a negative balance of \$549.23, which is obviously not good! During summer months it is not unusual to see overall giving fall of somewhat but we have seen a larger than usual drop off in giving and General Fund donations in particular this year. This began in June carried into July and as of this writing it appears August donations will fall short of what is needed.

We are grateful for your generous support for our various missions and ministries and encourage you to support the areas that speak most to your heart. At the same time, our General Fund is the heartbeat of everything we do, keeps the church running day-to-day, bills paid and makes all of our ministries possible. As you prayerfully consider your giving, please prioritize your support for our General Fund.

Connectional Apportionment:

Our apportionment for 2026 is \$18,573.00. Through July we have paid \$10,736.50 (58%) leaving a balance of \$7,836.50. To meet our obligation before year end will require monthly payments of \$1,567.30. This will be a challenge but we must continue working toward meeting our obligation. (We received notice that it appears our 2027 connectional apportionment will be \$16,665.00, a reduction of \$1,908.00 as compared to 2026.) Please remember your connectional contributions not only help fund our Conference and local churches but missions and ministries worldwide.

A couple of reminders:

Our Pizza Hut Fundraiser is ongoing and benefits the General Fund. Just visit the Lower Burrell Pizza Hut any time during the last Tuesday of the month and present a "Fundraiser Ticket" to your cashier to ensure the church receives 20% of net sales. There is a supply of tickets in the vestibule.

Please keep the General Fund and Connectional Apportionment as priorities in your giving. With your support our work for God's Kingdom can continue not only locally but in many other areas as well.

As mentioned above, your consistent giving is vital to keeping the church operating. If you are away from home or cannot be in church, remember that e-giving is always available. You can visit our website: LFUMC.org or LFUMC251@comcast.net and click on the Donation button.

Please keep the General Fund and Connectional Apportionment as priorities in your giving. With your support our work for God's Kingdom can continue not only locally but in many other areas as well.

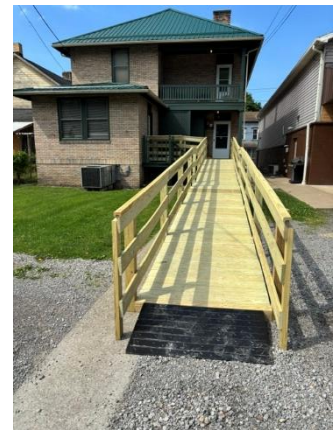

Ramps of Hope Armstrong is going strong in its 13th building season. This season started on March 11 and on Thursday, August 27th, we completed our 26th ramp.

Every ramp takes 2 part days as one day the 4'x6' sections and 5'x5' turn sections are built and all equipment and supplies for the ramp are loaded on a trailer. On another day, the trailer is taken to the ramp site and the ramp installed.

Over the summer the Witness Committee sponsored three Casual Church services. Each service included a light meal, prayer, a short devotion, and some entertainment. These services were a great way to worship and enjoy a meal and some fellowship time with our church family and friends in a very casual atmosphere. After our last Casual Church service, as we were beginning to clean up and get the fellowship hall back in order, a lady came over to me and thanked me for having the service. She said, "I really needed this". She went on to tell me that her daughter has been in and out of the hospital several times this year and she was not doing well. It was clear to me she was very concerned for her daughter and it was weighing on her. I told her I was happy she attended and that it helped her even in a small way and offered prayer for her daughter. This served as a poignant reminder to me of why such gatherings matter. When you are hosting such a service it is easy to focus on things like, can we get the microphone and speaker working, will the devotion hit the right note, will there be enough food, is the coffee ready, will enough people show up and so on. But moments like this pull back the curtain on what is actually happening beneath the surface. People walk through the doors carrying heavy, invisible loads. For someone dealing with the emotional exhaustion of a loved one's recurring hospital stays, normal routines can feel overwhelming, while a simple hour of prayer, devotion, and song can offer a much-needed sanctuary. This lady found a space where she didn't have to explain her pain, she could just sit, listen, and feel the care of those around her. You never truly know whose spirit is being sustained just by us showing up and creating that space in an informal Casual Church service.

MISSION BARN TRIP

We are planning a trip to the Mission Barn in New Castle for our church folks. This will take place on Saturday, October 3rd. While there, we will be working on UMCOR Cleaning Buckets, Hygiene and Menstrual Kits if needed, and will have opportunity to help build handicapped access ramp sections or load a ramp build trailer if that's needed. You will be able to select which activity you prefer to work in, ramp or kit work. I will also add that sometimes yard work on the grounds of the Mission Barn is needed, so if that's your thing, you may have an opportunity to do it!

We will meet at the church at 8:30 so that we will be at the Barn in time to begin working at 10:00. We will work until 2:00, with a break for lunch, and leave after that. For lunch, you have a choice of either bringing your own packed lunch or ordering out from a local pizza shop, which has a variety of menu options. If you like to have water or other drink with you, bring your own (preferably reusable) labeled water bottle. Because ramp work will be available, we can have up to 20 people in our group and I'm hoping we'll have that many. Some of us have been on this trip before and I hope you and others are willing to come again! There will be a sign-up sheet in the vestibule. Sign as soon as you know you can come, even if there are already 20 names on it. I like to have extra names as so far, each time we've gone, some folks have found they've needed to cancel going. The need is great and the work isn't difficult, so I'm looking forward to a good and productive time for all. Bring a willingness to work and have fun!

UMCOR CLEANING KIT

Enabling those affected by floods, hurricanes and tornadoes to begin the overwhelming job of cleaning up. (Kit approximate cost: \$75 per bucket)

Cleaning Kit Materials

- One five-gallon round bucket with re-sealable lid (14.35" h x 12.19" w x 12.19" d)
 - No screw lids
 - May be used, but must be free from all residual product
 - Advertisements on the outside acceptable
- One 32-64 oz. bottle liquid laundry detergent
- One 16-40 oz. bottle liquid concentrate household cleaner
 - No spray cleaners
- One 16-34 oz. bottle dish soap
- One 4-8 oz. pump spray air freshener (liquid, not gel)
- One 6-14 oz. pump spray insect repellent (pack of 10-20 wipes also acceptable)
 - Pump spray bottles must have protective covers
- One scrub brush
 - With or without handle
- 18 re-useable cleaning wipes
 - No terrycloth, microfiber or paper towels
 - Remove from packaging
- Five scouring pads
 - No stainless-steel pads with soap in them
 - Remove from packaging
- 36-50 clothespins
- One 50-100 ft. clothesline (cotton or plastic line)
- 24 roll of heavy-duty trash bags (33-45-gallon sizes)
 - Remove from packaging
- Five N95 particulate respirator dust masks (1-3 mm thickness)
 - No surgical masks
- Two pairs kitchen gloves
 - Durable for multiple uses
 - Remove from packaging
- One pair work gloves
 - Cotton with leather palm or all leather

Assembly Directions

- All items must be new with the exception of the bucket and lid which may be recycled but must be clean and free of debris.
- All cleaning agents must be liquid form. No powders are accepted.
- If items have been omitted, label bucket. Please indicate which items are missing.

Important Notes

- Sponges have been removed from the list of supplies due to the challenge of locating the non-cellulose sponges that prevent mildew. Non-cellulose sponges will be added to each bucket upon arrival at the affiliate warehouse.
- Do not include any personal notes, money or additional material in the kits.
- Contents of kits or the containers of kits should not be imprinted with cartoon characters, advertisements, religious, patriotic, military or camouflage symbols.

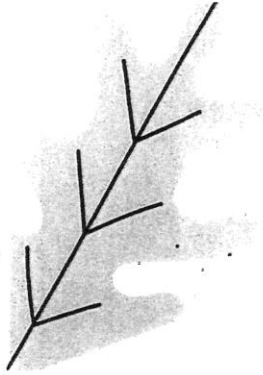
