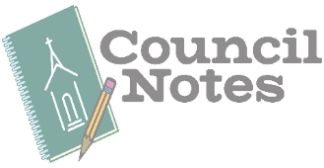

Shawn made a motion to approve \$834 to be paid out of Kelling council gains to the Menomonie Rotary Club to support GWOH (God's Work Our Hands) in September which will provide 10,000 meals through Stepping Stones in the Menomonie area. Seconded by Stacey. All approved.

Stacey made a motion to approve \$16,371.73 from the Eva Wahl building fund to replace the outside door by the elevator and install a handicap button. Seconded by Patty. All approved.

Patty made a motion to shut down the old website. Shawn seconded. All approved.

Motion to adjourn was made by Stacey and seconded by Shawn.

Discussion:

..Bids were received from three companies about carpet replacement at church. The bids included replacing all of the carpet in the narthex, offices, and communion room. All of the carpets are between 18 and 50 years old. The Nevin's representative, who installed the carpet 18 years ago, said the narthex carpet really was not wore out and recommended a high quality professional cleaning. Nevin's will reglue the "carpet bullnose" on the steps in the narthex. The cost is about \$270 and will be funded through the approved maintenance budget.

..Replacing the door near the elevator was discussed along with installing a "handicap accessible door and power opener". The goal is to have the project completed before winter. Money will come from the Building and Cemetery Fund.

..All Star mobility was contacted about installing a stair lift into the choir rehearsal room. They have not set up an appointment after 7 weeks and mentioned they are busy. We may need to contact another firm.

..The firm to install the new hearing aid system still has not scheduled the installation. It is obviously a low priority project for them.

Completed:

..A Contractor dug up the sinkhole in the parking lot and discovered an old cistern..bricks and drain pipes from an old house. . The cost of the repair was \$1,616. The area will need to settle before paving can take place. Monarch Paving is to give us a bid.

UPCOMING GATHER BIBLE STUDIES: Fall 2026

“Bold faith on an unexpected journey” By the Rev. Tiffany Chaney

Faith often leads us down paths we didn’t expect—into wilderness places, across unfamiliar lands, and through seasons of grief and hope. This three-session study takes us on a journey with Hagar, Ruth and Mary Magdalene, women whose bold faith transformed their unexpected stories. Their encounters with God remind us that we, too, are seen, sustained and sent to carry good news into the world.

Session 1: Encountering God in the wilderness

Scripture: Genesis 16:1–16; 21:8–21

Hagar, an enslaved woman pushed to the margins, encounters God in the wilderness. When she believes all hope is lost, God sees her, hears her and reshapes her story. Her witness reminds us that God meets us in deserted places with vision and promise. This session invites participants to consider who is marginalized in our world today and to reflect on how God sees both them and us in our own wilderness experiences.

Session 2: Choosing loyalty, finding love

Scripture: Ruth 1:1–22; 2:8–12; 4:13–17

Ruth, a Moabite widow, chooses to remain with her mother-in-law Naomi and step into an unknown future. Her bold faith is revealed in loyalty, courage and openness to God’s provision. In Ruth’s story, we see how God weaves love, community and promise through even the most uncertain paths. This session invites participants to reflect on the risks of faith, the gift of relationships and the ways God works through everyday loyalty to bring forth extraordinary love.

Session 3: Proclaiming resurrection in hope

Scripture: John 20:1–18

Mary Magdalene’s journey transitions from that of a grieving friend to the first preacher of the good news, after she shows up at the empty tomb and encounters the risen Jesus. Her story declares that women are entrusted to carry resurrection hope into a hurting world. This session encourages participants to recognize their own call to bear witness and to proclaim hope in Christ.

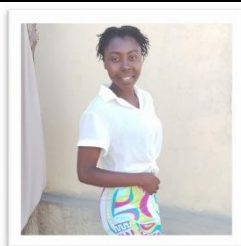
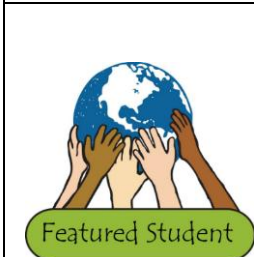
Aliyah Theligene
