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Words From the Word #53

From 1 John 4:7-21 – As we look at man being made in God's image, we see this is not in regard to his physical traits, but in regard to the immaterial part of us, the spiritual part. God specifically designed man for inter-personal relationships.

When you talk about man created in the image of God and what makes up relationships, you talk about self-consciousness, which only man possesses. Man has the capacity to understand himself. Man has the capacity to think abstractly, because that's necessary in relationships, to appreciate beauty, to feel emotion, to be morally conscious, to reason, to acquire wisdom. All of that to have the ability to personally connect, personally relate to other people and especially to relate to God, to be able to love others and to love God. The core, then, of the image of God can be summed up with the words "personal relationship". Man is made with a capacity to love, to love others and to love God. And within the frame of that love there is fellowship, care, sharing of thoughts and attitudes, and experiences that make love the richest of all human experiences. The image of God then is the capacity for personal relationships which come down to giving and receiving love.

God Himself has never existed in a single lonely solitary fashion. He has never existed in isolation; He has never existed in some cut-off form. He's always existed in the fullness of a family-like reality: Father, Son, Holy Spirit. The Father has never been without the Son, the Son never without the Father, neither ever without the Spirit, the Spirit never without either. The amazing mystery of the origin of the *imago dei*, [image of God in Latin] the human personality is the Trinitarian essence or substance or reality of God. And God so designed that He would develop man not only to be able to relate to his fellow man but to be able to relate to Him. This still resides in the human heart, all these millennia after creation. We still long to love and be loved in all human relationships as well as the relationship with God.

In fact, as you probably are aware, the human heart cries for love more than anything else. It's the theme of more songs, more plays, more books, more films, more literature in general, more poems than any other thing. We long to love and be loved. We long to find that perfect love. All the forms of human discourse tell us that. It's because we have been made in the image of God for that. We want so much that perfect love relationship. And that understanding draws us all the way from Genesis into 1 John 4. In 1 John 4:7-21, where John presents for us a study of "perfect love." It is not hard to understand. It unfolds with beauty and simplicity and yet with depth.

So, the theme is perfect love. Verse 12 ends, "His love has been perfected in us." Verse 17, "Love has been perfected among us in this." Verse 18, "Perfect love casts out fear." End of the verse, "he who fears has not been perfected in love." Four times here, in those three verses, we read about perfect or perfected love. This is what everybody is looking for, everybody is longing for and no one will ever find outside a relationship with God. I think this adjective sort of tops my list, this adjective perfect. The Bible talks about brotherly love. It talks about unfeigned love which is love without hypocrisy. It talks about abounding love. It talks about serving love and a number of others. But I think the best of all is that the Bible presents to us perfect love.

Now how are we to understand that word perfect-we have to be able to do that, right? Well, it is from the verb *teleioō*, which simply means complete, whole. It basically means to carry out something to the max. That word is used by Jesus when He was dying on the cross and had come to the end and said, "It is finished." He used a form of *teleioō*, *tetelestai*, same verb, to say, "It's complete." And what He was saying

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was, “What I’ve just done can’t be added to. What I’ve just done can’t be improved on.” And that’s the kind of love we’re talking about. It’s a love that cannot be added to. It is a love that cannot be improved on. It is the perfected love with all the completeness that could only come from God. It is that kind of love, and this is another time and another sermon, but that kind of love that is defined and laid out for us in that wonderful chapter called 1 Corinthians 13 – the love chapter. What is here pledged to the true Christian is perfect love. That is the experience of the love of God in all its fullness, all its completeness, experiencing a love to which nothing can ever be added. The fullness of God’s love is available to us. And that’s what John is telling us here. Perfect love is the legacy that God has left to His children.

In 1 John 4 John is talking to believers here as indicated by the opening designation “beloved” – *agapētoi* divinely loved ones. Those whom God loves, let us love one another. Habitually here, the verb *agapē* / *agapaō*, the love of the will. It’s not the love of emotion. It’s not physical love, friendship love. It’s the love of the will. It’s the highest and noblest and it’s habitual. We’ve heard this injunction already from John. We hear it again. We are to love one another. We are commanded to do that with a love of the will. And we’re going to see as this unfolds all that that really means, but let me just remind you that this level of love is the love of self-sacrificing service. It’s a love basically that is granted to someone who needs to be loved, not to someone who somehow is attracting that love. It is love that chooses to love because there is a need to be loved, no matter how unattractive the person might be, who chooses out of that love sacrificial service, because there is a need for that service and an opportunity for that sacrifice.

The Book of Deuteronomy: Deuteronomy is the 5th and last of the five books of Moses, and in this book, we have a summary of the Law of God. I believe that Deuteronomy is the most important book in the Old Testament.

“Deuteronomy” comes from two Greek words, *deutero* meaning “second” and *nomos* meaning “law.” It is the “second giving of the law.” It is the reiteration of the law given by God. It is the summation. As the book of Deuteronomy opens, the people are ready to enter the promised land, Canaan. They have been delivered from bondage in Egypt. They are God’s people and now they’re going to take their possession of the land God gave them.

And as they move into the land, God reminds them of all they need to know. And so, we have here the summarization of all the Law of Moses, of all the standards for living in God’s kingdom.

And I believe the summary of the entire Old Testament, in fact, the summary of the entire Bible is in Deuteronomy 6:5, part of *Shema*, which means “hear,” which runs from verses 4-9, and is the most important prayer in all Judaism. “You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your strength.” That, beloved, is the pinnacle of the whole Bible. In fact, Jesus said the same thing in Matt 22:37-39. The law is what’s in front of Deuteronomy, the prophets come after, and the whole thing kinda hinges right here. And as we go to the Old Testament, we find the key is in the Pentateuch. As we look at the Pentateuch, the key is in Deuteronomy. As we look at Deuteronomy, the key is in 6:5, “You shall love the Lord.” Now listen to me. Because of that, the Old Testament is not really building a relationship on law as some would teach, but it is building a relationship on what? Love.

A Word from from Ranger Bob:



This article was written because a number of Saints at New Life Family Worship Center requested that I recount my spiritual journey/ adventure/history. So, here goes.

When I was five years old, I attended a Methodist church down the street from where we lived in Pawtucket, Rhode Island. I remember this petite elderly, frail, loving, friendly, smiling lady who taught me Bible stories using flannel graph. I learned exciting stories about David, Noah, Adam and Eve, Moses, Joseph, Abraham, Daniel, Jesus, and many others.

At six years of age, I would arrive home after dark after my swim team practices at the local YMCA. I had to walk down a long driveway to get to my home in the back of this lot. It was totally dark and a high concrete wall was on one side and the back of a three-story apartment building was on the other side. We had recently been studying the 23rd Psalm in Sunday School. This long drive-way to me was the "valley of the shadow of death". It was terrifying to me. I remembered the part of the Psalm that said, "yea, thou I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil." I would repeat that verse over and over as I walked through my valley of the shadow of death. Pretty soon I had memorized my first scripture verse. I had not accepted Jesus as my Lord and Savior yet, but I remember that one Bible verse was so comforting when I would return home at night. I remember even praying when things were tough.

At the age of fifteen God finally got my attention. I was at a General Conference of the Methodist Church in Redlands, California at a Baptist College. It was Youth Day at the conference, the third Saturday in June. I was sitting in the upper section of an outdoor Amphitheatre that held about three thousand people. I was there with a bunch of kids and adults from my church in Tucson, AZ. Bishop Kennedy was speaking about giving your life to the Lord and to full-time Christian service. As he concluded his message and gave an altar call, I felt strongly that I should go down to the front and give my life to the Lord Jesus and to full-time Christian service. But I was a chicken and thought I would be embarrassed in front of my youth group friends. We started singing, "Are ye able said the master, to be crucified with me, yea the sturdy dreamer answered, to the death we follow thee." I still felt an urgency to go down but was still a chicken. When we got to the third verse of the song, I discovered I was already two-thirds of the way down to the front, but my feet had never touched the ground. I decided to walk the rest of the way down and then knelt down and gave my heart to the Lord. I felt the Lord was calling me to be a pastor. I was led into a back room where people prayed for me and I received materials.

When I returned to Tucson, I began to study a program in the Methodist Church called the Local Preachers License. Within six months I was able to preach in churches in Southern Arizona when their pastor went on vacation or was sick. I also started a Sunday Evening Service at my local church and started to knock on doors in the community to invite people to church.

I had my life all planned out-I was going to go to college, get a degree in psychology so I could help people, then attend seminary and become a pastor in the Methodist Church.

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However, I made a big mistake. I was making the plans, leaning on my own understanding. I never bothered to ask God what He wanted me to do. I do remember telling God that I did not want to work in the inner city. I told Him I would go to China, Africa, South America, but not the inner city. I had just read a book called, "The Cross and the Switchblade", and the inner city terrified me. The funny thing is [yes, God has a tremendous sense of humor] seven years later I found myself working at a community center in West Los Angeles. I remember walking down the streets of Downtown Los Angeles and how it reminded me of when I hiked the Grand Canyon. Walls all around me. Scary yes, and also exciting.

I did go to college and received my degree in 1969. Then I remained in Tucson for three years because of my dad's failing health. I continued to work in local Methodist churches in the Tucson area. When my dad passed away in 1971, I enrolled in seminary the following school year.

In 1972, I packed up my family- my wife and two kids-and traveled to The School of Theology in Claremont, California. At that time, I was appointed to a Methodist Church in San Bernardino, California, as the pastor. In the Methodist Church they have a program where they send seminary students to pastor small dying churches. I didn't really know what I was doing so I visited some local pastors in San Bernardino and would follow them around asking questions and seeing how they did things. I visited a few weddings and funerals to see how things were done. I wasn't a wedding/funeral crasher; I received permission from the pastor officiating so I could attend these functions.

It was very helpful and in my first year of being appointed as a pastor I had the privilege to officiate at a wedding and a funeral.

Seminary was frustrating. I seldom heard any of the teachers talk about Jesus. The highlight was a home group meeting led by Church of Christ seminary students where we would talk, share, pray, cry and laugh with each other. I discovered at this time that God wanted a real relationship with me, and I could talk to Him about any and everything, and He could talk to me. Towards the end of my first year in Seminary God clearly spoke to me that I was in the wrong place, both in the Seminary and in the Methodist Church. Both institutions were socially oriented and not very Christ-centered. I actually had a professor in seminary tell me that the main purpose of a pastor is to relieve the people in the congregation of their monetary burdens. I don't believe that is why Jesus built His church. Also, my church was not dying. It was starting to grow. I was initiating programs for the elderly, and for the youth. I also had opportunities to speak to groups about drug problems with youth.

Like I previously mentioned, God had clearly told me to leave the seminary and the Methodist Church. I had committed to help a fellow pastor in West Los Angeles at a community center for one year, so I moved my little family to West Los Angeles. And for the next year I developed programs for the youth, families, and elderly in that community. Then I moved my family back to Tucson, AZ.

Survivors and their children will have: a strong community of other survivors, safe housing, counseling and mentorship training in life skills, parenting, and job skills, legal and medical advocacy.

A heartfelt "THANK YOU" to all of you who have been continually serving the Lord through this ministry, often serving multiple Sundays per month during this challenging season.

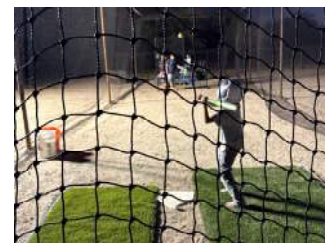

Recipes to Share

Polenta-stuffed Poblano Peppers

(Shared by Barbara Vander Leest)



Ingredients:

- 4 plum tomatoes, halved
- 1 red onion, cut into wedges
- 1 tablespoon olive oil
- 4 poblano peppers, halved lengthwise and seeded
- ¼ teaspoon ground cinnamon
- Salt and pepper to taste
- 2 ¼ cups water
- ½ cup instant polenta
- 10 ounces frozen corn, thawed
- ¼ cup soft goat cheese
- 4 scallions, sliced

Instructions

1. **Broil the vegetables:** Heat your broiler. On a rimmed baking sheet, toss the tomatoes, onion, and oil. Place the tomatoes cut-side down and arrange the pepper halves on the sheet. Broil until tender and charred, turning and stirring halfway through, about 5 to 8 minutes.
2. **Make the sauce:** Transfer the broiled tomatoes and onions to a food processor. Add the cinnamon, ½ teaspoon salt, and ¼ teaspoon pepper. Puree until smooth. Spread half of this tomato sauce into the bottom of a 9-by-13-inch baking dish. Arrange the roasted pepper halves cut-side up over the sauce.
3. **Cook the polenta:** In a medium saucepan, bring 2 ¼ cups of water and a pinch of salt to a boil. Gradually whisk in the instant polenta. Cook and whisk constantly until thickened, about 3 minutes. Stir in the thawed corn, soft goat cheese, and most of the sliced scallions (reserve some for garnish) until combined.
4. **Stuff and bake:** Divide the warm polenta mixture evenly among the poblano pepper halves. Spoon the remaining tomato sauce on top. Bake in a 400°F oven just until heated through, about 5 to 10 minutes. Sprinkle with the remaining scallions before serving.

Easy Crock Pot Beans

(Shared by Deb Zink)

Ingredients:

| 7 bacon strips, diced | 2/3 c. hickory smoke-flavored BBQ sauce |
| 1 green bell pepper, chopped | 2/3 c. brown sugar |
| 2-28 oz. cans pork and beans | 2 tsp. prepared mustard |
| 1-15 oz. can black beans, rinsed and drained | |

In skillet, cook bacon over medium heat until crisp; remove to paper towels. Drain, reserving 2 T. drippings. Sauté green pepper in drippings until tender. Drain 1 can of pork and beans. In crock pot, combine all beans, BBQ sauce, brown sugar, mustard, green pepper and bacon. Cook on low for 4 hours, or until heated through.

Grandma Cook's Peach Cobbler

(A treasured recipe shared by Tracey Glenn)



Preheat oven to 350°F.

Ingredients:

- 2 C. flour
- 2 C. sugar
- 8 tsp. baking powder
- 1½ C. whole milk
- 44 oz. sliced peaches, drained (*If using canned peaches, I use one 29-oz. can and one 15-oz. can*)
- 2 sticks (1 cup) butter
(*You can use less if you want—but it won't taste as good!*) 😊
- Cinnamon sugar, for sprinkling on top

Directions

1. **Melt the butter.** Place the butter in a deep 9x13-inch casserole dish and put it in the oven while it preheats. Let the butter melt while you prepare the batter, but keep an eye on it so it doesn't burn. *I use a 9x13-inch casserole dish with 3½-inch-high sides. This cobbler rises quite a bit, so I recommend placing the casserole dish on a cookie sheet in case it spills over.*
2. **Make the batter.** In a large bowl, mix together the flour, sugar, and baking powder. Add the milk and stir until combined.
3. **Assemble the cobbler.** Carefully remove the casserole dish with the melted butter from the oven. Pour the batter evenly **over the melted butter. Do not stir.**
4. **Add the peaches.** Drain the peaches well and arrange the peach slices evenly over the top of the batter. **Do not stir.**
5. **Add the cinnamon sugar.** Sprinkle cinnamon sugar generously over the top.
6. **Bake.** Bake at 350°F for about 1 hour, or until the cobbler is golden brown and cooked through.

Enjoy! 😊

A Note About the Pan

This is a large recipe. If your casserole dish is smaller or shallower than a deep 9x13-inch dish, **do not make the full recipe** because it may overflow. Cut the recipe in half instead.

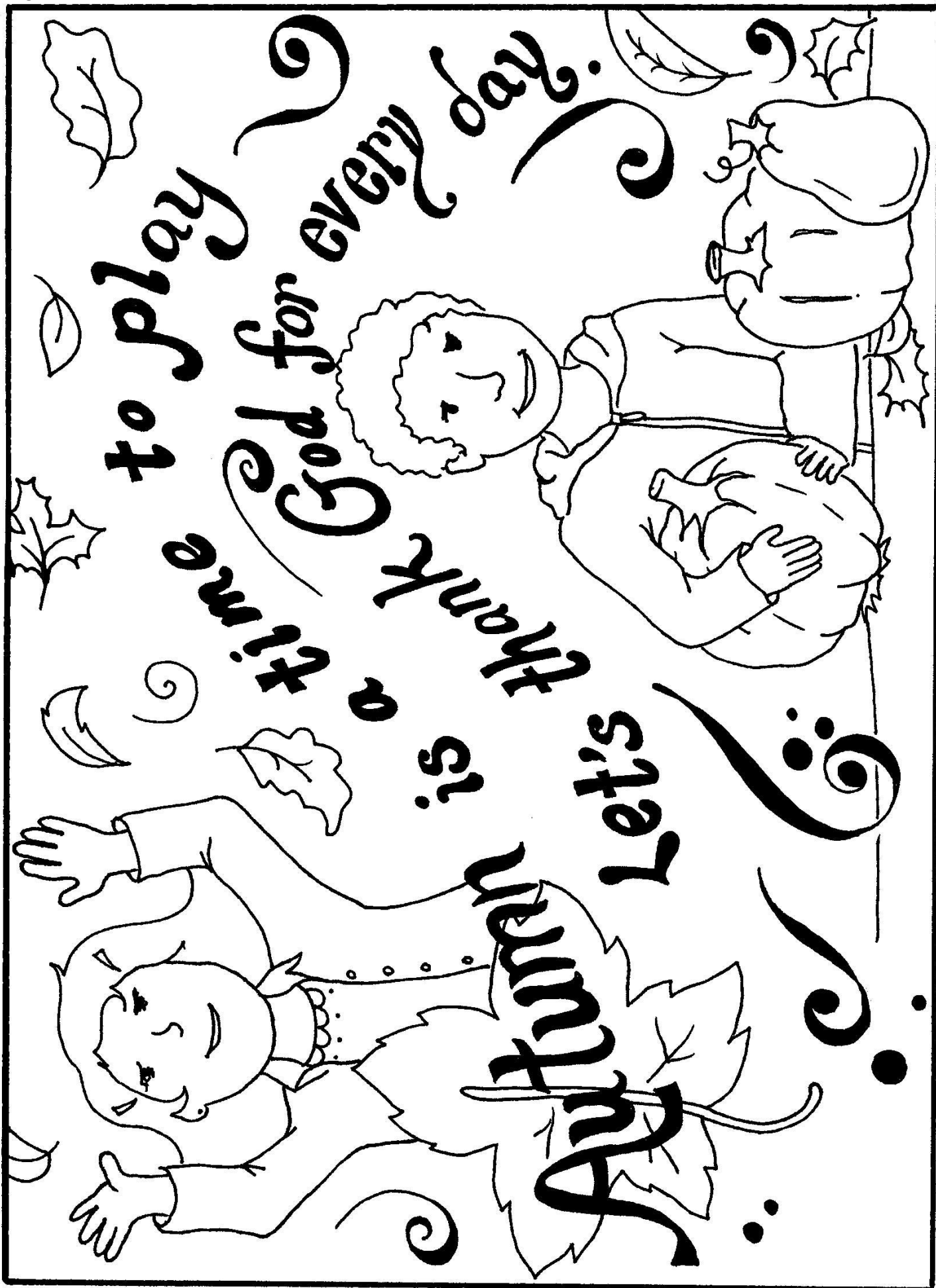
