Naaman's Servant 2 Kings 5

1. **Who is an “unsung hero” in your life?** Who has quietly influenced your faith or made a significant difference without receiving much recognition?
2. **The servant girl had very little power or status, yet God used her in a remarkable way.** Where might you be tempted to think, *“I’m not important, gifted, or influential enough for God to use me”*? How does her story challenge that assumption?
3. **She maintained her faith despite being taken from her home and placed in extremely difficult circumstances.** What helps us hold onto faith when our circumstances don't turn out as we hoped?
4. **Her simple contribution was to point Naaman in the right direction.** Who has God placed in your life who may need encouragement, hope, prayer, or simply someone willing to point them toward Jesus? What might that look like practically?
5. **Perhaps the most surprising part of her story is her response to Naaman.** She had good reason to resent him, yet she wanted him to experience healing rather than suffering. Why can forgiveness be so difficult when someone has genuinely hurt us? What is the difference between forgiveness and pretending the wrong didn't matter?
6. **The sermon says that greatness in God's kingdom involves learning “to forgive and bless, when it’s within your power to do otherwise.”** Where might God currently be inviting you to replace resentment, retaliation, or indifference with grace?
7. **The sermon ultimately connects the servant girl's story with Jesus, the suffering servant.** She suffered yet became an instrument of healing for another; Jesus

entered our suffering and became the source of our salvation. How does looking at Jesus change the way we understand our own suffering—and the way we respond to people who have hurt us?
