



Quiet Time Questions from August 16, 2026

Sermon in a Sentence: We are not on this pilgrimage alone, but the Lord has graciously provided others that we might walk alongside of in our journey, for mutual encouragement and prayer.

Verse for Memorization and Meditation: *“For the sake of my brothers and my friends, I will now say, ‘May peace be within you.’ For the sake of the house of the Lord our God, I will seek your good.” Psalm 122:8-9*

1. Read Psalm 122:1-2. David was glad when he was asked to gather with others to worship and be in the presence of God. Does the thought of gathering with God’s people bring you joy in life? Does that anticipation of joy cause you to call out to others to be a part of worship?

2. Read Psalm 122:3-5. Unity in purpose (to give thanks to God) and spirit (with right and true hearts) are essential for a church to have when they gather in the presence of God. Is this something that we look forward to and pray for as we prepare for the gathering or do we just show up hoping that something like this will take place?

3. Read Psalm 122:6-9. When we gather, are we thinking about what we will receive, what we might get out our time together with the saints or do we consider how we might pray for them or tend to them while we are among them?
