As I write this report, we are in the middle of a smoke advisory, making it hard to focus clearly on anything in the distance while outside. Everything is hazy blue. Everything is blurry. It reminds me of what Paul writes in 1 Corinthians 13:12 regarding looking into a mirror. In those days mirrors were made from polished bronze or brass, producing a very dim image which at best might have been good enough to comb your hair.

Just a few years ago, we were coming out of the covid pandemic and our church, along with society in general, was trying to figure out what the post-pandemic world of living and worshipping together would look like. The elders and staff of GDAC at that time felt like God was preparing us as a church for changes to come. Like the dense smoke of today and the dim mirror described by Paul, we could not see the details, the plan, the focus or vision that God was calling us to...only that He was preparing us for something new.

Today, we are able to see much more clearly how God is working out His plan for our church. The smoke is clearing and the mirror is now made of a polished chrome, making things much clearer. Though our attendance dipped during and after covid, we now see an amazing number of people calling GDAC their home church. As a Board of Elders, we recognize this has nothing to do with us, nothing to do with programs and little to do with church transfer growth. It is a result of prayer and staying committed to being kingdom-builders and Christ-followers, allowing the Holy Spirit to guide and move in our midst. A lot of the new folks that have settled into our church family are new believers! Perhaps not even knowing why or how, they are connecting with God and with Jesus as they connected with our church. We are experiencing a revival at GDAC and believe that God is answering our prayers in that regard. After all, that is God's desire...for His kingdom to expand, especially through His church, that people would receive the Good News and see firsthand how it transforms lives. We pray for a continuing outpouring of the Holy Spirit on our church.

We have seen God's hand at work in so many lives this past year. I can't help thinking back a few years ago to the patience God gave us as we prayed expectantly to bring us the right pastor, the right shepherd for our flock, and seeing our prayers answered through hiring Pastor Steve. God chose him at the right time and brought to us a gifted Lead Pastor who has a unique way of challenging us to grow and expand our faith, rather than becoming comfortable or complacent. Later, we witnessed the miraculous way God provided for our huge renovation project, leaving us debt-free through the generous contributions of our people.

We have record numbers of kids coming to our camps and receiving Jesus...thank you Tracy for your amazing leadership and commitment to sharing the gospel in such creative ways.

Thank you, Jessica Fieldus, for continuing to guide and oversee to our youth programs, pouring into the lives of our youth. It is exciting to see how many youth are involved in ministry in our church as a result of the commitment from you and the leaders!

Although the launch of our Alliance Academy school has been postponed, we still believe that God will bless all those involved with the vision and creation of this school and we pray for patience as we wait on God's perfect timing for its opening.

The Board counts it as a privilege to serve our church, meeting on Mondays once a month for our business meeting and meeting the other Mondays spending time to pray for all of those who call Gregory Drive their home church. As new people arrive, we update our directories and they are then connected with one of our Elder care groups. We try our best to keep our church a welcoming place where people feel like part of our family.

As a member of the Board, I would be remiss (and can speak for all Board members) regarding the diligent and detailed work of our Board Chair Dave Dent. Dave spends much time in preparation for our meetings, and we thank God for Dave's wisdom and the knack he has for keeping us focused on our goals at hand while keeping things light when needed. children's pastor

This past year has been a testament to the truth that God rarely works within our own expectations. In His unique and perfect way, He led our Kids Ministry through an extraordinary season filled with growth, new opportunities, and countless glimpses of His faithfulness. It's a year that has left me filled with gratitude, awe and worship to the One that all things are due.

Our Sunday morning ministry has grown over the past year. With the addition of new families, we are now averaging 30 school-aged kids every week. For the first time in a few years we have split up into age-appropriate classes and I'm thankful for the addition of teachers to lead our children each week. During this time, we have been intentional about prioritizing what is important to our entire church family; Bible teaching, Missions focus, Prayer and Fellowship. Children are encouraged to memorize scripture passages and all kids navigate through old-school Bibles during our teaching time so they understand where each book is found, who wrote it and why. Kids are challenged each week to not only learn more about Jesus, but to be more like Him.

Last year, our kiddos raised \$450 towards missions going to the Kids in Crisis Centre. Some was also donated to the Ecuador team to purchase supplies to be given to the people of Ecuador.

Our Nursery and Toddler ministry has also grown, and we are now utilizing a second room to accommodate the growing number of littles on Sunday mornings. The outdoor space is also being used during the warmer months. Susanne Vince continues to oversee this ministry and its volunteers.

I'm so thankful our entire church embraces and supports our Outreach Ministry with our March Break and Summer Kids Camps. Last year we had 266 kids attend over the six weeks, with the vast majority coming from unchurched homes. Another 75 kids came to our March Break Camp, which provided another opportunity to share the Gospel and disciple those kids who have been coming for many years. In total, 202 kids came forward, asking Jesus to be their Saviour and Friend. All Glory to God!

Along with our usual ministries, we sprinkled in some kid and family events, like the Annual Merry PJ Party, Christmas Escape Room, Family Sunday Services, Church Picnic and Christmas Fam Jam. All these events were well attended and were an excellent opportunity to come together, build relationships and grow closer to Jesus and each other.

Unfortunately, our expectations and excitement at the prospect of opening a small Christian School at GDAC didn't materialize. Although we had staffing in place, there wasn't enough interest in students attending to make it viable. At this point we're unsure what God has planned regarding a new school, but we remain open to whatever He leads us into!

I can't express my gratitude enough for the prayers, donations and support from our church family. Thank you for prioritizing kids in our church and continuing to pray for each one.

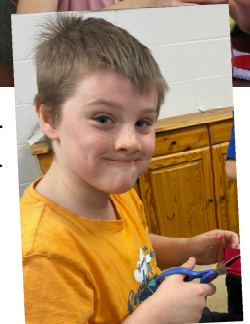

It has been an exciting year for missions at Gregory Drive Alliance Church. We have had many different members and non-members join us for outreaches, ministries, trips and fundraising.

Here are a few highlights from the year:

Fall October Missions Weekend:

This was an amazing weekend overall. We had around 75 people from the church come serve the community on the Saturday. There were different ministries set up for people to get involved in: Yard work at a widow's home, nursing home visit, preparing and giving out food to the needy, local home visits with gifts and encouragement, prayer walking, street evangelism, etc. Then on the Sunday, we had 2 missionary couples visit. Jono and Rachel Stanley working in Owen Sound and Braden and Steff Meija heading to Africa for Bible translation. They set up tables with information about their ministries to share with people. We concluded the weekend with a potluck fundraiser for the Ecuador Team.

Ecuador Fundraisers and Church Get Togethers:

The church really came alongside and supported the 16 people who felt called to go to Ecuador for a mission trip. There were numerous fundraisers including a bake sale, cinnamon buns, envelope giving, an auction lunch and a Mexican dinner night. Through those fun events, the team was able to raise around \$49,000 for their flights, accommodations and ministry. The members have been so giving of their time, money and prayers to help this team go in July.

Spring Outreach:

At the end of May, around 29 church members went to help the new Hope Community Center with yard work, clothing assortment, and meal prep for their opening day. It was a great time to help with this new local ministry that our people could get involved in.

Plan for Owen Sound:

Our next missions weekend will be with Owen Sound Alliance Church. We hope to take a group from Gregory Drive to help serve in different ministries in Owen Sound October 2-4. At the time of this report, this trip is currently being organized. Stay tuned!

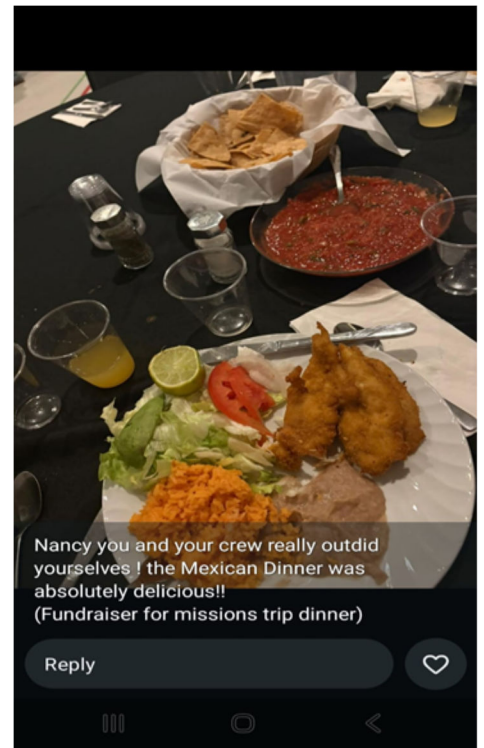
We continue to encourage anyone attending Gregory Drive to find ways to get involved in different ministries and missions opportunities that come along.
