Revelation 21:9-27

Big Idea: "Let not your heart be troubled." We live in a troubled world, but Jesus is the only permanent cure. He is the way, the truth, the life. One day we will dwell in God's glory forever. Who in your life still needs to hear this? Pray for them today.

Day 1: A Place Prepared
for You

Reading:
John 14:1-6

Jesus spoke directly to troubled hearts when He promised His disciples that He was going away to prepare a place for them. The world around us is filled with anxiety, loss, and uncertainty. Yet into that noise, Christ speaks the same words today: believe in me. The cure for a troubled heart is not a better circumstance but a deeper trust in the One who conquered death and holds eternity in His hands. He did not merely point toward the way. He declared that He is the way. Rest today in that promise, and let it steady your heart.

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Day 2: The Glory That
Awaits

Reading:
Revelation 21:9-21

John was carried away in the Spirit and shown something utterly beyond human imagination: a holy city descending from God, radiant with His glory, adorned with jewels and gates of pearl. The details are staggering, but the most important detail is the source. It comes from God. It is lit by God. It belongs to God. Everything we treasure on this earth, our homes, our comforts, our finest moments, are shadows compared to what God has prepared for those who love Him. Let this vision loosen your grip on the temporary and fix your eyes on what is eternal and unshakeable.

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Day 3: The Urgency of
Now

Reading:
Philippians 3:17-21

Our citizenship is in heaven. That truth is not meant to make us passive but to make us purposeful. When we truly believe that this world is not our permanent home, it changes how we live in it. It creates urgency. The speaker in this sermon described the grief of losing a coworker before ever directly sharing the gospel with him. That kind of loss is a sobering reminder that opportunity is not guaranteed. Every conversation, every relationship, every ordinary day is a potential moment to point someone toward Jesus. Live today with the awareness that eternity is always closer than it appears.

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Day 4: Written in the
Lamb's Book of Life

Reading:
Revelation 21:22-27

The final verses of Revelation 21 make one thing unmistakably clear: only those whose names are written in the Lamb's Book of Life will enter the holy city.

There is no ambiguity here, no alternative entrance, no secondary path. The same Jesus who said He is the way is the same Lamb whose book determines who dwells with God forever. This is not a message of exclusion meant to discourage but a message of invitation meant to compel. If your name is written there, praise God and tell someone. If you are uncertain, today is the day to settle it through faith in Christ.

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Day 5: Go and Make
Disciples

Reading:
Matthew 28:18-20

Jesus did not suggest that His followers make disciples. He commanded it. And He paired that command with the most stabilizing promise imaginable: I am with you always, to the end of the age. We are not sent out alone. We are not left to figure it out on our own. The same Lord who is preparing an eternal home for His people is walking alongside us as we invite others to find the way. Write down one name today. Pray for that person. Ask God to open a door. Then walk through it, trusting that He who called you is faithful to go with you.

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
