Sermon Title: The beauty of a consecrated life

Key Scripture: Various

Introduction

Often when we think of consecration we think of a monastic life, living separately from the world. But living a consecrated life is about staying in the world, yet living a set apart life, where others see in us the love of God. A life can bring others to Christ. Consecration is a response to the holiness of God.

Isaiah 6:5-8 (NKJV)

In the year that King Uzziah died, **I saw the Lord** sitting on a throne, high and lifted up, and the train of His *robe* filled the temple. **2** Above it stood seraphim; each one had six wings: with two he covered his face, with two he covered his feet, and with two he flew. **3** And one cried to another and said:

"Holy, holy, holy *is* the Lord of hosts;
The whole earth *is* full of His glory!"

4 And the posts of the door were shaken by the voice of him who cried out, and the house was filled with smoke.

⁵ So I said:

**"Woe *is* me, for I am undone!
Because I *am* a man of unclean lips,
And I dwell in the midst of a people of unclean lips;
For my eyes have seen the King,
The Lord of hosts."**

⁶ Then one of the seraphim flew to me, having in his hand a live coal *which* he had taken with the tongs from the altar. ⁷ And he touched my mouth *with it*, and said:

**"Behold, this has touched your lips;
Your iniquity is taken away,
And your sin purged."**

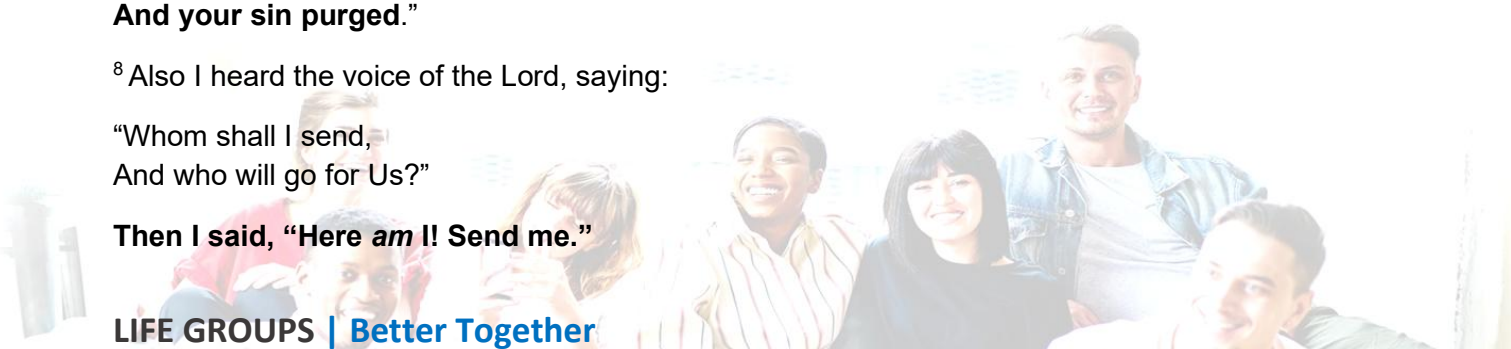
⁸ Also I heard the voice of the Lord, saying:

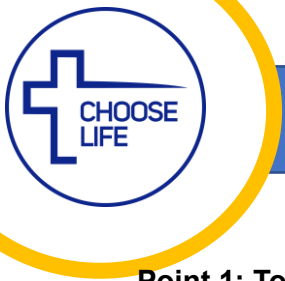
"Whom shall I send,

Then I said, "Here *am* I! Send me."

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Point 1: To become Aware

Isaiah 6:5-8 (NKJV)

⁵ So I said:

"Woe is me, for I am a undone!

Because I *am* a man of unclean lips,

And I dwell in the midst of a people of unclean lips;

For my eyes have seen the King,

The Lord of hosts."

When we become aware of God's holiness, we can quickly become aware of our sin and our need for Him. And we realize our need to be set apart for God. He has taken us out of darkness and placed us into the kingdom of light. We are no longer of the world, but we are still in the world.

1 Peter 1:15–16:

"But just as he who called you is holy, so be holy in all you do; for it is written: 'Be holy, because I am holy.'"

We become ambassadors for the kingdom of light. Listen to heart of Jesus as he prayed for us.

John 17:14-19 (NKJV)

¹⁴ I have given them Your word; and the world has hated them because they are not of the world, just as I am not of the world. ¹⁵ I do not pray that You should take them out of the world, but that You should keep them from the evil one. ¹⁶ They are not of the world, just as I am not of the world. ¹⁷ Sanctify^u them by Your truth. Your word is truth. ¹⁸ As You sent Me into the world, I also have sent them into the world. ¹⁹ And for their sakes I sanctify Myself, that they also may be sanctified by the truth.

He has given us His Word and His truth sanctifies us.

We need to spend time in the Word of God. In our lifetimes we should read the Bible cover to cover multiple times.

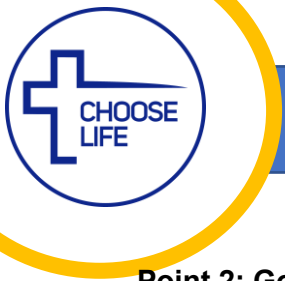
Testimony of the lady who had an aneurism. In one week of her recovery, she lost sense of reality and hallucinated. But during this time, she would recite Psalms and sing songs of worship. She had filled herself with God's Word in the good times, and it was available to her in her difficult trial.

The Bible is a library of books that the Father has carefully curated for us. He has treasures for us to discover, treasures that can help us live consecrated lives.



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Point 2: God's Cleansing Touch

Isaiah 6:6-7 (NKJV)

⁶ Then one of the seraphim flew to me, having in his hand a live coal *which* he had taken with the tongs from the altar. ⁷ And he touched my mouth *with it*, and said:

**“Behold, this has touched your lips;
Your iniquity is taken away,
And your sin  purged**

Upon seeing the Lord, Isaiah became aware of his sin. And an angel touched his mouth from a coal from the altar, purging him of his sins.

As we seek an intimate relationship with God, we need to remove anything that would hinder our intimacy with Him.

Colossians 1:15-18 (NKJV)

¹⁵ He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn over all creation. ¹⁶ For by Him all things were created that are in heaven and that are on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or  principalities or  powers. All things were created through Him and for Him. ¹⁷ And **He is before all things, and in Him all things consist.** ¹⁸ And He is the head of the body, the church, who is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, that in all things He may have the preeminence.

Jesus is the exact representation of God.

Jesus is the creator of heaven and earth.

Jesus has all authority.

Jesus is the head of the body.

Jesus is the firstborn of the dead.

Consecration is not self effort; it is responding to who He is.

For this reason, Jesus needs to preeminent in our lives. He needs to hold first place in our lives in both rank and authority. So, we choose to put away from ourselves anything that is unholy.

Romans 12:1(NKJV)

I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, **that you present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable to God, *which is your*  reasonable service.**

When we make a decision to live a consecrated life our appetites change. God is full of joy, so our consecrated lives should also be filled with joy. Our lives don't become miserable they become full of joy and peace. No, we remove things that are not good for us. And we choose things that lead to righteousness, peace and joy.

Colossians 3:5-11 (NKJV)



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⁵ Therefore put to death your members which are on the earth: fornication, uncleanness, passion, evil desire, and covetousness, which is idolatry. ⁶ Because of these things the wrath of God is coming upon the sons of disobedience, ⁷ in which you yourselves once walked when you lived in them.

⁸ But now you yourselves are to put off all these: anger, wrath, malice, blasphemy, filthy language out of your mouth. ⁹ Do not lie to one another, since you have put off the old man with his deeds, ¹⁰ and have put on the new *man* who is renewed in knowledge according to the image of Him who created him, ¹¹ where there is neither Greek nor Jew, circumcised nor uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave *nor* free, but Christ *is* all and in all.

We need to put to death sinful things and bury them. We also need to rid ourselves of unclean things, taking them off our lives as if they were filthy garments.

Point 3: The Beauty of a Consecrated life

⁸ Also I heard the voice of the Lord, saying:

“Whom shall I send,
And who will go for Us?”

Then I said, “Here *am* !! Send me.”

Colossians 3:12-17 (NKJV)

¹² Therefore, as *the* elect of God, holy and beloved, **put on** tender mercies, kindness, humility, meekness, longsuffering; ¹³ bearing with one another, and forgiving one another, if anyone has a complaint against another; even as Christ forgave you, so you also *must do*. ¹⁴ But above all these things put on love, which is the bond of perfection. ¹⁵ And let the peace of God rule in your hearts, to which also you were called in one body; and be thankful. ¹⁶ Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly in all wisdom, teaching and admonishing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing with grace in your hearts to the Lord. ¹⁷ And whatever you do in word or deed, *do* all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through Him.

The beauty of a consecrated life is that we are cleansed, purified, and clothed with love.

When we do this, we live with a “Here I am, send me” attitude. We become willing to live interrupted lives, ready to reach out to people around us.

A consecrated life is about loving God so much, and loving others, and being willing to be a vessel that the Lord can use to touch their lives.



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
