- **Keep it family-friendly & faith-centered.** Your piece should reflect the spirit of Christmas and the story of Jesus' birth.
- **Label it:** Please include a small tag with your family name and the title of your piece.
- **Materials:** You can use anything! Paint, wood, clay, cardboard, fabric, LEGOs, recycled materials– whatever helps tell your story.
- **Creativity encouraged:** Simple or elaborate, 2D or 3D, realistic or abstract... it's up to you!

Here are a few sparks to get you started:

- A toilet paper tube nativity with handmade costumes
- A painted canvas or watercolor of the manger scene
- A wreath featuring names of Jesus or nativity characters
- A handprint or footprint angel made by your little ones
- A wooden pallet sign saying "Joy to the World" etc.
- A clay or LEGO creation of Bethlehem
- A collage that mixes Scripture, clippings, and photos
- An "around the world" nativity using cultural or family elements
